## The Homelessness Prevention and Intervention Network (HPIN) Indiana Region 4 Planning Council on the Homeless Summer Contingency Plan

This Summer Contingency Plan was created to coordinate the homelessness resources in Region 4 to most effectively serve persons without a home during seasonal inclement weather. This document is meant to serve as a guide to better direct persons in need of these services.

## DAYTIME SPACES

**LTHC Engagement Center** provides day shelter for singles and families that are homeless, including three meals, showers, lockers, case management, employment assistance and other services. The day center is open every day from 7:00am to 8:30pm. Day-time services are not available after 6:30pm.

**Lafayette Urban Ministry** will open its main office at 420 N 4th Street as a cooling center from 8:00am to 4:30pm on any weekday when the "feels like" temperature is 90 degrees or higher. Water will be provided, and snacks when available.

Additional cool locations for persons without a home include:

**NAMI-WCI** is open at 615 N 18th Street, Suite 104 in Lafayette from 8:00am to 8:00pm, Monday through Friday. Clients may utilize the space if they also engage in mental health programming. 765-423-6939

**Recovery Cafe** is open at 2300 Ferry Street in Lafayette on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 10:00am to 2:00pm, and Wednesday from 10:00am to 8:00pm to any person self-identifying as "in recovery". 764-609-0826

**The Tippecanoe County Public Library** is open to the public at 627 South Street in Lafayette from 9:00am to 8:00pm Monday through Thursday, 9:00am to 6:00pm Friday and Saturday, and 1:00pm to 5:00pm on Sunday. Library patrons can use services including reading materials and access to the internet.

**West Lafayette Public Library** is open at 208 W Columbia Street in West Lafayette from 10:00am to 8:00pm Monday through Thursday, 10:00am to 6:00pm Friday and Saturday, and 1:00pm to 5:00pm on Sunday. Library patrons can use services including reading materials and access to the internet.

## **OVERNIGHT SHELTER**

**Lafayette Urban Ministry (LUM) Emergency Shelter** provides overnight shelter at 525 N 4th Street to up to 48 single adults each night along with meals and showers. Guests must sign up in advance from 8:00-11:00am at the LUM Office, 420 N 4th Street. The shelter is open from 9:00pm to 7:00am daily. 765-423-2691

**Greater Lafayette Family Shelter** serves families with children, who can be referred via Coordinated Entry at LTHC Homeless Services at 815 N 12th Street in Lafayette. 765-423-4880

LTHC Homeless Services may provide a limited number of overnight crisis beds to persons enrolled in their program, subject to availability.

## PERSONS IN CRISIS

**The Haven** at 2323 Ferry Street in Lafayette provides 24/7 crisis stabilization services. Valley Oaks Health and Phoenix Paramedics partner to provide mobile and stationary services for persons in crisis with peer and medic support. Mobile crisis units can also respond to persons in crisis when contacted by phone. 765-490-0381
