IDOC Offenders Donate to Victims Group

Indianapolis, IN (May 10, 2011) – On Friday, May 6, 2011, the Indiana Department of Correction (IDOC) presented a check for \$12,340.35 to the Indiana Coalition Against Sexual Assault (INCASA), during a gala in honor of INCASA's 25th Anniversary. The money was donated through offender fundraisers from 16 IDOC facilities across the state.

On hand to present the check was IDOC Chief of Staff Amanda Copeland. "The Department is proud to support INCASA in their efforts to bring awareness and provide services to victims of sexual violence in Indiana. We are grateful for the opportunity for offenders incarcerated at our facilities to give back to a cause that will directly benefit victims of crime and aid in their healing, as well as to encourage the offenders' rehabilitation," stated Copeland.

The largest monetary donation of \$5,000 came from the Geo Group, a private corporation that manages and operates the New Castle Correctional Facility. In addition to the money donated, the Department also presented a quilt commemorating INCASA's 25th anniversary made by offenders from the PLUS unit at the Wabash Valley Correctional Facility.

commemorate INCASA's 25th Anniversary. This quilt is quite a statement of restitution and a testament of hope for the future." said Carpenter.
