

ORDER 2016-065
AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION
RATIFYING EMERGENCY ORDER 2015-RR-04

Commission Resolution 2012-151 allows the Executive Director, upon obtaining consent from one Commissioner, to exercise the powers and duties of the Commission under Ind. Code § 4-33-4-1 in urgent circumstances.

The Commission has considered the following factors:

1. The Commission may take action, including, but not limited to, revocation, suspension, or restriction of an occupational license at any time that the Commission determines the occupational licensee is in violation of the licensing statutes or regulations. 68 Ind. Admin. Code § 2-3-10(a).
2. The Commission may suspend an occupational license without notice or an evidentiary proceeding, if an emergency exists, by an authorized individual or panel of individuals. 68 Ind. Admin. Code § 13-1-22.
3. On December 18, 2015, Executive Director Tait, upon obtaining consent from Chairman Johnston, issued Emergency Order 2015-RR-04 pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-4, 68 Ind. Admin. Code § 13-1-22, and Resolution 2012-151.
4. Emergency Order 2015-RR-04 found that Amy Griffith, a Level 3 licensee, was unsuitable for licensure due to her felony conviction, and that it was in the best interests of the public and the gaming industry to suspend her license immediately.
5. Resolution 2012-151 requires that the Executive Director report this action to the Commission at the next Commission meeting for ratification or other action.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission hereby **RATIFIES** the Executive Director's December 18, 2015, Emergency Order 2015-RR-04.


