Health and Well-Being of Indiana Children Initiative and Resolution Update

o Co-chairs Lee Hamilton and Becky Skillman

Becky Skillman met with Shelley Triol in the Governor's Office on July 22nd to bring her up to speed about the resolution that was adopted at the last Commission meeting and to discuss the launch. Now the focus is on the roll out and launch to call on all Hoosiers to think about the health and well-being of Indiana children as they showcase programs that are already in place and adopt policies going forward.

Need to think about the best time for announcements and press conferences with the Governor.

Tuesday, October 27 is scheduled as the launch of the initiative with the Governor. Erin Norton from the Office of the Governor has been assigned to us to assist.

Lee Hamilton suggested everybody needs to think about the health and well-being of children in their own county and what can be done because there is always room for improvement.

Charlie Brown pointed out that children are more likely to start smoking cigarettes when they smoke a hookah, which has been increasing in use in younger children.

Becky Skillman visited the Greene County General Hospital and reported on the Sweet Dreams Baby Bundles.

Becky Skillman stated that southern Indiana has higher infant mortality rates than the rest of the state and that Greene County is trying to combat this by distributing the Baby Bundles. They are getting funding and donations from the community.

Mary McConnell suggested we let other counties know about the Baby Bundles in Greene County so that they are inspired. Perry Hammock will follow up on this with staff.

Jim Madison suggested marketing as "Bicentennial Baby Bundles".

Bicentennial Visioning Project

o Lee Hamilton, Co-chair

The Visioning project is to get Hoosiers to think about where Indiana will be 50 years from now, the changes coming and how we can be ready for them.

Lee Hamilton advised 400 names have been submitted as thought leaders in the state. Additional suggestions are welcome.

Dates have been set in 11 areas around the state.

Overall, the project is well underway.

Harrison County has many events and celebrations planned for 2016 including a time capsule and restoration of the first State Capitol.

Pamela and Jeremy brought pins for the Commissioners with their Bicentennial logo.

Crawford County Update

Sharon submitted two legacy projects while at the meeting, the first two of the county. Crawford County has a lot to offer for celebrations and legacy projects and Sharon plans to submit as many as she can for endorsement.

Orange County Update

Orange County is kicking off the Bicentennial year on February 1st, which is Orange County's birthday.

They are working with Dubois and Lawrence Counties for the torch relay and a Bicentennial Ball.

Clark County Update

Clark County is home to the second oldest town in Indiana, Clarksville. Legacy project ideas include the Clark County Museum and plaque and the Buffalo Trace.

Super Service

The Bicentennial Commission is working with the Super Service hospitality program to engage and bring tourism to Indiana during the Bicentennial year.

This program was implemented when Indy hosted the Super Bowl.

The new extended deadline to pre-order is August 30th.

Endorsement Committee report given by Perry Hammock on behalf of Ellen Rosenthal
56 applications were received from 32 counties and 6 statewide.

-- deprications were received from 32 countries and 0 state

55 were brought for Commission review.

5 first time applicant counties include: Cass, Pulaski, Adams, Shelby and Washington. By pillar there were 6 youth and education, 25 community involvement, 24 historical celebration and 0 nature conservation applications.

Charlie Brown made a motion to approve the Committee's recommendation to endorse all 55 applications. Jim Madison second. Co-chair Skillman called the vote. The motion carried with no dissent.

Diversity Committee report given by Charlie Brown and Rachel Beliles

Total of 57 projects in 24 counties.

The diversity projects are bringing organizations together and leaving legacies.

Some organizations want to take Indiana's Bicentennial international.

We have 6 statewide diversity projects with 7 more planned.

o Marketing Committee report given by Co-chair Becky Skillman

The marketing/strategic plan needs to be redistributed to Commission; Perry will follow up on this.

Becky Skillman suggests the Commission review the marketing plan and send advice back on how to move forward.

We need to raise awareness county by county.

There has been progress but perhaps falling behind in public relations.

Becky Skillman to meet with Governor's office and discuss who we should reach out to.

o Bicentennial Nature Trust report given by Mark Becker

The most recent round of projects ended May 1.

13 projects in 5 new counties.

Lee Hamilton asked about the southern part of the state where there is a strip without any BNT projects. Mark Becker stated there are many parks and protected land in that area.

Lee Hamilton questioned about the funds left and the timeline, Mark Becker answered that the funds are all expected to be committed by early or mid 2016.
