Next on our agenda we have the ICRC Director's Report.

MR. WILSON: Good afternoon,
everyone. Again, it is a little bit bumpy, and
we're sorry about that, but we're making some
changes. So, first I want to start out with some
news about the agency. We think it's pretty
important.

One is Tim, the Deputy Director/General Counsel, Tim Schultz, is leaving. He has been appointed to another position here at the state, and I can't exactly remember the exact name of the office that he's moving to, but it's something that he's always looked forward to working in, with taxes, and so, that's one of his favorite things that he wants to do.

So, again, is he's helped accomplish a lot here. We can't say enough. Again, as people leave, when new people come, they help us build on what was done before, and we think Tim has done that. I just wanted to talk a little bit about just some of the recent accomplishments that me and Tim, working together with the rest

of the team, have made.

One is we did get salary increases for staff. We were very excited about that. We've been working on that -- some of you who have been here, Chair Slash and others, know that's been a real major goal for us is to bring staff pay levels up, and we were able to do that, and we were very excited about that. So, that is a big thing he's helped us with.

Then also, this last month or so, a couple of months, since Stephanie has been here, been able to get the EEOC complaints under control, and pretty much the whole file, she's emptied that all out, her and her team, and it looks like we will meet our contractual obligation with EEOC.

And so, that's been another continued success of ours is meeting our contractual obligations, and so, I want to thank Stephanie, who's on here today, standing in on behalf of Tim. So, we appreciate that, Stephanie, your hard work.

Also she's helping us with the Case

Management System, and so, we appreciate that. I think we're making great headways. Hopefully before the end of this year all of the things that we've been trying to do with our Case Management Systems will be accomplished, everything from our data migration to our portal, which will allow the public to come on-line and enter their information into the portal, even find out about the status of their cases without maybe making those phone calls to us, in the portal. So, that'll save a lot of time and create some efficiency and better customer service for our customers.

We have a lot of new staff in Intake, and thank you, Christiana, for really working to provide the exceptional training for staff.

Working with this staff and working with Tim and some others, we've been able to create some lead positions in specific areas where we've been able to get employees to act as leads, which is kind of second, not as direct supervisor, but to support the managers in those specific areas.

So, that means also an increase in salary

for some of the staff members as well as additional responsibilities and training so that, again, when positions come open, they'll be ready to advance to those positions. So, again, that's been a great success for us this year.

Again, for us, we're starting back with our programming again. I think we're trying to do something, working with United Negro College Fund, working with that group as well as the Urban League. Hopefully we'll be in the parade, and we'll send something out. If any of you desire to march with us in the parade in our Civil Rights group, please don't hesitate to let us know. We'll make sure we get you some swag to wear for that event. So, I'll have Virgil send something to contact you and see about the interest.

So, we've started being able to do projects again. Now, also with the testing program, which has been a great success, we're going to start doing the training for those who -- we found some issues maybe in those units where we've done the testing.

So, we have a new person who's in charge of our Education and Outreach, Kyleigh, and she's going to be providing that training for them.

And when we get it done and completed and they --feel free to -- we'll send you a link. Feel free to join us, and you can check and see what type of training we have. So, that's a very -- very much a positive.

But as I said is, you know, with Tim leaving, we'll be looking to hire another Deputy Director/General Counsel, and so, we have some people who we're already interviewing, so that'll be -- that'll take a little time, but we'll get there.

And so, again, we continue to move forward as an agency, and I know everybody has a copy of the monthly report. If you have any questions, feel free to ask any questions of me, but that's kind of where we are right now.

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Greg, I have two things, and then I'll open for any other Commissioner that wanted to chime in, but I just -- I'd like to say on the record here today,

it has been a gift and a pleasure to work with 1 Tim, and to echo your comments about the 2 improvements and innovations, and how each new 3 4 staff member really does help to bring the 5 Commission along. And so, it has been outstanding to work 6 with Tim. We will miss him, but we do wish him 7 well in his new journey. So, I'm sure that 8 others feel the same, but I wanted to take the time to say that. 10 11 MR. WILSON: Thank you. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: 12 And to also say 13 sign me up for the parade. I'd be glad to be 14 with the Commission --MR. WILSON: 15 Okay. 16 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- at that time. 17 MR. WILSON: Thank you. 18 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Do any other 19 Commissioners have any comments or questions for 20 Executive Director Wilson? 21 (No response.) 22 MR. WILSON: Okay. Well, thank --

HARRINGTON: I'm having a technical issue. I just want to make sure. 8 Can you tell me the name on the case, because I have --10 11 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Yes. Malinka versus Beech Grove City Schools. 12 13 COMM. HARRINGTON: On the two cases 14 that were assigned, I needed additional time 15 because I had issues downloading, so I will make my recommendations next month, or send them in 16 17 advance. 18 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Thank you. 19 So, in the case of EMha20120853, we will 20 add that to next month's agenda, as well as Case 24D-2020-00267. 21 22 And Comm. Harrington, you had a third 23 case. Did you have that information, or would

that one need to move to next month as well? 1 COMM. HARRINGTON: Was that the Hoff 2 versus Chrysler? 3 4 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Correct. 5 COMM. HARRINGTON: Yes, I've got that 6 one. 7 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Yes, you can do that one today, or no, you need --8 COMM. HARRINGTON: 9 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- to move it to 10 11 next month? Oh, okay. So, I'll just wait until 12 we get to that one on the agenda, then --13 COMM. HARRINGTON: Okay. 14 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- okay? COMM. HARRINGTON: Thank you. 15 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Uh-huh. 16 17 So, in the next one, which is Case PAra21050133 Martin versus IHOP, 18 Comm. Jackson? 19 20 COMM. JACKSON: Yeah, and I had some questions on that one. As I understand it, it 21 22 was denied because it didn't meet the 180-day 23 deadline; is that correct?

CHAIRPERSON SLASH: 1 Yes. COMM. JACKSON: Do we know the 2 3 postmark date on the envelope she sent in? Ι know it was received on December 28, 2020. 4 5 filed it on June 2020 -- or the incident was June 2020, rather. So, I'm wondering if she 6 7 mailed that in, what was the postmark date on her envelope? 8 MS. OJO: Okay. We can get that 9 10 information and send it to you. COMM. JACKSON: Yeah. The reason --11 MR. WILSON: Well --12 13 COMM. JACKSON: -- why I'm asking --14 go ahead. I'm sorry. I just want to be clear 15 MR. WILSON: 16 in the question, so we can make sure. So, you're 17 saying that she filed her complaint in June of 2020; right? 18 19 COMM. JACKSON: I believe she did. 20 MR. WILSON: And you're saying that 21 the envelope -- is that the envelope that -- from 22 you said was December 2020? 23 COMM. JACKSON: It was marked

received December 28th, 2020. 1 MS. OJO: We actually have 180 days 2 from the date of incidence for evidence to her 3 4 file. So, when it's outside 180 days, we don't have --5 COMM. JACKSON: Right. So, this is 6 7 about 11 days -- this is about 11 days outside of the date, but I'm wondering, because of COVID 8 and, you know, that was kind of the height of 9 COVID, and the United States Postal Service 10 acknowledged that they were having trouble with 11 12 bulk mail and getting it to the places on time. 13 And the transit time between Georgia and 14 Indiana, 10 to 14 days under normal conditions, I'm wondering if the Plaintiff is at fault here, 15 or would it be the United States Postal Service? 16 17 And do we have any accommodation for the extraordinary time that we're living in right 18 19 now? 20 MS. OJO: Okay. COMM. JACKSON: Well, I just --21 22 MR. WILSON: Well, we'll take a look

23

at it.

COMM. JACKSON: Oh, I'm sorry. 1 MR. WILSON: We can take a look at it 2 3 and -- go ahead. I'm sorry, Commissioner. 4 COMM. JACKSON: Yeah. I just think 5 it would be encumbering and unreasonable to deny it if it was 11 days past the 180 days if it were 6 not her fault because we are in a global pandemic 7 and the United States Postal Service acknowledged 8 their failure to get mail to its destinations on 9 10 time. 11 MR. WILSON: Yeah, but you're talking about 180 days still. 12 13 COMM. JACKSON: Well, that's the 14 reason why I wanted to know --15 MR. WILSON: Yeah. 16 COMM. JACKSON: -- when she sent it, 17 and did we know that? 18 MR. WILSON: Yeah. We'll take a look -- what I was going to say is, we'll take a 19 20 look at it and see what those dates are, and we'll get that information back to you. 21 22 COMM. JACKSON: Okay.

MR. WILSON: But it is still 180

days, so -- and we -- it falls in the guideline, 1 and unless something changes it, we can't make 2 that decision ourselves to make the adjustment. 3 4 So --COMM. JACKSON: 5 Okay. MR. WILSON: -- we'll take a look and 6 7 we'll get that back to you what the dates were. COMM. JACKSON: All right. 8 Thank 9 you. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: So, for the 10 record, we will put Case PAra21050133 -- we will 11 12 continue it until next month pending these further questions, to make sure that the court 13 14 reporter got that clearly. Yes. 15 THE REPORTER: 16 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you. 17 And the next case, which is Case EMra20110814, this case was assigned to 18 Vice-Chair Ramos, who submitted his 19 20 recommendation of upholding the Deputy Director's 21 finding of no probable cause in writing to the

1 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: I thank you -what's that? 2 THE REPORTER: Chair Slash, this is 3 4 the reporter. 5 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Uh-huh. THE REPORTER: I just want to make 6 7 sure I heard correctly on yours. Did you say the recommendation was probable cause? 8 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Yes, to uphold 9 the find of probable cause --10 11 THE REPORTER: Okay. CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- correct. 12 13 THE REPORTER: I just wanted to make 14 sure I heard that correctly. Thank you. 15 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: We don't get them very often --16 17 THE REPORTER: Right. 18 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: -- so, I 19 appreciate you verifying that. 20 And with that, thank you, everyone, for your attention to the detail and asking the 21 22 questions and taking the due diligence of truly 23 looking into each of your cases. Sometimes

- things get delayed, so -- but I appreciate you in
 asking those questions.
- 3 As we move to New Business, I will make
- 4 the following assignments: Case EMse21030079 I
- 5 will assign to myself; the second case,
- 6 PAra19110617, Comm. Harrington; 470-2020-02275,
- 7 Comm. Tolliver; and the final case, Hill versus
- 8 Goody's Restaurant, Comm. Jackson.
- 9 MS. OJO: So, Chair Slash?
- 10 (No response.)
- 11 MS. OJO: Chair Slash?
- 12 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Uh-huh.
- 13 MS. OJO: Just for clarification, on
- 14 the case assigned to you, so there were two
- 15 parts. There was a probable cause, and there was
- 16 one issue that was a no probable cause, so the
- 17 appeal is based on the second issue, where there
- 18 was a no cause finding for that.
- 19 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. So, I
- 20 don't know how I missed that part, but if that's
- 21 the case, then I will have to continue mine until
- 22 next month as well. I'm not prepared to make a
- 23 recommendation on that, but that would mean that

we would need to -- how do we address this in 1 the -- in our actual official business, to remove my original recommendation and its motion? 3 4 MS. SLONE: You could --5 MS. OJO: We can -- yeah, go ahead. MS. SLONE: Go ahead, Christiana. 6 7 MS. OJO: Yeah. We can just change You can just call the name of the case and 8 say -- make your recommendation, and if it's -if you want to respond to it next time. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Yes. 12 not prepared to -- because I have a lot of notes, 13 but they're not in front of me, so I'm not 14 prepared to do that at this time. So, in the case of -- it's EMno21020052, I would like to 15 hold that case and make a recommendation at the 16 17 October meeting. 18 MS. OJO: Thank you. 19 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you. 20 it does not need a vote? MS. OJO: No, it doesn't need a vote. 21 22 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. I just

want to make sure. We're having a bumpy day

- anyway, so all of the bumps can go in these
 records for this month. It's our one bumpy
 meeting for the year. We'll allow a little grace
- 4 here.
- So, moving along, we do not have any -- it doesn't look like we have any ALJ decisions that
- 7 we need to make -- that we need to review. We do
- 8 have two cases that were automatically confirmed.
- 9 Is there -- is there any insights from the
- 10 Commission that you would like to share with
- 11 Commissioners at this time?
- MS. OJO: No votes required for this
- 13 one.
- 14 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Yeah. I just
- 15 wanted to make sure that if there was any
- 16 insights that we should know, this is always a
- 17 good time to ask for it. Okay. But hearing
- 18 none, those two cases --
- 19 MR. WILSON: Stephanie, did you have
- 20 something?
- MS. SLONE: Yeah, I'm sorry. I do
- 22 have. I was --
- 23 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay.

MS. SLONE: -- waiting on Christiana to finish. First, I do want to mention that Tim had an unexpected situation occur and that's what caused him to not be here. He did ask me to relay a message, that he has thoroughly enjoyed his time working with all of you, and it's bittersweet for him to move on, but he wants to wish you all the very best, and he hopes to still see you in the future.

He also wanted me to mention that in previous meetings, we had mentioned that Adoley had left, and she was our Alternative Dispute Resolution Program Director. We have filled that position with an internal candidate, and that's Tracy Richardson, and she's another person here who wears a lot of different hats, has been in legal, has done some legal support for Intake.

And now she's fully transitioned into her new role with the ADR Director in that program, and Tim wanted me to make sure to highlight that and let you know that he's very excited about that. She is going to bring a lot of new review and change to ADR and doing outreach with our

community partners to see how we can further bolster our mediation services.

He also wanted me to let you know that we -- with the testing program, that's been one of his babies for housing, and he wanted me to let everyone know that we have received additional partnership fund grants and are going to do additional testing, maybe 20 or 30 more tests, and that's going to help us evaluate areas in the community and in the state that could use some additional training, and finding anywhere that potential people are that don't have the ability to advocate for themselves, that we're able to find opportunities to stop discrimination before it affects other people.

And then the last one that he wanted me to update is on Kyleigh Cramer, and Greg did touch on this, the External Affairs team, he's mentioned about getting really excited about this new person coming on, and she has tremendous skills and assets, and her outreach and training and education.

She has already been -- she joined us last

- 1 week, but she's also a Colts cheerleader, so
- 2 she's very active and involved in the community.
- 3 She's been reaching lots of different partners,
- 4 and we have partnerships throughout the state.
- 5 She's going to be traveling not just here and
- 6 focusing on Central Indiana, but focusing
- 7 throughout, from Terre Haute all of the way up
- 8 into the lake region, and down to Evansville at
- 9 some point in the future.
- 10 And our External Affairs team is really
- 11 kicking up a social media campaign. We're going
- 12 to have some ads on Facebook, we've been on the
- 13 radio, on television, all of our cultural
- 14 commissions are really getting active now that
- we've got those filled.
- 16 It's a very exciting time here at ICRC,
- 17 and as we move into planning for next year,
- 18 | 2022 -- that's weird to say -- we are going to
- 19 have some retreats and coordination amongst not
- 20 just ICRC, but also all of our Commissions and
- 21 our partnerships.
- 22 Tim did want me to mention, in the monthly
- 23 report, if you do take a look at that and have

some questions, you can see that throughout the year we have really lowered our calls in that we're getting, so we have started out in the six and seven hundreds at the beginning of the year, and now we're at 200. But what's important to see is that if you look at how many formalized complaints that we've gotten out of those inquiries, when we were receiving six and seven hundred calls, we were only getting 40 and 26 complaints. So, even though our calls are down and our inquiries, we're actually getting about 55 complaints a month formalized.

And Greg has been really focused on leading the External Affairs group to really focussing in on social media, getting our message out there, helping people identify that they might be victims of illegal discrimination.

We've also received a grant from the EEOC to run some radio ads, and we're going to be running them in Spanish and English, and that'll be starting. Our Facebook ad just went out today, so we've got some real exciting things going on.

Also, our ADR program, even though during

the summer, when Adoley left, we were in a transitional period, and now that Tracy's in it, I have been helping out in the interim as the ADR Director, and so, in the month of July we had \$33,000 in settlements, and just last month we had \$75,000, so we're really picking that up.

And again, we've discovered that we have partners out there in the community that don't have mediation programs that are interested in using us to provide those services to help mediate and try to settle some of those before they get out there and become formalized complaints.

We've had a lot of training in External Affairs. We've had meetings and we're training them. That Case Management System that Greg's been talking about, the portals should be going live really soon, and I know that's going to be really exciting. We've had training with HUD and FHA, and we've been also training with the EEOC.

But one of the real special things that we did last month in our outreach and education was that we had an event, a virtual event, and it was

moderated by Doneisha Posey, who is Tim's

predecessor, and it was called Challenges and

Opportunities in the Learning Environment, and it

was a panel discussion.

- We have that posted on our social media, and it's also going to be -- I believe Channel 16 is going to be running that, and that was one of those relationships that Kyleigh, just by joining on, reached out, and we said, "Yes, we would like to run this," and just on repeat.
 - So, we're doing fantastic things here, and let me just make sure I've got all of the rest of the stuff. For coming -- oh, this is real exciting. Our Women's Commission, they are going to have their first Commission meeting in October, so that had been vacant for a while, and I know Jordan has been really focused and interested in seeing what she can do there.
 - James, over at our Black Males Commission, in November they're going to have the annual conference, and that's something that he's been working on really hard.
- 23 And then just yesterday we had -- our

- State Cultural Commission did the Heritage

 Foundation, so it was over at the Robert Orr

 Plaza, and our Latino Commission was out there in

 traditional -- traditional Hispanic cultural

 wear, and pictures and sharing candies.
 - So, we're doing really great things here, and Tim did ask me to kind of walk through that and just to share all of that, and then also give you his thanks for your collaboration over the last year and a half, and -- but he is looking forward to moving on, but it's very bittersweet.
- 12 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Thank you so much
 13 for sharing all of that and for bringing us up to
 14 speed.
- Does anyone have any questions or comments at this time?

- 18 CHAIRPERSON SLASH: Okay. Hearing
 19 none, I think we kind of looked over Section VII.
