The Lowell Police Department is seeking applicants for a full-time police officer position. Eligible candidates must be at least 21 years of age, but less than 40 at the time of appointment unless currently enrolled in PERF. They must be a US citizen, have no felony or domestic battery convictions, be of good moral character, have a high school diploma or equivalent and be able to pass a physical fitness evaluation, written test, polygraph examination and extensive background investigation. The Lowell Police Department is an Equal Opportunity Employer.

Preference will be given to certified officers and may be eligible for abbreviated testing, vacation time and lateral pay based on experience.

Applications may be requested by email or picked up at the Lowell Police Department at 1333 E. Commercial Avenue during the designated times. Email requests should be sent to Chief James Woestman at jwoestman@696cops.com. Applications must be submitted in person at the Lowell Police Department. The hours for receiving or returning the applications are Monday through Friday, 7:30 am to 3:30 pm. Applications are due by December 1st at 3:30 pm. There is a \$25 testing fee to be paid when the application is turned in.
