

# American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Trust Fund

### **ARRA Assistance Provided**

Underground Storage Tank (UST) removal, soil and groundwater investigation and remediation. Estimated cost: \$155,000

## Background

The site is currently an abandoned gasoline station. Petroleum-impacted soil was discovered in 2003 during roadwork along Maple Street.

#### **Current Status**

The ultimate goal of the Indiana Brownfields Program is to complete remediation on the subject property and achieve a No Further Action designation to facilitate redevelopment. Consequently, seven USTs, two hydraulic lifts, one aboveground storage tank, and approximately 1847.38 tons of contaminated soil and 1,800 gallons of contaminated liquid have been removed from the site this September using ARRA and state petroleum remediation grant funding. Additional soil and groundwater subsurface investigation is scheduled to occur on November 18, 2009, and will determine the extent of contamination horizontally and vertically. The subsurface investigation will include the installation of temporary soil borings and permanent monitoring wells. The site is expected to achieve commercial/industrial closure through recordation of an environmental restrictive covenant.
