	July 1 – Mare must enter Indiana by July 1 in the year prior to foaling & remain in
	Indiana continuously until foaling.
	Register the mare with the Indiana Horse Racing Commission by July 1 in the year prior to foaling.
	After July 1 – If your mare enters Indiana after July 1 in the year prior to foaling, she must remain in the state until foaling.
	Mare must be registered with the IHRC prior to foaling.
	Mare & foal must remain in Indiana for 30 days after foaling.
	Mare must be bred back to a registered Indiana stallion after foaling.

	registration.

	Late fee schedule is as follows:
	12 months + 1 day to December 31st of yearling year: \$200
	2 years old: \$400
	3 years old & older: \$1 000

STA	ALLIONS
	November 1 – Stallion must enter Indiana by <i>November 1</i> in the year prior to breeding season. Stallions must remain in Indiana for the entire breeding season (<i>February 1 through July 1</i>).
	A late fee of \$100 will be assessed for late registration of any returning stallion.
	An application must be filed every year the stallion breeds in the state of Indiana.
	New stallions arriving late cannot have covered any mares in another state during the same year. The late fee (\$100) is waived for new stallions standing their first season in Indiana.
