## **ORDER 2011-50**

## AN ORDER AFFIRMING THE REVOCATION OF KYLE D. CAMBRIDGE'S OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE

Mr. Kyle D. Cambridge was issued a permanent occupational license on February 13, 2009, which was renewed in 2010. On September 7, 2010, Mr. Cambridge pleaded guilty to Operating a Vehicle while Intoxicated with a Prior Conviction, a D-Felony. In order to maintain suitability for licensure, an occupational licensee may not be convicted of a felony under the laws of the State of Indiana, or the laws of any other state or jurisdiction.

On September 22, 2010, the Commission filed a disciplinary complaint seeking to revoke Cambridge's occupational license due to his failure to maintain suitability. Cambridge filed an answer to the Commission's complaint on October 12, 2010. He thereafter failed to appear at a Preliminary Hearing set for November 19, 2010; as a result, Commission staff filed a Motion for Issuance of Proposed Order of Default Judgment. On November 19, 2010, a Proposed Order of Default Judgment was served on all parties pursuant to I.C. 4-21.5-3-24(a)(1). On December 16, 2010, the ALJ granted the Commission's Motion and issued an Order for Default Judgment.

## **COMMISSION ACTION**

After reviewing the foregoing and in accordance with IC 4-21.5-3-29, the Commission hereby:

## <u>AFFIRMS</u>

the Administrative Law Judge's Order. Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-6, this Order will become effective fifteen (15) days after it is served.
