Signage is now available for Legacy Projects endorsed by the Indiana Bicentennial Commission



Special signage marking the 2016 Bicentennial of Statehood is now available from the Indiana Historical Bureau (IHB). IHB's Bicentennial Signage program has been endorsed by the Indiana Bicentennial Commission. Working with the Commission and its Endorsements Committee, IHB wants to help communities and organizations mark their Bicentennial activity in a lasting way.

Communities and organizations participating in the Bicentennial celebration with an endorsed Legacy Project are eligible to purchase signage. Currently, there are over 75 endorsed Bicentennial Projects, and the number is growing.

Square signs are available in two sizes, 18 inch or 24 inch; the full-color signs are priced at \$175 and \$205 respectively. Proceeds from

the sale of each sign cover the administration of the program, with \$8 from each sign being set aside to support the Bicentennial Commission's efforts.
