GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL AID

- Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC)
- Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)
- Federal Student Aid

GRANTS

- Federal Pell Grants
- Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOG)
- Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grants
- Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grants

LOANS

- If you apply for financial aid, your school will likely include student loans as part of your financial aid package. Generally, there are two types of student loans—federal and private
- Federal student loans and federal parent loans: These loans are funded by the federal government
- Private student loans: These loans are nonfederal loans, made by a lender such as a bank, credit union, state agency, or a school

WORK STUDY

- Available to students with financial need who are pursing undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees
- Available to full-time or part-time students
- Administered by schools participating in the Federal Work-Study Program. Check with your school's financial aid office to find out if your school participates

- For Federal Aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available at: https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa
- Colleges usually use the FASFA to determine your eligibility for additional state funded financial aid available to you. Check with your college financial aid office for more information.
