



Male - Includes Offenders held in Jails and Contracted Beds





By Offender Security Level







By Most Serious Offense Level



Top 10 Committing Counties









By Age At Intake






Adult Releases By Type of Release Calendar Year 2006







Top 5 Committing Counties







Juvenile New Admissions Calendar Year 2006



By Offense Category

Juvenile Releases By Type of Release Calendar Year 2006










Active Employees

By Job Type










