Lineage and Honors

**152d INFANTRY
(SECOND INDIANA)**

Organized 24 June 1846 from existing companies as the 3d Regiment, Indiana Volunteers, Indiana Brigade

Mustered into Federal service 26 June 1846 at New Albany; mustered out of Federal service 24-27 June 1847 at New Orleans, Louisiana, and elements reorganized as independent companies in Indiana

Companies southern Indiana consolidated and mustered into Federal service 21-27 April 1861 at Indianapolis as the 6th and 8th Indiana Volunteer Infantry Regiments; mustered out of Federal service 2-6 August 1861 at Indianapolis

After 6 August 1861 the above units underwent changes as follows:

6th Regiment reorganized and mustered into Federal service 20 September 1861 at Indianapolis

Mustered out of Federal service 22 September 1864 at Indianapolis

8th Regiment reorganized and mustered into Federal service 5 September 1861 at Indianapolis

Mustered out of Federal service 28 August 1865 in Georgia

Reorganized 27 May 1882 in the Indiana Legion from existing companies as the 2d Regiment

(Indiana Legion redesignated 5 March 1895 as the Indiana National Guard)

Mustered into Federal service 10 May 1898 at Indianapolis as the 158th Indiana Volunteer Infantry; mustered out of Federal service 4 November 1898 at Indianapolis

Reorganized 20 July 1900 in the Indiana National Guard as the 2d Infantry

152d INFANTRY (SECOND INDIANA)

Mustered into Federal service 28 June-9 July 1916 at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana; mustered out of Federal service 21-26 February 1917 at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana

Mustered into Federal service 20 April 1917 at Jeffersonville; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1917 as the 152d Infantry and assigned to the 38th Division

Demobilized 8 March 1919 at Camp Zachary Taylor, Kentucky

Consolidated in 1921 with the 137th Field Artillery (organized in 1846); consolidated unit reorganized in the Indiana National Guard as the 152d Infantry and assigned to the 38th Division (later redesignated as the 38th Infantry Division); Headquarters Federally recognized 15 November 1921 at Indianapolis

(Location of Headquarters changed 13 December 1932 to Fort Wayne; on 19 April 1938 to Indianapolis)

Inducted into Federal service 17 January 1941 at home stations

Inactivated 9 November 1945 at Camp Anza, California

Reorganized (less 3d Battalion) and Federally recognized 23 May 1947 with Headquarters at Evansville (3d Battalion [former 137th Field Artillery] reorganized and Federally recognized 30 December 1947 as the 293d Infantry - hereafter separate lineage)

Reorganized 1 February 1959 as a parent regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System to consist of the 1st and 2d Battle Groups, elements of the 38th Infantry Division

Reorganized 1 March 1963 to consist of the 1st and 2d Battalions, elements of the 38th Infantry Division

Withdrawn 1 November 1986 from the Combat Arms Regimental System and reorganized under the United States Army Regimental System

Reorganized 1 September 1994 to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 76th Infantry Brigade, and the 2d Battalion, an element of the 38th Infantry Division
