Description of capabilities, venues, and pricing for utilization of the Atterbury-Muscatatuck Training Center. This includes the Camp Atterbury Training Center and Muscatatuck Urban Training Center







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OVERVIEW

Welcome to the Atterbury-Muscatatuck Center for Complex Operations, a State of Indiana and Department of Defense collaborative enterprise whose efforts are focused on creating and operating a highly realistic, fiscally responsible, contemporary training, developmental testing, and evaluation environment. Our focus is to support joint, interagency, intergovernmental, multinational (JIIM) and non-governmental capabilities to prepare as a team for deployment in support of requirements for both the homeland and overseas.

A-MCCO is comprised of three major activities:

- Camp Atterbury Training Center: Over 34,000 acres to include over 26,000 acres for maneuver training space with an impact area over 6,000 acres. Ranges and facilities support up to a brigade size element and a division level warfighter exercise.
- Muscatatuck Urban Training Center: Consists of 1,000 acres, over 120 structures with over 2,000 rooms, and a 180 acre reservoir in an isolated rural location, yet staged to replicate a living, breathing city in a failed state. MUTC supports up to a brigade-size element and specializes in a four dimensional training and testing environment: Ground/Urban, Airspace, Electro-Magnetic/Cyber, and Human.
- Jefferson Proving Grounds (JPG): Consists of 50,000 acres with a 1,000 acre air-to -ground gunnery impact area. JPG pricing is not provided in this guide.

OUR GOAL

Provide the nation with the most realistic and fiscally responsible operating environment with the highest quality facilities and customer support. We strive for best value, hospitality, and adaptability so that our customers focus their time and training towards mission success.

PRICING GUIDE PURPOSE

The purpose of this document is to assist organizations in their decision and resource planning to utilize the A-MCCO. The associated costs are estimates based on current rates for FY 2019. The enclosed cost estimates are for planning purposes only and actual costs will vary based on actual utilization and resource selection. After an organization completes a Utilization Request Packet, A-MCCO will generate a cost estimate for your budgeting purposes based on the requested services. After utilization, customers will only be charged for actual usage and consumption. This pricing guide will be updated as a minimum each fiscal year.





SCHEDULING WARNING

All customers are required to have their funding sent to CAIN DRM **60** days from the start of your training event. Customers that do not send the funding in sufficient time run the risk of not getting requested facilities.

Customers who cancel their training event less than 30 days out, may be charged cancellation fees for time spent and costs executed in support of their event.

All customers with outstanding debts to A-MCCO may be prevented from training on the installation until their invoices are cleared.

SURCHARGE

In accordance with DoD Instruction 4000.19, the DOD Financial Management Regulation 11A and NGR 5-2, there will be a 4% administrative charge assessed to select Federal customers for indirect costs. Federal customers who require administrative support in excess of the baseline amount established to cover all customers indirect costs will be charged for actual costs in lieu of the 4% set rate.

DISCLAIMER

This pricing guide is subject to updates as mandated by regulation and law. Increases in prices from vendors will be passed along as they incur. Any updates to prices for facilities or increased in above base line costs which impact estimates for previously scheduled events by an increase of greater than 5% will be passed along after the impacted customer has been given 180 day notice.

	Definitions
Baseline Services (BLS)	The funded quality, quantity, frequency of an installation support service provided within available resources and Army priorities to all applicable customers. This refers to the typical installation support performed by an installation supplier without a payment required from the customer. Any additional quality, quantity, frequency or timeliness of a commonly provided installation support service is called Identifiable Incremental Costs.
Cantonment Facilities	These buildings and features consist of garrison activities for base operations support, sustainment, and quality of life amenities. Examples include barracks, administrative space, supply, logistics, morale, welfare, and recreation, places to eat, and other capabilities that support training and testing activities.
DODAAC	Department of Defense Activity Address Code. Only DoD and federal agencies can acquire a DODAAC. This is only a requirement DoD or federal agency is requesting acquisition of rations (non-catered), fuel, ammunition and pyrotechnics through DoD.
Federal Customers	Agencies that directly represent the U.S. Government. Examples include but not limited to the Department of Defense (Army, Marines, Navy, and Air Force), the Office of Homeland Security, the Department of Energy, or the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Waste water that is stored and removed by services other than
Gray Water	sewer.
Incremental Direct Costs (IDC)	The costs of resources directly consumed by a customer that would not have been consumed of the customer did not require them or a cost that is specifically identified with a single cost object. Examples include rental, placement, and pickup of dumpsters and portable latrines; additional refuse pickups, grass mowing, and insect spraying; utilities for metered buildings; cost of consumables such as additional targets; training area cleanup and damage repair; and employee overtime as a result of the use of the installation.
Non-Federal Customers	A non-Federal entity is a self-sustaining organization, incorporated or unincorporated, that is not an agency or instrumentality of the federal government. Examples include any state and local government organizations, private organizations, businesses, and youth organizations.
Reimbursement	Monetary amounts received from the public or other government accounts that represent payment for goods or services furnished.





	Definitions (Continued)
Sustainment Costs (SRM)	Sustainment provides for maintenance and repair activities necessary to keep a typical inventory of facilities in good working order over their expected service life. This reimbursable cost applies to any non-federal customers utilizing Camp Atterbury, and non-federal customers and Indiana State agencies utilizing MUTC. SRM includes: • regularly scheduled adjustments and inspections, including maintenance inspections (fire sprinkler heads, HVAC systems) and regulatory inspections (elevators, bridges) • preventive maintenance tasks • emergency response and service calls for minor repairs major repair or replacement of facility components (usually accomplished by contract) that are expected to occur periodically throughout the facility service life
RBP	• Rations Break Point. Includes Class I Food supplies issued to requesting units. Examples include MREs, UGR-As, and A-Rations. A customer must have a DODAAC to order TISA supplies.
Utilities	Services that provide heating and cooling (natural gas and propane), electricity, water, and sewer to facilities.

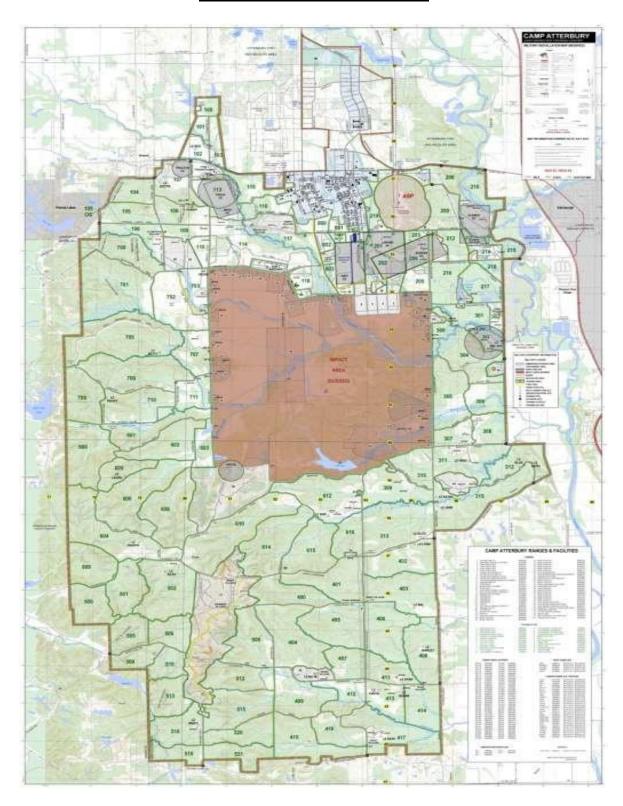

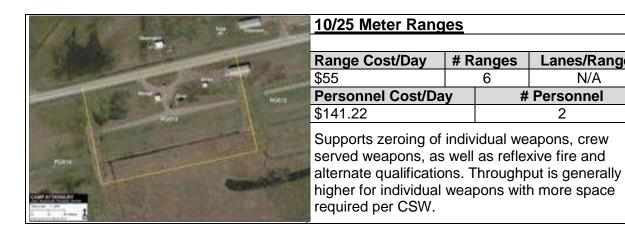

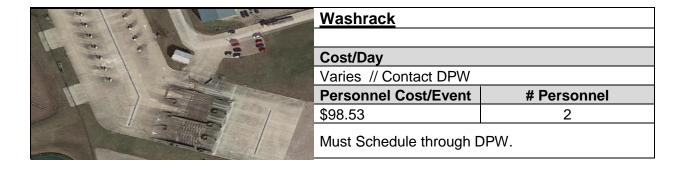

Many buildings are metered, in which actual electric, water, gas, and sewer will be charged. Estimates for the facilities below are planning factors for the largest building of that category, and issued buildings will be estimated based on the square footage of each. This does not include Indiana National Guard units. Each unit will receive an estimate prior to funding. Final charges will be based =on actual assets used.

Non-Federal Cost Estimate: The estimate for non-federal customers is utilities (above) combined with SRM costs to the federal government to maintain the buildings. Estimates are prorated using the DOD Facilities Pricing Guide (UFC 3-701-01). Each unit will receive an estimate prior to funding. Final charges will be based =on actual assets used.

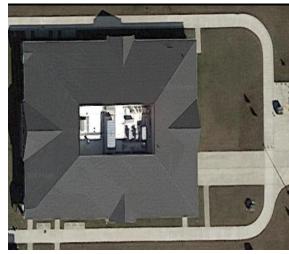

MUTC OVERVIEW

The Muscatatuck Urban Training Center (MUTC) is a unique capability of Camp Atterbury, with an imbedded pricing guide for venues and facilities. MUTC is located 45 miles southeast of Camp Atterbury, and consists of 1,000 acres of training area in an isolated rural location, yet staged to replicate a living, breathing *city in a failed state*.

Other federal customers will be charged for additional requirements where the use exceeds the baseline services level.

Non-government activities require sponsorship by a government agency to assume liability. The sponsor may charge fees to provide the service, and the sponsored customer is billed for use of facilities via the government sponsor.

Pricing Guide Purpose

The purpose of this document is to assist organizations in their decision and resource planning to utilize Atterbury-Muscatatuck. The amounts contained herein are estimates, effective 1 Mar 14, and are subject to change without notice. These estimates are approximate costs because each customer's situation is unique, and only when the organization completes a Utilization Request Packet, and the Atterbury- Muscatatuck representative works with the customer, will a specific estimate be generated. Exact costs are calculated after utilization and customers are charged for actual usage and consumption.

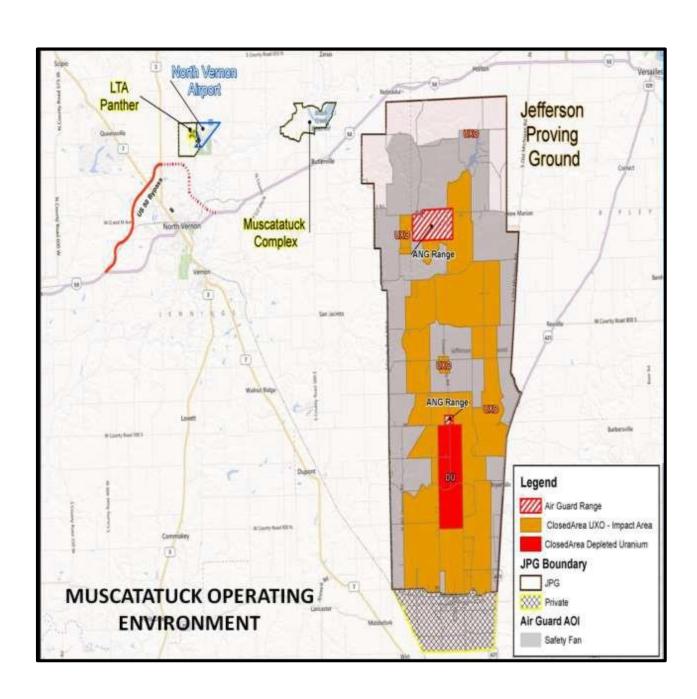

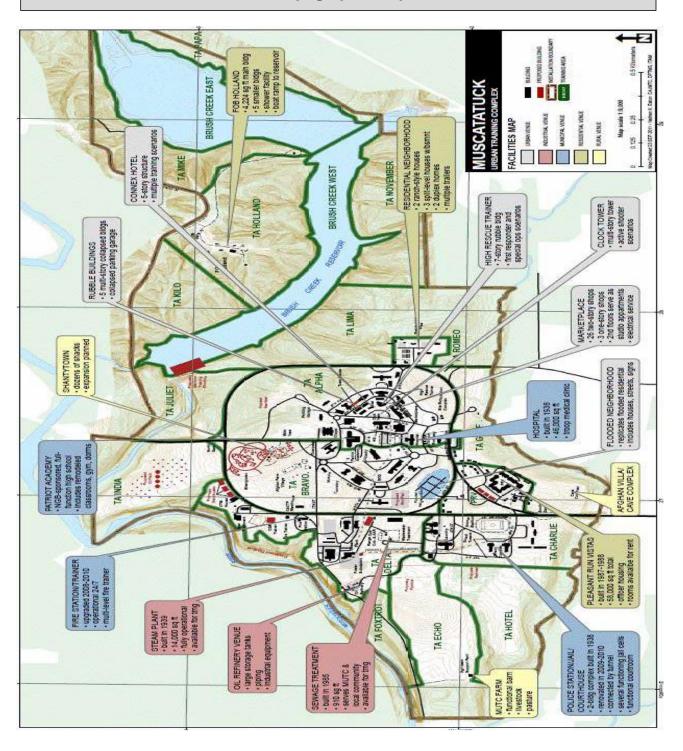
MUTC Operating Environment

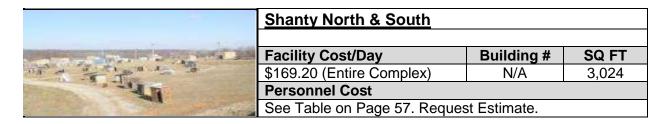

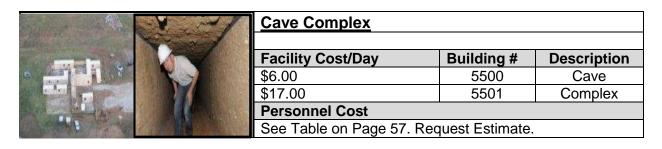

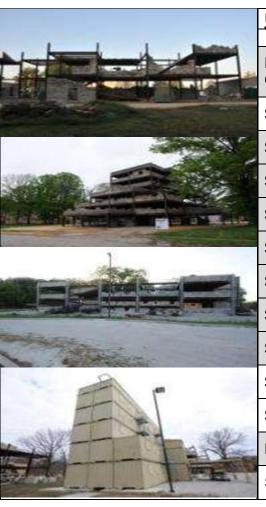
