ORDER 2007-108

AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION DENYING APPLICATIONS FOR PERMANENT OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE

The Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") adopts the following order pursuant to authority granted it under IC 4-33.

Each of the individuals listed below applied for an occupational license to work at an Indiana casino. Each of these applicants failed to disclose one or more felony convictions on his/her application for an occupational license. As a result, each was issued a temporary occupational license. After conducting an investigation, the commission staff determined that each applicant listed has been convicted of a felony and is not suitable for licensure pursuant to IC 4-33-8-3. Commission staff revoked the temporary license of each named individual and properly notified each that his/her application for a permanent license would be presented to the Commission for denial. All of the individuals listed are either ineligible for a waiver of the felony disqualification or chose not to apply for a waiver.

After reviewing the facts and circumstances of each individual, the Commission hereby **DENIES** the application for permanent occupational license of each of the following individuals:

- Marty House
- Joe Draper
- Nicholas Emmons

Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-6, this Order will become effective fifteen (15) days after it is served.
