






- There has never been a female U.S. Senator from Indiana

 - Rep. Katie Beatrice Hall, 1982-1985
 - Rep. Cecil Murray Harden, 1949-1959
 - Rep. Virginia Ellis Jenckes, 1933-1939

- There has never been a female Governor from Indiana
- Only 2 women have held the office of Lt. Governor
 - Lt. Gov. Becky Skillman, 2005-Present (elected)
 - Lt. Gov. Kathy Davis, 2003-2005 (appointed)






Women in the Indiana General Assembly








Gender in Indiana Elected







Gender by Regions in Indiana















Female Dominated Offices
