FINDINGS AND FINAL ORDER

The Indiana Department of Insurance conducted an examination into the affairs of the Farmers Home Insurance Company of Knox County (hereinafter "Company") for the time period January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2017.

The Verified Report of Examination was filed with the Commissioner of the Department of Insurance (hereinafter "Commissioner") by the Examiner on July 19, 2019.

A copy of the Verified Report of Examination, along with a Notice of Opportunity to Make Written Submission or Rebuttal, was mailed to the Company via Certified Mail on December 12, 2019 and was received by the Company on December 16, 2019.

The Company did not file any objections.


NOW THEREFORE, based on the Verified Report of Examination, I hereby make the following **FINDINGS**:

1. That the Verified Report of Examination is a true and accurate report of the financial condition and affairs of the Farmers Home Insurance Company of Knox County as of December 31, 2017.
2. That the Examiner's Recommendations are reasonable and necessary in order for the Farmers Home Insurance Company of Knox County to comply with the laws of the State of Indiana.

Based on the FINDINGS, the Commissioner does hereby ORDER:

1. Pursuant to Ind. Code § 27-1-3.1-11(a)(1), the Verified Report of Examination is adopted and shall be filed. Hereafter the Verified Report of Examination, may constitute prima facie evidence of the facts contained therein in any action or proceeding taken by the Indiana Department of Insurance against the Company, its officers, directors, or agents.
2. The Company shall comply with the Examiner's Recommendations enumerated in summary form and throughout the text of the Verified Report of Examination. A written response to these recommendations should be provided to the Department within 30 days of receipt of this order.
3. Compliance with the Examiner's recommendations shall be completed on or before the filing of the subsequent annual statement. In the event it is not feasible to comply with a recommendation before the filing of the subsequent annual statement, the Company shall submit a written explanation as to why it was not feasible with the filing of the annual statement.

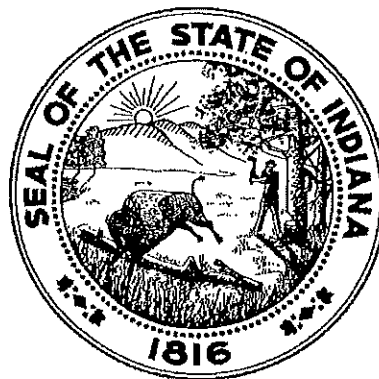

Pursuant to the authority vested in Appointment Number 3995, an examination has been made of the affairs and financial condition of:

**Farmers Home Insurance Company of Knox County
1115 Weed Lane
Vincennes, Indiana 47591**

hereinafter referred to as the "Company", an Indiana domiciled, farm mutual insurance company. The examination was conducted at the Company's corporate offices in Vincennes, Indiana and the offices of Noble Consulting Services, Inc., in Indianapolis, Indiana.

The Report of Examination, reflecting the status of the Company as of December 31, 2017, is hereby respectfully submitted.

SCOPE OF EXAMINATION

The Company was last examined by representatives of the Indiana Department of Insurance as of the period ending December 31, 2012. The present risk-focused examination was conducted by Noble Consulting Services, Inc., and covered the period from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2017, and included any material transactions and/or events occurring subsequent to the examination date and noted during the course of this examination.

The examination was conducted in accordance with the NAIC *Financial Condition Examiners Handbook* (Handbook). The Handbook requires that we plan and perform the examination to evaluate the financial condition and identify prospective risks of the Company by obtaining information about the Company, including corporate governance, identifying and assessing inherent risks within the Company, and evaluating system controls and procedures used to mitigate those risks. An examination also includes assessing the principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation, management's compliance with Statutory Accounting Principles, and Annual Statement instructions, when applicable to domestic state regulations.

All accounts and activities of the Company were considered in accordance with the risk-focused examination process.

HISTORY

The Company was organized in April, 1895, and elected to come under Chapter 145, Acts 1919 in 1978.

CAPITAL AND SURPLUS

As of December 31, 2017, the Company had reported surplus of \$1,472,111. The Company has 740 members, who are the owners of the Company.

TERRITORY AND PLAN OF OPERATION

The Company currently conducts business in Daviess, Greene, Knox, and Sullivan counties.

The Company insures against losses to rural risks including farm and farm-related structures, grain, hay, livestock, and machinery, caused by earthquake, fire, hail, theft/vandalism, and wind. Policies are written on a one (1) year basis.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Directors and officers are required to review and sign Conflict of Interest statements annually. It was determined that all directors and officers listed in the Management and Control section of this Report of Examination have reviewed and signed their statements as of December 31, 2017.

OATH OF OFFICE

Indiana Code (IC) 27-1-7-10(i) stipulates that every director, when elected, shall take and subscribe to an oath stating that he or she will faithfully, honestly, and diligently administer the affairs of the Company and will not knowingly violate any of the laws applicable to such Company. It was determined that all of the directors listed in the Management and Control section of this Report of Examination have subscribed to an oath as of December 31, 2017.

CORPORATE RECORDS

Articles of Incorporation

There were no amendments made to the Articles of Incorporation during the examination period.

Bylaws

There were no amendments made to the Bylaws during the examination period.

Minutes

The Board minutes and the minutes from the annual meeting of the members were reviewed for the period under examination through the fieldwork date. No significant issues or events were noted from the review of the Board and annual meeting minutes.

AFFILIATED COMPANIES

The Company is owned by its members and has no affiliated companies.

FIDELITY BOND AND OTHER INSURANCE

The Company protects itself against loss from any fraudulent or dishonest acts by any employees through a fidelity bond issued by Western Surety Company. The bond has a blanket coverage of \$50,000. The fidelity bond is adequate to meet the prescribed minimum coverage specified by the NAIC.

The Company had additional types of coverage in-force as of December 31, 2017, including but not limited to, director and officer professional liability and workers' compensation.

STATUTORY DEPOSITS

As a farm mutual insurer, the Company is not required to maintain a statutory deposit with the state of Indiana.

REINSURANCE

The Company's reinsurance program is placed through Grinnell Mutual Reinsurance Company. The reinsurance program includes two (2) treaties, both effective January 1, 2017, which are described below.

- *Property Per Risk Excess of Loss Reinsurance* – This coverage limits the Company's liability on an individual occurrence of loss with a retention limit of \$125,000.
- *Property Aggregate Excess of Loss Reinsurance* – The Reinsurer agrees to indemnify the Company for 100% of the Company's ultimate net losses incurred in excess of \$621,000, net of all other reinsurance recoveries.

ACCOUNTS AND RECORDS

The Company's accounting procedures, practices, account records, and supporting data were reviewed and tested to the extent deemed necessary. The trial balances prepared from the Company's general ledger for the years ended December 31, 2016 and December 31, 2017, were agreed to the respective Annual Statements.

The Indiana Department of Insurance is accredited under the National Association of Insurance Commissioners Financial Regulation Accreditation Standards.




