Former Greyhound Depot, Evansville

ARRA Assistance Provided

Soil and groundwater investigation and remediation. Estimated cost: \$74,000

Background

The site is currently an abandoned Greyhound Bus Depot that was used as a terminal and refueling station from 1950 until 2007. A confirmed release was reported during underground storage tank (UST) closure activities. Three gasoline USTs were permanently removed and samples collected during closure activities indicated that soil had been impacted. The property is currently owned by the Evansville Redevelopment Committee.

Current Status

The ultimate goal of the Indiana Brownfields Program is to complete remediation on the subject property and achieve a No Further Action designation for redevelopment. Consequently, additional groundwater and soil samples were collected in October 2009 to determine the extent of groundwater and soil contamination. The subsurface investigation included the installation of seven soil borings that were converted to temporary monitoring wells. Soil excavation and permanent monitoring well installation is scheduled for November 2009. Quarterly groundwater monitoring should begin in early December 2009.
