

Behavior-Based CQB:


From Patrol Tactics to Active Killer Response 2-Day Training

Mass shootings in schools, businesses, workplaces, malls, and places of worship have shown a sobering truth: the first officer on scene often determines the outcome.

From the Robb Elementary tragedy in Uvalde, Texas, to the massacre at the Pittsburgh Tree of Life Synagogue, to the recent shooting at a Catholic Church in Minneapolis, and countless other horrific events across the country, one theme remains constant, hesitation costs lives, and decisive action saves them.

Course Design and Scope:

The BBCQB system is a limited-penetration tactical clearing method that allows an individual operator or small unit to clear a structure sequentially by capitalizing on the geometry, cover, and concealment inside the stronghold. Using a segmented search approach enables operators to process information more effectively rather than being forced to process everything at once during an immediate entry into a room or structure.



This approach offers significant advantages to operators, including the ability to prioritize threats and engage them from outside the room. It is especially well suited for solo responders, who can use the structure to their tactical advantage. Information processing, decision making, and marksmanship are all enhanced, compared with rushing into a room and attempting to process 360 degrees of information simultaneously. Upon room entry, the method allows users to aggressively attack corners and establish triangulation of fire on threats, minimizing one-on-one gunfights. The focus of this course is maximizing speed and effectiveness for active killer and hostage rescue scenarios.

The same basic principles and techniques are applied at varying speeds to address all types of close quarter battle situations, including deliberate, dynamic, stealth, and hostage rescue operations. It is our position that patrol and front-line officers perform more real hostage rescues and active killer interventions than many special operations teams. Patrol and first responder units therefore require tactics that provide a clear advantage in these extremely high-risk missions.

This method is highly adaptable to live fire, Simm/UTM, and integrated combative scenarios because it is grounded in human behavior and predictable responses to stress and perceived threats.


