Background

The site is currently abandoned and served as a gasoline service station until the late 1990s. A confirmed release was reported during underground storage tank (UST) closure activities. Nine USTs were permanently removed in 2001 and samples collected during closure activities indicated that soil and groundwater had been impacted. An initial site characterization was conducted in 2002 using state grant funds. A further site investigation occurred in 2003/2004. An additional investigation was performed in 2006/2007 using state grant funds. The property is currently being leased and operated as an automotive repair shop.

Current Status

The goal for the expenditure of ARRA funds is to complete remediation on the subject property and achieve a No Further Action (NFA) designation to facilitate site redevelopment. Consequently, soil and groundwater sampling was conducted in March 2010. Hydraulic lift removal was conducted in April 2010 and funded with state grant funds. Off-site sampling occurred in May 2010. Groundwater remediation was undertaken in August 2010. Subsequently, groundwater sampling was performed in March 2011. The site was approved for closure after groundwater sampling results were reviewed and a NFA letter was issued on September 9, 2011.
