Boone County

General Information

- Dial 2-1-1: Calling 2-1-1 connects you with a community navigator who can provide the most up-to-date locations and hours of warming centers in your area, as availability can change based on weather conditions and time of year.
- Boone County Dispatch: If you need assistance after hours or in an emergency, you can call the Boone County Sheriff's Department dispatch non-emergency line at 765-482-1412 and select option 8. They will provide the location of an open warming center if needed.

Typical Warming Center Locations

Boone County Emergency Management coordinates with various local entities to provide temporary relief from the cold. These locations are generally available during their normal operating hours and are intended for temporary warmth, not as overnight shelters.

Examples of locations that have served as warming centers in the past include:

- Lebanon Public Library: 104 E. Washington St. in Lebanon
 - Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Friday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- Whitestown Fire Department at 6800 Indianapolis Rd. in Whitestown
 - Daily 24 hours; does not serve as overnight shelter option
- Thorntown Public Library at 124 N. Market St. in Thorntown
 - Monday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Tuesday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Hussey-Mayfield Memorial Public Library at 250 N. 5th St. in Zionsville
 - Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sunday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Hancock County

The Center Township Warming Center is located at the Boys and Girls Clubs of Hancock County 715 E. Lincoln Street Greenfield, IN 46140

The Warming Center provides a safe and welcoming place for anyone in need of shelter for the night. It will open whenever the temperature is expected to drop below 32°F, during any form of precipitation, or when the wind chill reaches 20°F or lower.

Hours of operation are from 7:00 PM to 8:00 AM, and we ask that all guests enter through the East entrance.

Upon arrival, guests can grab a bite to eat, take a hot shower, and rest comfortably on a cot for the night.

To ensure the safety of all guests and volunteers, everyone entering the center, including volunteers, will be subject to a background check.

Please be aware that you will not be permitted if you are a registered sex offender or have a violent background
