ORDER 2008-82

AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION CONCERNING THE VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION PROGRAM CASE NO. VEP-08-40

On or about September 12, 2007, John Doe #40 submitted an application to the Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") to participate in the Voluntary Exclusion Program for a lifetime exclusion. Pursuant to 68 IAC 6-3-2(g), a participant in the program agrees that if he or she violates the terms of the program and enters the gaming area of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission agrees to forfeit any jackpot or thing of value won as a result of a wager made at any facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission. Forfeited winnings are to be withheld by the riverboat licensee and remitted to the Commission, which collects the funds under the terms of the program.

On or about October 12, 2007, John Doe #40 was discovered to be present at Belterra Casino ("Belterra"). At that time, he had \$1,375.00 in his possession; \$1,283.75 from a jackpot and \$91.25 from a TITO ticket. Belterra withheld the winnings as required by Commission regulations and seeks Commission approval for remittance, less applicable taxes on the winnings, as a fine levied against John Doe #40.

The Commission, after having reviewed this matter:

APPROVES

the remittance of the winnings in the amount of \$1,375.00, less applicable taxes, as a fine levied against John Doe #40.

Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-5, this ORDER becomes effective 15 days following receipt of the Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission.
