## ORDER 2008-21 AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION CONCERNING THE DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST THE OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE OF FRED MOY

Fred Moy, a level 2 occupational licensee employed by Horseshoe Hammond as a Dealer, had an undisclosed felony conviction on his record but was issued a permanent occupational license. Commission staff, upon discovering the licensee's felony conviction, filed a Complaint for disciplinary action against Mr. Moy's license on October 31, 2007. The Complaint was submitted to an Administrative Law Judge. On February 28, 2008, Administrative Law Judge Mary Lee Comer held a hearing on this matter. She issued Findings of Fact on March 10, 2008, in which she found that Mr. Moy was convicted of Syndicated Gambling in 1988, and that this conviction was a felony under Illinois law. Judge Comer also concluded that the conviction makes Mr. Moy ineligible for licensure in Indiana and recommended that the Commission revoke his license.

After reviewing the foregoing and the attached Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommendation, the Commission hereby:

Affirms
AFFIRMS, MODIFIES, DISSOLVES, or REMANDS

the Administrative Law Judge's Recommendation revoking Fred Moy's Level 2 occupational license.
