Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Trust Fund

ARRA Assistance Provided

Underground storage tank (UST) removal, soil and groundwater remediation. Approved Budget: \$130,645.

Background

The site is currently occupied by a single story building which is vacant and in disrepair. The site was formally occupied by a retail gasoline service station until the 1970s. Petroleum contaminated soil was discovered in August 2011 during a limited site investigation funded by state petroleum remediation grant funds. As a result of this investigation, a release was reported to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM).

Current Status

The goal for the expenditure of ARRA funds is to remove all USTs, complete remediation on the subject property, and achieve a No Further Action (NFA) designation to facilitate site redevelopment. On September 19 through 21, 2011, (5) USTs, (1) aboveground storage tank (AST) and 975 tons of contaminated soil were removed from the site (AST removal was funded with state petroleum remediation grant funds). Twenty eight (28) soil samples were collected, twelve (12) of which indicated soil contamination when field screened. In addition, one (1) pit water sample was collected for analysis. IDEM is currently awaiting analytical results in order to determine whether additional remediation is required or applicable RISC closure levels have been achieved.
