MINIMUM LENGTH OF STAY
Effective August 1, 2001, the Juvenile Services Division began using the Comprehensive Case Management System. Under the new system, each student is responsible for his/her own progress through the phases of treatment, and length of stay is now determined individually based upon that progress. Students with determinate sentences are released according to their court-ordered release dates.
