

What is the CoC competition?



Annual CoC Program Notice of Funding Opportunity describes the design of each competition and its requirements, per federal guidelines



Funding is competitive (locally and nationally) and is not guaranteed



HUD System Performance Measure, annual PIT and HIC, and HMIS bed coverage are data points consistently used to evaluate whether a CoC should receive more funding



Our CoC's capacity to increase funding through new projects in the competition, is based on the current funding we receive, CoC application, and the quality of the new individual project application



HUD released the first 2 year NOFO in 2024, at this time we believe we will not have a full competition for funding in 2025.



What helps our CoC Increase CoC funding?



CoC to select renewal and new projects that are performing well and have a good project design.

- CoC Board approves scoring process and confirm final ranking
- CoC will follow percentage Annual Renewal Distribution
- CoCs to apply for new projects using funding from underperforming grants

Data collection and reporting from CoCs through HMIS

- System performance measures (SPMs)
- Oystom performance measures (or 148
- Point in Time Count

- Housing Inventory Count
- Bed Coverage

CoC NOFO application to enforce or encourage CoC's to do certain things

- Including People with Lived Experience in CoC Board and Regional Planning Councils
- Specific policies, wording, or practices

What is *Good Performance* to HUD?

 For the purposes of funding, HUD focuses on major reports from HMIS and then uses applications to give CoC's the opportunity to discuss their results.

• If the data in the report is poor quality or has poor outcomes, the CoC is only able to discuss what it is doing to improve.

• We start at zero points, and we can earn points back







· Demonstrate that between FY 2021 and FY 2022 the CoC increased the rate at which persons residing in permanent supportive housing or other permanent housing, excluding rapid rehousing, exited to permanent housing destinations by at least 1 percentage point (e.g. from 92% to 93%) or that rate of retention of or exits to permanent housing destinations was 96 percent or higher as reported in HDX (up to 4 of the 13 points);





- · Demonstrate that between FY 2021 and FY 2022 the CoC reduced the rate at which persons who exited to permanent housing destinations experienced additional spells of homelessness within 6 months of exit by at least 1 percentage point (e.g., from 10% to 9%) or that the CoC's rate of return in 6 months was 5 percent or less as reported in HDX (up to 3 of the 8 points):
- Demonstrate that between FY 2021 and FY 2022 the CoC reduced the rate at which persons who exited to permanent housing destinations experienced additional spells of homelessness within 12 months by at least 1 percentage point (e.g., from 15% to 14%) or that the CoC's rate of return in 12 months was 10 percent or less as reported in HDX (up to 3 of the 8 points):
