#### **RESOLUTION 1999-39**

### A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AS A FINAL RULE 68 IAC 10-8-1

The Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") adopts the following resolution pursuant to the authority granted to it under IC 4-33 and in accordance with 68 IAC 1-2-6.

The following factors have been considered by the Commission:

- 1. The Commission has begun promulgation of this rule pursuant to IC 4-21.5. This rule was published as a proposed rule in the October 1, 1999 edition of the *Indiana Register*.
- 2. The Commission held a public hearing on this proposed rule. No written or verbal comment was received with respect to this rule.
- 3. The promulgation process for the final promulgation of this rule will take approximately four (4) to six (6) months.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION, THAT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED:

#### **SECTION 1. SCOPE.**

This resolution applies to each applicant, each licensee, each riverboat license applicant, any person who does business with an applicant or licensee, and any person who is a patron of a Riverboat Gambling Operation.

#### **SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.**

The definitions set forth in IC 4-33-2 and 68 IAC apply to this resolution.

#### SECTION 3. ADOPTION OF THE FINAL RULES.

The Commission adopts the following final rule pending completion of the promulgation process:

Article 10 Conduct of Gaming
68 IAC 10-8-1 General Provisions [Caribbean Draw Poker]

Pursuant to IC 4-22-2-27 through IC 4-22-2-30, the Commission adopts this rule, which will then be forwarded to the Attorney General's Office for approval as a final rule pursuant to IC 4-22-2-32. Upon approval by the Attorney General's Office, the rule will be submitted to the

Governor's office for approval pursuant to IC 4-22-2-33. After the rule has been approved or deemed approved by the Governor, the rule shall be submitted to the Secretary of State for filing in accordance with IC 4-22-2-35. The Commission further adopts any stylistic, grammatical, typographical or other nonsubstantive changes that the Commission, the Attorney General's Office, or the Legislative Services Agency may make before the rule is printed as a final rule in the *Indiana Register*.

#### SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This RESOLUTION is effective immediately.

#### **SECTION 5. EXPIRATION DATE.**

This RESOLUTION expires thirty (30) days from the date and time that the Secretary of State accepts the rules listed in Section 3 for filing.
