Qualifications Required: Master's Degree. Three years of administrative/supervisory experience. Experience in developing and implementing cultural and educational programs, engaging faculty and staff, doing community outreach, fundraising, and advocating for issues affecting LCC constituents. Strong verbal/written communication and leadership skills. Excellent skills in managing an organization. Ability to work well with others. Skills in developing and implementing a strategic plan for a cultural center.
