This Request for Proposals (RFP) establishes the framework, performance expectations, and evaluation criteria to ensure modernization, transparency, and fair competition for the benefit of Indiana motorists and participating businesses.

1. Definitions

“Specific Service Sign (Logo) Signing Program” Logo signs guide motorists to specific motorist service facilities along interstates and designated freeways, as well as along the subsequent ramps and roads providing access to the service facilities from the limited-access highway. The Logo signs currently cover five service types: gas, food, lodging, camping, and attractions, and may include a sixth service type for EV charging pending administrative rulemaking. The primary benefit of using Logo signs is that a motorist will know which specific brand or providers of services are accessible from an interchange prior to exiting the limited-access highway.

“Tourist-Oriented Directional Sign (TODS) Program” signs guide motorists to tourist-oriented businesses, services, and activity facilities (e.g., recreation areas) along conventional state highways outside of major urban areas. TODS consists of individual rectangular panels containing the name of the participating facility in white lettering on a blue background, a generic pictograph or symbol, and any required directional information, such as a directional arrow and distance. See **Attachment D** for the current TODS Program Policy and a list of the major urban areas excluded from the program.

“Participation Agreement” A contract between the Contractor(s) and a participant in the Logo Sign or TODS Program that allows the participant’s business name or business logo to be displayed.

“Business” means a commercial establishment providing gas, food, lodging, camping services or attractions. A business may also include EV charging stations in the future, see [LSA Docket 26-114](#) for a proposed rule to add EV charging as an eligible service category;

“Business LOGO” means a sign mounted on the display panel of a logo structure, showing the name, symbol, trademark, or combination thereof for business within a category of motorist services available at an interchange.

“Contractor(s)” means the company providing all services related to the LOGO sign program pursuant to a contract.

“Customer” means the business represented on a business logo.

“Display Panel” means the facing or surface of a logo structure to which business logos are affixed. “Limited access facility” means a street or highway especially designed for through traffic.

“Logo Structure” means the support columns and display panel upon which separate business logos may be displayed.

“Most Current” and “Current” means the most recent version of any standard or requirement, including any changes, amendments or additions which occur following the date INDOT and the Contractor(s) execute this Contract.

“Responsive Maintenance” means timely and efficient repair or service of assets, addressing issues as they arise to ensure they remain in good working condition.

“Routine Maintenance” means a type of work conducted to ensure signs are clear and operable for motorists, including preservation work to maximum life cycle and safety.

“Sign Configuration” means the arrangement of the logo categories on a display panel.

“Toll Road” means a current or future tolled interstate highway in Indiana.

“Trailblazer” means signage to provide additional direction to an otherwise qualifying business that is not visible from the exit ramp or intersection.

2. Scope of Work

2.1 General Overview

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) seeks proposals from qualified firms to administer, market, operate, and maintain the Specific Service (Logo) Signing Program and the Tourist-Oriented Directional Signing (TODS) Program, collectively referred to as the ‘LOGO Signing Program,’ administered under a **performance-based, best-value contract model**.

The initial contract term is eight (8) years with up to two (2) one-year renewal options, subject to satisfactory performance and INDOT approval.

The purpose of this RFP is to modernize the LOGO Signing Program by aligning it with current technology standards, lifecycle maintenance practices, and transparent performance reporting.

The intent is to:

- Maximize program participation and revenue potential;
- Improve transparency through shared data and real-time dashboards;
- Ensure lifecycle asset management and measurable performance outcomes;
- Provide INDOT and program participants with direct digital access to program data; and
- Strengthen economic impact through fair-market pricing and continuous improvement.

INDOT implements a LOGO Signing program at various locations on the state highway system. INDOT will require the services of a qualified firm to fund and administer the LOGO Signing Program in order to provide business signs to be displayed on “Specific Service Signs” relating to gas, food, camping, lodging, and attractions on the right-of-way of interstate highways and designated freeways (see **Attachment E**) and TODS on conventional state highways. EV charging may be added as an additional category for business signs to be displayed on “Specific Service Signs” pending administrative rulemaking (see [LSA Document #26-114](#)). Existing logo and TODS locations are listed in **Attachment F**. Note that on the I-90 Toll Road, INDOT implements the LOGO Signing program just for lodging, camping, and attraction services.

All costs for marketing, fabrication, installation, operation, and maintenance shall be funded from participant fees and revenues collected by the Contractor(s). The selected Contractor(s) shall provide all personnel, materials, systems, and management necessary for the statewide administration of the **LOGO Signing Program**, encompassing both the Logo and TODS Programs. Services include program management, technology implementation, fabrication, installation, maintenance, customer service, marketing, and reporting.

2.2 Specific Requirements

The selected Contractor(s) shall:

- 2.2.1 Agree to use the sample state professional services contract provisions in **Attachment G**. Any desired wording changes must be noted in the bid proposal, or the requested change will be considered waived.
- 2.2.2 Comply with all current federal and state regulations, including 105 IAC 9-4 of the Indiana

Administrative Code, the Indiana Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (IMUTCD), FHWA directives, the TODS Program Policy, and applicable [INDOT Standards](#).

- 2.2.3 Conduct administrative duties to plan, organize, manage, and direct all program activities, ensuring a safe, efficient, professional, and motorist-focused operation.
- 2.2.4 Conduct transportation operation services, to include engineering services as needed, for the installation, removal, quality assurance, maintenance, life cycle replacement, maintain inventory, assessments, and inspections for signs within the LOGO Signing Program as described herein.
- 2.2.5 Provide all necessary qualified personnel, facilities, vehicles, materials, supplies, equipment, and services to properly conduct the program.
- 2.2.6 Establish and maintain an office in the State that is sufficiently staffed from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM Eastern Time at a minimum, Monday through Friday. The office may be closed on official state holidays or when INDOT Central Office is officially closed due to inclement weather or emergencies.
- 2.2.7 Administer and oversee all documentation, financial transactions, and record keeping associated with each individual customer for each of the sign programs within the LOGO) Signing Program (Logo or TODS, as applicable) including, but not limited to the following (as applicable):
 - 2.2.7.1 Develop or revise application forms, to include formats for download and an online mobile friendly version, for web-based submission within 30 days after award of contract.
 - 2.2.7.2 Develop or revise Participant Agreement templates for future use to include formats for download and an online mobile friendly version with electronic signatures, within 30 days after award of contract. New templates for Participant Agreements and any revisions must be reviewed and approved by the INDOT Program Manager/Contract Administrator. Regarding the language for assignment of participant agreements, the participants / customers shall not have the right to assign but the selected Contractor(s) may retain the right to assign.
 - 2.2.7.3 Execute Participant Agreements as needed with participants / customers in either format of hard copy or an online version with electronic signatures as desired by the participant / customer.
 - 2.2.7.4 Provide billing and fee collections to sign participants annually, and as needed. Formats shall include both paper and online options.
 - 2.2.7.5 Provide refunds to existing sign participants / customers as needed.
- 2.2.8 Develop a process to obtain appropriate permits and/or written approval from governing bodies that have jurisdiction over the roadways not maintained by INDOT.
- 2.2.9 Develop and maintain all standard documents such as templates related to forms, agreements, branding, marketing materials, customer surveys, site plans, reports, manuals, dashboards, websites, and work schedules and submit to the Contract Administrator for approval prior to use.
- 2.2.10 Prepare all non-standard documents, press releases, traffic control plans, sign layout details, site plans, non-standard LOGO or TODS designs, (and other documents as requested) and submit to the Contract Administrator for approval prior to use.

- 2.2.11 Provide special topic reports including related research as needed to address DOT statements, customer relations issues and management inquiries into the LOGO Signing Program as needed.
- 2.2.12 Establish or implement systems, procedures, computer programs, forms, files, billing processes and any other items necessary to administer the program.
- 2.2.13 Configure, integrate, and maintain a data set related to the customer service records for program participants (customers), to include but not limited to, financials, collection and distribution of fees, related accounting, reporting and record keeping of previous & ongoing customers including electronic versions of any hard copy documents (i.e., correspondence, participant agreements, etc.) integrated with the LOGO Signing Program Management System.
- 2.2.14 Establish a process to communicate with the Contract Administrator for review and/or approval of non-standard and customer service issues related to signing, but not limited to: construction requests, estimates for work to be completed for which the Contractor(s) is not financially responsible, the completion of Work Orders, the coordination of INDOT construction projects with any related Logo Signing or TODS that is existing or proposed, etc.
- 2.2.15 Proposals may be submitted for just the lodging, camping, and attraction logo program on the I-90 Toll Road, or for the remainder of the LOGO Signing Program in Indiana, or proposals may be submitted for both the I-90 Toll Road and the remainder of the program. A more detailed description of scope of services and performance requirements is provided in Section 7 of this RFP.

2.3 Program Management

- Provide qualified management and technical personnel experienced in highway signing operations, marketing, and GIS systems.
- Maintain a fully staffed Indiana office responsible for program oversight, customer service, and field coordination.
- Develop and maintain procedures for safety, scheduling, permitting (e.g. [Interstate Highways Congestion Policy](#) Exceptions, etc.), and coordination with INDOT District offices, the Indiana Destination Development Corporation (IDDC), and neighboring state logo programs. For example, currently the logo signs in Indiana on westbound I-74 for Exit 220 in Illinois are in the LOGO Signing Program, while the logo signs in Ohio on westbound I-70 for Exit 156 in Indiana are not in Indiana's LOGO Signing Program.
- Submit quarterly and annual reports summarizing operational, financial, and performance data. Obtain [GovRAMP](#) certification for any program data that is not on INDOT servers and is stored on the cloud.
- Ensure all activities comply with the current regulations and any subsequent revisions set forth in 105 IAC 9-4 of the Indiana Administrative Code, the Indiana Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (IMUTCD), FHWA directives, and applicable [INDOT Standards](#).

Program Management will be evaluated based on Key Performance Indicators as defined in Section 7.

3. Staffing Plan

The Contractor(s) shall provide a comprehensive **Staffing Plan** detailing all personnel assigned to perform services under this Contract. The Staffing Plan shall identify all **Key Personnel** and **support staff** by name, title, role, and percent of time allocated to this program.

The plan shall demonstrate that sufficient resources, expertise, and management capacity exist to execute all facets of the LOGO Signing Program, including marketing, fabrication, installation, maintenance, customer service, and data management.

At a minimum, the Staffing Plan shall include:

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE:

- A clear organization chart showing lines of authority, supervision, and communication.
- Defined relationships between headquarters, field operations, and INDOT points of contact.

PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS:

- Demonstrated professional experience, training, certifications, and licensing relevant to each role.
- Specialized certifications such as ATSSA Traffic Control Technician/Supervisor (for field roles), CPA (for financial management), and GIS Professional (for data roles) are preferred.

AVAILABILITY AND COVERAGE:

- The plan must identify primary and alternate points of contact for each major function.
- Each Key Personnel member must dedicate a minimum of **50% of their working time** to this Contract unless otherwise approved by INDOT.

SUBCONTRACTORS:

- Any subcontractors shall be clearly identified, including their scope of responsibility, qualifications, and oversight method by the Contractor(s).
- All subcontractors must meet the same standards for safety, quality, and training as the Contractor(s)'s direct employees.

STAFF UPDATES:

- The Contractor(s) shall maintain an up-to-date organizational chart throughout the life of the Contract and provide revisions to INDOT within fifteen (15) calendar days of any personnel change.

3.1 Required Key Personnel

The Contractor(s) shall designate the following **Key Personnel**, who shall be directly employed by them and not by any subcontractor(s), unless expressly approved by INDOT. Each position listed below represents a minimum staffing requirement and may be fulfilled by additional personnel based on program needs.

Position Title	Minimum Experience / Qualifications	Primary Responsibilities
Program Manager	7+ years in management of statewide or large-scale LOGO/TODS or transportation asset management contracts.	Serves as the primary contact with INDOT; responsible for overall contract performance, financial compliance, and KPI achievement.
Field Operations Manager	5+ years managing field crews performing sign installation or maintenance.	Directs field crews, schedules work orders, and ensures safety and quality standards are met.
Technology / Data Manager	4+ years in GIS, database administration, or IT system configuration for asset management.	Manages ArcGIS-based systems, dashboards, and data integration; ensures data accuracy and accessibility.
Marketing & Customer Relations Manager	4+ years in marketing, sales, or customer service; experience with public-sector or highway programs preferred.	Directs outreach, marketing campaigns, sales tracking, and customer satisfaction initiatives.
Financial Manager / Controller	5+ years in accounting or financial management; CPA or equivalent preferred.	Manages billing, collections, remittances, and reporting; ensures compliance with state and contract financial terms.

CAD / Drafting Specialist	3+ years in CAD or MicroStation (INDOT standards) design for sign layouts and site plans.	Prepares site plans, shop drawings, and GIS-linked layout documentation for approvals.
Field Crew Technicians	1+ year in sign installation, maintenance, or construction.	Conducts field installations, maintenance, inspections, and condition assessments; ensures work-zone safety compliance.

3.2 Personnel Replacement

- Replacement of any Key Personnel during the contract term shall require **written approval from INDOT**.
- The Contractor(s) shall submit the new individual's résumé and qualifications within fifteen (15) calendar days of vacancy or notice of change.
- If INDOT does not respond within fifteen (15) calendar days after receiving complete documentation, the replacement shall be deemed approved by default.

3.3 Staff Development and Training

The Contractor(s) shall maintain a continuing education and safety training program to ensure all personnel maintain current certifications, technical proficiency, and understanding of INDOT's standards and policies. Training logs shall be made available to INDOT upon request.

4. Contractor(s) Independence and Conflict of Interest Disclosure

To ensure impartial administration and public confidence in the LOGO Signing Program, the Contractor(s) shall remain independent of any business or financial interests that could reasonably be perceived to conflict with the objectives of this Contract.

INDOT will not award the contract(s) to any firm, parent company, or subsidiary that:

Owns, operates, manages, or derives direct or material revenue from commercial outdoor advertising ("out-of-home" or "OOH") billboard displays located within or adjacent to Indiana highway rights-of-way; or

The Contractor(s) shall disclose to INDOT any existing or potential conflict of interest, affiliation, or financial relationship that could impair its objectivity or create the appearance of bias. If such a conflict arises during the contract term, the Contractor(s) shall immediately notify INDOT in writing and propose a plan for mitigation or divestiture, subject to INDOT review and approval.

5. Technology and Data Transparency

The Contractor(s) shall implement a GIS-based management system capable of integrating:

- Asset inventory and lifecycle management,
- Customer relationship management (CRM),
- Financial reporting and invoicing, and
- Mobile field data collection with GPS verification.

5.1 System Requirements:

- Must support **ArcGIS Online** and **ArcGIS Enterprise** interoperability through distributed collaboration.
- Shall provide **secure, role-based access** for INDOT and authorized users to view dashboards, asset maps, and live program participation data.

- Must comply with INDOT IT security, data-retention, and accessibility standards.
- Shall maintain an automated change-tracking log for updates to assets or customer data.
- **Data Ownership:** All databases, imagery, GIS layers, and digital files created or maintained under this contract are the sole property of INDOT. The Contractor(s) shall deliver these in an INDOT-approved format upon request or at contract completion.

5.2 Innovation and Process Improvement

On an annual basis, the Contractor(s) shall conduct a comprehensive review of program operations, technology systems, and lifecycle management practices to identify opportunities for innovation and process improvement. The review shall include analysis of:

- Installation and maintenance techniques;
- Emerging materials and reflectivity technologies;
- Industry trends affecting driver behavior and information access (e.g., web mapping platforms, digital navigation data); and
- Workflow efficiency and key performance indicators (KPIs).

The Contractor(s) shall prepare and present to INDOT an **Innovation and Process Improvement Plan** outlining recommended updates or improvements to maximize program benefits, enhance customer service, and leverage technology advancements. This plan shall be **data-driven** and **aligned with INDOT's modernization goals**.

5.3 Real-Time Visibility of Operations

Field Operations Using Mobile Data Collection

The Contractor(s)'s Sign Program software shall include real-time, mobile-based data collection capabilities with workflows and business processes that support field operations and INDOT audit functions. These capabilities shall include, but are not limited to, program administration, customer service, installation, removal, maintenance, inventories, inspections, compliance, Contractor(s) quality control, INDOT quality assurance, performance monitoring, and auditing.

INDOT must be able to access and secure the most current and accurate information needed to manage the LOGO Signing Program. The system shall provide visibility into, at a minimum, the following components:

- Customer information;
- All limited access facility interchanges and their status, including Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT), urban/rural classifications, county, and INDOT district;
- Eligible interchanges not displaying business logos;
- Ineligible interchanges;
- Detailed structure information for each logo structure, including size of display panel, capacity, number of business logos, size of supports, and date of last replacement;
- Configuration type and available slots in each category;
- Number of mainline display panels;
- Number of ramp display panels;
- Number of mainline and ramp business logos;
- Location data for each logo structure, including limited access identification, exit identification, logo category, panel configuration, direction, and distance from the limited access facility centerline to the business entrance;
- Billing information showing amounts billed, paid, non-renewals, and any adjustments or credits, as well as full tracking of any Administrative Fees paid to the Contractor(s);
- Dates of business logo panel replacements by facility, interchange, category, and participant name;
- Work orders for repairs, refurbishments, new installations, replacements, and configuration

- changes, including cost accounting and real-time tracking through completion;
- Trailblazer and other supplemental signs by facility, interchange, and participant name, including those not on state right-of-way;
- Number of supplemental messages by facility, interchange, and participant name;
- Interchanges under construction, including closure and anticipated reopening dates;
- Real-time renewal and occupancy rates;
- Accurate, current inventory of qualified businesses at each interchange, with a record of marketing outreach when available space exists or new sign potential is identified;
- All deficiencies identified during sign inventories, searchable by road, exit, county, and deficiency type;
- Current, dated photos of each sign with participants, updated annually and when board participants change. Photos must match the current participant listing in the database within 30 days of each quarter;
- Tools to track and verify compliance with all performance measures; and
- Compatibility with State GIS and IT infrastructure and programs.

6. Operations

The Contractor(s) shall perform all fabrication, installation, maintenance, and removal of signs and structures in accordance with [INDOT Standards](#).

6.2.1 Fabrication and Installation

- Use materials meeting current INDOT standards.
- Ensure all panels are produced with digital printing or direct-applied graphics using approved high-intensity or prismatic reflective sheeting.
- Panels shall maintain minimum retro-reflectivity values as prescribed in the IMUTCD; service life expected 25 years.
- All supports, foundations, and hardware shall meet current INDOT Standard Specifications and Standard Drawings except that new or replacement supports and footers for logo signs or TODS may be installed without steel reinforcement in the concrete foundations per the 802-SNGP series in the 2013 INDOT Standard Drawings, see **Attachment I**.
- New installations shall be recorded with GPS coordinates, photographs, and asset information uploaded to INDOT's GIS environment within ten (10) days of completion.

6.2.2 Maintenance and Inspection

- Conduct proactive inspection at least twice annually.
- Replace or refurbish any panel not meeting reflectivity or aesthetic standards.
- Maintain at least 90 percent of assets in **Good or Fair condition** as defined by INDOT.
- Document maintenance work orders and closures in the management system with timestamps and geotagged images.
- Maintain a 120-day completion rate of 95 percent for all standard maintenance requests.

6.2.3 Safety and Traffic Control

- Perform all field work in accordance with the current INDOT [Work Zone Traffic Control Guidelines](#).
- Ensure that all crews are certified in appropriate safety procedures and traffic control device setup.

6.2.4 Quality Assurance / Quality Control

- Maintain a QA/QC Plan describing procedures for fabrication checks, installation verification, and routine audits.
- Maintain records for all inspections, material certifications, and sign-panel warranty information.

6.3 Customer Service

- Maintain a public website and participant portal for online applications, renewals, and payments.
- Provide real-time account dashboards showing active locations, renewal dates, and invoice history.
- Respond to customer inquiries within **24 hours** on business days.
- Conduct annual customer satisfaction surveys and report findings with recommendations to INDOT.

6.4 Marketing and Revenue Growth

- Develop a **Market-Based Revenue Plan** using annualized average daily traffic (AADT) counts and market-value analysis to ensure equitable pricing. AADT information for the logo sign program is shown in **Attachment H**.
- Identify underutilized interchanges and propose targeted marketing campaigns.
- Implement outreach strategies that encourage participation by small, rural, and minority-owned businesses.
- Provide INDOT with annual revenue projections and performance summaries.
- Propose a **minimum guaranteed annual remittance** to INDOT and a **revenue-sharing structure** for revenues exceeding projections.

6.5 Risk Management and Continuity

- Maintain a **Risk Management Plan** identifying risks, mitigation strategies, and review cycles.
- Develop a **Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery Plan** that ensures data integrity and uninterrupted operations during emergencies or system failures.
- Maintain insurance coverage and bonding consistent with INDOT requirements.

6.6 Transition Requirements

- Submit a **Transition-In Plan** detailing onboarding, data integration, and initial operational readiness.
- Submit a **Transition-Out Plan** to ensure transfer of data, records, and physical assets in an INDOT-approved format.
- **Transition Fairness and Asset Ownership** At the expiration of the contract in or after 2034, INDOT will not require any incoming Contractor(s) to purchase existing sign structures, marketing assets, or participant agreements from an outgoing Contractor(s). Participant agreement terms shall follow the contract term. All physical and digital assets installed or managed under this agreement shall remain the property of INDOT. The incoming Contractor(s) shall assume management responsibilities under INDOT's direction without any buyout or transfer payment.

8. Deliverables

- Quarterly and annual program performance reports;

All Offerors shall carefully follow the instructions herein to ensure their proposals are complete, compliant, and eligible for evaluation.

A.2 General Requirements

1. Electronic Submission.
All proposals shall be submitted electronically by the deadline specified in on page 1. Late submissions will not be accepted. Due to email security filtering, Offerors should verify that their first email sent to INDOTASIP@indot.in.gov is received.
2. Two-Volume Format.
Each Offeror shall submit its proposal in two separate volumes:
 - o **Volume I – Technical Proposal**
 - o **Volume II – Price Proposal**
3. Page Formatting.
 - o Page size: 8.5 × 11 inches (11 × 17 counts as two pages).
 - o File formats: PDF, Word, Excel, or PowerPoint. The total size of the proposal submittal, including attachments, must be **less than 25 MB**.
 - o Page count limits are defined below; pages beyond limits will not be evaluated.

A.3 Volume I – Technical Proposal (Shall not exceed 80 pages excluding appendices)

The Technical Proposal shall demonstrate the Offeror's understanding of the scope, technical approach, staffing, and ability to meet all contractual requirements.

A.4 Volume II – Price Proposal

The Price Proposal must be submitted as a separate electronic file clearly labeled “**Price Proposal – [Offeror Name]**” with all financial information expressed in U.S. dollars. It must include the following components:

1. **Guaranteed Annual Remittance to INDOT** – minimum fixed payment to the State for each contract year, for operating just the lodging, camping, and attraction logo program on the I-90 Toll Road, **and/or** for operating the remainder of the LOGO Signing Program in Indiana. Offerors must indicate the minimum fixed payment if INDOT acquires the program assets described in Attachment F (Scenario 1) and the minimum fixed payment if the Offeror must absorb this cost, which for the purpose of this RFP is estimated to be \$18 million dollars (Scenario 2). The program assets consist of the signs on a 16-year straight-line depreciation schedule and the present value on 12/31/2026 of the customer leases (at an 8% annual discount rate) that can range from less than a month remaining to nearly three more years remaining on any given customer lease.
2. **Revenue-Sharing Schedule** – percentage split for revenues exceeding projections and method of annual CPI adjustment. Offerors must indicate the percentage split under both Scenario 1 and Scenario 2 discussed above.
3. **Ten-Year Revenue Projection** – supported by traffic counts, occupancy, and market assumptions. Offerors must indicate the ten-year revenue projection under both Scenario 1 and Scenario 2 discussed above.
4. **Optional Fee Schedule** – proposed rates for installation, maintenance, and replacement of sign structures (if applicable).

A.5 Proposal Format and Organization

- Each section should be clearly labeled to correspond with the numbering in this RFP.
- Tables, charts, and graphics are encouraged to improve readability.
- Each file must include page numbers.
- Offerors must address every requirement in the RFP; omissions may render the proposal non-responsive.

A.6 Submission Requirements

1. **Delivery.** Proposals must be received electronically by the date and time specified on page 1.
2. **Authorized Signature.** All proposals must include a signed cover letter by an officer authorized to bind the company.
3. **Clarifications.** Questions regarding this RFP must be submitted in writing by the deadline stated on page 1.
4. **Confidential Information.** Any data considered proprietary shall be clearly marked “CONFIDENTIAL” and justified in accordance with Indiana public-records law.

A.7 Compliance and Disqualification

Failure to follow these instructions, exceeding page limits, or omitting mandatory information may result in the proposal being deemed **non-responsive** and excluded from evaluation.

A.8 Evaluation and Award Reference

Proposals will be evaluated using the criteria set forth in **Section 10 (Evaluation Criteria)** of this /RFP. INDOT reserves the right to request clarifications, conduct oral presentations, or negotiate terms prior to award.

A.9 Post-Award Requirements

The selected Contractor(s) shall, within 30 days of the Notice of Intent to Award:

- Submit final insurance certificates and performance bonds;
- Provide INDOT with updated Key Personnel list and contact information; and
- Participate in a start-up meeting to finalize transition and implementation schedules.

Attachment B: Proposal Evaluation Matrix

B.1 Purpose

This Evaluation Matrix provides a structured method for the INDOT Proposal Evaluation Committee (PEC) to fairly and consistently evaluate and score all Offeror proposals submitted in response to this Request for Proposals (RFP).

Scores will reflect how effectively each proposal meets or exceeds the technical, management, operational, and financial requirements described in the RFP and Attachments.

B.2 Evaluation Process

1. Each PEC member will independently review and score all proposals using the criteria below.
2. Scores will then be averaged for each Offeror to determine the final composite score.
3. INDOT may conduct clarification meetings or oral presentations with the top-ranked Offerors if deemed necessary.
4. The contract will be awarded to the Offeror whose proposal is determined to be **most advantageous to the State—price and other factors considered**.

B.5 Price Evaluation Methodology

- The Offeror proposing **higher guaranteed annual remittances** to INDOT under either Scenario 1 or 2 will receive more points for that sub-criterion.
- INDOT may verify financial assumptions and request clarifications prior to award.

B.6 Final Composite Score

The final composite score will combine the averaged evaluations for each Offeror: **Technical (45 points), Price (35 points), and Procurement Preferences (20 points)**. The highest-scoring Offeror will be recommended for contract award for the segment(s) bid as identified in Section 2.2.15 of this RFP, subject to verification of references, financial stability, and compliance with all RFP terms.

C.1 Purpose

This Attachment defines the required deliverables, reports, and documentation that the Contractor(s) shall submit to the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) during the performance of the LOGO Signing Program. Each deliverable shall be prepared in accordance with INDOT standards, reviewed by the INDOT Contract Administrator, and submitted electronically in the formats specified below.

C.2 Submission and Review Requirements

Each deliverable must include a cover sheet identifying the report title, submission date, and point of contact. Deliverables requiring INDOT review shall be considered accepted if no written response is provided within fifteen (15) business days of receipt.
3. Quarterly Review Meetings:
The Contractor(s) shall present a summary of key metrics, deliverables, and performance indicators during each quarterly review meeting with INDOT.

C.4 Annual Report Minimum Content

The Annual Report shall provide a comprehensive overview of the program's performance for the prior year and include at minimum:

1. Executive summary of major accomplishments and challenges.
2. Revenue data, remittance to INDOT, and year-over-year growth comparison.
3. Inventory and condition summary (total panels, structures, deficiencies corrected).
4. Marketing activities, new participants, and vacancy rate analysis.
5. Customer service metrics (average response times, satisfaction survey results).
6. Performance against Key Performance Indicators (KPIs).
7. Summary of maintenance and safety activities.
8. Recommended innovations or process improvements for the coming year.

C.5 Data Deliverables

- **GIS Data:** All spatial data shall be maintained in an INDOT-approved ArcGIS format, containing georeferenced locations, structure attributes, business participant information, and inspection history.
- **Imagery and Media:** Photographs and related files must be organized by interchange ID and business name.
- **Dashboards:** Real-time dashboards shall remain active and accessible to INDOT throughout the contract term with 100% uptime except during scheduled maintenance.

C.6 Performance Review and Corrective Action

INDOT may issue written findings if deliverables are incomplete, late, or inconsistent with contractual standards. The Contractor(s) shall submit a **Corrective Action Plan (CAP)** within fifteen (15) business days, outlining steps, responsible personnel, and completion timelines. Failure to correct deficiencies within the specified period may affect performance evaluation or contract standing.

C.7 Deliverable Retention and Transfer

At contract completion or termination, the Contractor(s) shall:

- Provide all final reports, data, and documentation in INDOT-approved formats.
- Certify that all data (including financial, GIS, and imagery) has been transferred in full.
- Provide system credentials or API access keys necessary for INDOT to assume data control.

1. Purpose and Application

Indiana Code Section 9-21-4-5 gives the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT), in partnership with the Indiana Office of Tourism Development (IOTD), the authority to install tourist attractions signs and specific service signs on the state highway system, provided that all of the costs associated with these signs are paid for by the participating businesses. The following document is a joint agency policy by INDOT and IOTD to establish rules and procedures for the installation of tourist oriented directional signs (TODS) on conventional state highways and at-grade intersections on expressways in furtherance of IC 9-21-4-5. For information about the following similar or related signing policies, please refer to the sources indicated in the descriptions below. The contact information for each source is listed in Paragraph I of this Section.

A. Specific Service Signs

Specific service signs are also known as logo signs and are blue and white signs on interstates and freeways that contain the specific business logo of the gas, food, lodging, camping, or attraction services available at an approaching interchange. Please see Section 105 IAC 9-4-1, *et. seq.*, of the Indiana Administrative Code for more information about these signs, or contact the Indiana Logo Sign Group.

B. Destination Signs

Destination signs are green and white signs on conventional state highways or expressways that are for: [1] places, or [2] traffic generators that are not normally considered to be tourist attractions, such as, schools, colleges, military bases, etc. Please see §2D.37 of the Indiana MUTCD for more information about these signs or contact the appropriate INDOT District Office for the current eligibility requirements.

C. Supplemental Guide Signs (SGS)

SGS are the interstate and freeway equivalent to destination signs. SGS are for places or other traffic generators. Please see §2E.35 of the Indiana MUTCD for more information about these signs or contact the IOTD for current eligibility requirements.

D. Community Wayfinding Signs (WFS)

WFS are a type of destination guide sign for conventional state highways with a common color or identification enhancement marker for key civic, cultural, visitor, and recreational attractions within a

city or a local urbanized or downtown area. Please see §2D.50 of the Indiana MUTCD for more information about these signs or contact the IOTD for current eligibility requirements.

E. General Information Signs

General information signs convey miscellaneous information to the motorist such as jurisdictional boundaries, stream names, or government facility locations. Please see Chapter 2H of the Indiana MUTCD for more information about these signs or contact the appropriate INDOT District Office for current eligibility requirements.

F. General Service Signs

General service signs are blue and white signs for motorist services that have an international symbol associated with that service, for example gas, food, lodging, and camping services. Please see Chapter 2I of the Indiana MUTCD for more information about these signs or contact the appropriate INDOT District Office for current eligibility requirements.

G. Recreational and Cultural Interest Area Signs (RACIAS)

RACIAS are brown and white signs for recreational areas such as public parks (state, federal, and local) and cultural areas such as state historic sites. RACIAS are also installed for attractions that are not located within the TODS Program Boundary shown in Attachment 2. Please see Chapter 2M of the Indiana MUTCD for more information about these signs or contact the appropriate INDOT District Traffic Office for current eligibility requirements.

H. Outdoor Advertising Signs (Billboards)

Billboards are advertising signs that can be placed outside of State right-of-way to be seen by motorists. Please see the INDOT Outdoor Advertising Control Manual for more information about these signs.

2. Definitions

- A. Conventional Highway - A two-lane or multi-lane undivided state or U.S. highway and expressway or divided highway segments with at-grade intersections.
- B. Destination Brand - A community that has a unique tourism product significant to the State.
- C. Expressway - A divided arterial highway for through traffic with partial control of access and with interchanges at junctions with high volume highways. For purposes of this policy, sections of expressways with at-grade intersections will be considered as conventional highways, and sections of expressways with interchanges, from the last at-grade intersection before an interchange(s) to the first at grade intersection after an interchange(s), will be considered as freeways.
- D. Freeway - A divided highway to which the *only* means of ingress and egress is by interchange ramps; e.g., an interstate highway.
- E. Indiana Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (Indiana MUTCD) – The Indiana version of the federal Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, which regulates the size, color, and design of devices that control traffic, including signs, pavement markings, and traffic signals.
- F. Primary Applicant - means a business facility that meets the highest eligibility qualifications under this Policy.
- G. Rural Road – A highway that is located outside the boundaries of an incorporated city or town, or a highway that is located within the limits of an incorporated city or town that exhibits rural characteristics: no sidewalks, no on-street parking, and large spacing between driveways.
- H. Seasonal - An attraction that operates for limited time(s) during the year depending on weather conditions or product availability.
- I. Secondary Applicant – means a business facility that meets the reduced eligibility qualifications under this Policy, for example a facility that is open only 5 days a week or a facility that is open less than 6 months a year.
- J. Stay ‘n Play Package – A promotional offer at a golf course that includes at least one golf round and overnight at on-site or nearby lodging facility. Package can also include course amenities, such as golf cart, and other area amenities and attractions. The Stay ‘n Play lodging facility must have at least 10 separate sleeping units with modern sanitary facilities and be located no more than 15 miles from the golf course.
- K. Tourist - A person who travels over 30 miles one way from home.
- L. Tourist Oriented Directional Sign (TODS) - The Indiana MUTCD defines a Tourist Oriented Directional Sign (TODS) as a sign with a white legend and border on a blue background that displays the business identification of and directional information for business, service, and activity facilities. Section 3G of this Policy describes the location for TODS.
- M. TODS Panel - is the standard size sign for an individual tourist attraction on a TODS. The standard dimensions for a TODS Panel are shown in Attachment 1.
- N. TODS Trailblazer – is a reduced size sign for an individual tourist attraction. The standard dimensions for a TODS Trailblazer are shown in Attachment 1.
- O. Tracking Method – The method by which the attendance to a facility is tracked. Methods could include, but are not limited to, car/bus count, people count, sales count, etc.
- P. Trademark - (Indiana Code, Section 24-2-1-2(9)) - “any word, name, symbol, or device or any combination of a word, name, symbol or device that is used by a person to: (A) identify and distinguish goods, including a unique product, of a person and distinguish the person’s goods from goods manufactured or sold by another person; and (B) indicate the source of the goods, even if the source is unknown.”
- Q. Trailblazing - Informational plaques, shields or signs designed to provide the traveling public with guidance in following a route to a particular tourist attraction.
- R. Urban Road – A highway that is within the boundaries of an incorporated city or town or a highway that exhibits urban characteristics, such as sidewalks and on-street parking.

3. General Requirements for TODS

- A. Admission Charges - If general admission is charged, charges shall be clearly displayed at the place of entry so as to be apparent to all prospective visitors.
- B. Combining attractions on signs – In the course of installing TODS, INDOT or its contractor, may combine signs for various attractions on the same sign support structures.
- C. Compliance with applicable regulations - Attractions shall satisfy all requirements in this policy; be open to all persons regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, age or disability; be neat, clean and pleasing in appearance; be maintained in good repair; and comply with all federal, state and local regulations for public accommodations concerning health, sanitation and safety.
- D. Distance from the intersection – Attractions should be within 5 miles of the intersection. Attractions located between 5 and 7 miles of the intersection shall exceed the minimum annual attendance requirement in Section 3H by 50% or more. Attractions located more than 7 miles from the intersection will not be considered for signs.
- E. Illegal Signs - Attraction signs will not be authorized if the applicant has any illegal advertising signs on or along any INDOT highway. Illegal signs are defined by the Highway Beautification Act of 1965 (23 U.S.C. 131) and the INDOT Outdoor Advertising Control Manual.
- F. Insufficient Space - Tourist attractions meeting the criteria of this policy do not automatically qualify for attraction signs. Conditions such as insufficient longitudinal space or interference with necessary traffic control devices may make it difficult to place tourist attraction signs at certain locations. In these instances, signing priority will be as follows:
 - i. Regulatory Signs
 - ii. Warning Signs
 - iii. Guide Signs Other than Destination Signs
 - iv. City and Town Name Destination Signs (D-Signs or SGS)
 - v. Destination Signs for Other Destinations (D-Signs or SGS)
 - vi. Community Wayfinding Signs (WFS)
 - vii. General Information Signs (I-Signs)
 - viii. General Service Signs
 - ix. Specific Service Signs (Logo Signs)
 - x. Tourist Oriented Directional Signs (TODS)
 - xi. Recreational and Cultural Interest Area Signs (RACIAS)
 - xii. Memorial Signs
- G. Locations for TODS - TODS panels and TODS trailblazers may be installed on conventional highways in rural areas and in smaller urban areas as shown in Attachment 2, the TODS Program Boundary Map. TODS panels shall not be installed on urban roads.
- H. Minimum Annual Attendance - Attractions in categories where attendance is not specified or exempted must adhere to this requirement. The annual attendance requirement is 1,500.
- I. Minimum Hours of Operation – Unless otherwise indicated in the specific requirements for a category, attractions shall maintain regular hours and be open to the public at least 5 days each week, for 6 hours per day. Facilities that are only open Monday through Friday will be considered as secondary applicant.
- J. Minimum Months of Operation – Unless otherwise indicated in the specific requirements for a category, attractions shall be open to the public at least 6 months of the year.
- K. On-Premise Sign - The attraction shall have an on-premise sign identifying the name of the facility. If the attraction's on-premise sign is readily visible from the highway, TODS are not normally needed at the entrance to the facility.
- L. Parking - Adequate off-street parking for normal visitor demand but not less than 15 vehicles.
- M. Registration to do business - Attractions shall be registered with the Indiana Secretary of State's Office and maintain an active registration status.
- N. Restrooms and Drinking Water – Modern restrooms and drinking water must be available for public use without charge. If an admission fee is charged for access to the attraction, the restrooms and drinking

water may be limited to paying customers, but no additional fee above the admission charge may be charged for restroom access or drinking water.

- O. Tourist Traffic – A facility shall be eligible for TODS only if it derives a substantial portion of income or visitors during the normal business season from road users not residing in the area of the facility. A road user is considered to be residing in the area of the facility if he or she lives within 30 miles of the facility (see the definition of a tourist in Section 2).

4. Category Specific Requirements for TODS

- A. Agritourism Attraction - An established location where customers can interact with Indiana agricultural producers for the purpose of tours, education or other rural experiences, recreation, or the purchase of products. This category is considered a seasonal attraction and the minimum months of operation requirement does not apply to this category. The facility must satisfy the additional requirements of at least one (1) of the following agritourism subcategories:
- i. *Agri-educational Venue*: A producing farm that offers educational, tourist entertainment, or farm-related activities. Activities may include: horseback riding, corn mazes, farm animal petting zoos, hayrides, or other similar outdoor farm-related activities. The facility may offer on-site lodging opportunities, such as a working guest ranch or bed and breakfast.
 - ii. *Agriculture Production or Processing Venue*: A site that offers product creation tours on a regular basis throughout the year and is located on a producing farm or in a manufacturing setting.
- B. Amusement Park - A commercially operated park enterprise which supplies various devices for entertainment, including, but not limited to: roller coasters; water rides; musical entertainment; carnival games; and refreshments. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement does not apply to this category.
- C. Antique Shopping/Artisan Destination Districts - An area located in a city/urban area offering multiple vendor locations for the purchasing of antiques or handmade crafts. There must be at least 5 shops in the District and it must show that marketing efforts are as a district and that it works with the local Visitors Bureau.
- D. Arena - A stadium, sports complex, auditorium, amphitheater or racetrack. The facility must have at least 20,000 visitors annually and 4,000 seats. The hours requirement does not apply to this category.
- E. Bed & Breakfast/Inn - An owner occupied residence that provides sleeping accommodations to the public, with no more than 14 guest rooms, and breakfast as part of overnight cost. Facility must:
- i. have visible on-site signage,
 - ii. and have at least one parking spot per guest room with off-street parking preferred but not required.

This attraction category is exempt from the annual attendance requirement in Section 3H.

- F. Business District/Main Street Community - The central business district of a community or an area within a community which has been officially designated as a Main Street community by the Indiana Main Street program. Official designation will be confirmed by the Indiana Office of Rural Affairs, Main Street Program.
- G. Campground - A facility offering sites for tents, recreational vehicle (RV) camping, or cabins, for the purpose of temporary living in an out-of-doors environment. The facility shall have a minimum of 25 campsites – can be a combination of cabins, tent sites and/or RV sites. Cabin only facilities must have at least 5 cabins.
- H. Cemetery - A state or national cemetery or a cemetery where persons of national or state historical notoriety are interred. Restrooms, drinking water, parking and attendance requirements do not apply to this category.
- I. Convention Center - A center for hosting events with annual attendance of at least 20,000 and a seating capacity of at least 4,000 seats. The hours requirement does not apply to this category.
- J. Cultural Center - A center for exhibits, presentations, etc., designed to teach visitors about the culture of current or past residents of the area.

- K. Educational Center - A dedicated facility other than a school or post secondary education facility that is of outstanding educational value and conducts educational programs on a regularly scheduled basis throughout the year to educate the public on a subject.
- L. Farmers Market - An established area or facility where consumers can purchase fresh produce directly from Indiana producers. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement in Section 3J does not apply to this category.
- M. Golf Course - A golf course open to the public that is at least 18 holes (non-par 3) and follows United States Golf Association regulations. The golf course must have an on-site Clubhouse and offer a “Stay & Play” package utilizing on-site lodging facilities or a local hotel/motel.
- N. Historical Site - A structure or district listed on the Historic Preservation & Archaeology Division of the Department of Natural Resources’ Indiana Register of Historic Sites and Structures as being of historical significance and that is open to the public.
- O. Industrial Park – A business district that is zoned and planned for industrial or commercial development. The district must have at least 5 separate businesses operating in the district. Business travelers to the district, including truckers, shall be considered as tourists for the purposes of this Policy.
- P. Large Tourist Traffic Generator - A tourist attraction, with no specific category description elsewhere in this policy, that attracts at least 10,000 visitors a year. The facility must also have a marketing plan in place that includes 40% of advertising budget targeting markets more than 30 miles away, thus demonstrating that the facility actively markets itself to tourists (see definition, pg. 3). Facility also must work with local city and county tourism promotion entities (i.e. Convention & Visitors Bureau, or Chamber of Commerce), if one is available.
- Q. “Made in Indiana” production facilities - A facility that educates the public about a production process. The facility must offer tours into the production area.
- i. *Food & Beverage production* - These are manufacturing facilities where food products are produced from raw ingredients such as canning facilities, candy factories, breweries and wineries. The facility must offer product creation tours on a regular basis, samples of product and actively market to tourists (see definition, pg. 3). Fifty percent of the facility’s production must be for retail sales for consumption off site. This category does not include restaurants or similar facilities that prepare meals for consumption on or off-site.
 - ii. *Goods production* - These are manufacturing facilities where raw materials are transformed into finished product for retail sale. The facility must offer product creation tours on a regular basis and actively markets itself to tourists (see definition, pg. 3).
- R. Marina - A sheltered harbor adjacent to a navigable waterway where boats are kept in the water and recreational boating services are provided. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement in Section 3J does not apply to this category.
- S. Museum - An organized and permanent institution with professional staff, essentially educational or aesthetic in purpose, which owns or utilizes tangible objects, cares for them and exhibits them to the public on some regular schedule. Museums with limited parking, restroom and/or drinking water facilities may be considered on a case-by-case basis. If this consideration is requested, a detailed description of the circumstances at the museum must accompany the application form.
- T. Orchard - An established area or facility where consumers can purchase fruits, juice, or cider directly from an Indiana producer. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement does not apply to this category.
- U. Park, Recreation Area, Forest, or Wildlife Area – A privately owned area designated for recreation that is made available to the public for activities such as fishing, picnicking, hiking, swimming, boating and sports.
- V. Performing Arts Center - A center, normally in a theatre style, for performance of plays, music, dance, etc. by local or touring talent. The facility shall have a minimum of 250 seats. The minimum hours of operation requirement in Section 3H does not apply to this category.
- W. Religious Site - A shrine, grotto or similar type of site that is of a unique religious nature. Religious sites with limited parking, restroom and/or drinking water facilities may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

If this consideration is requested, a detailed description of the circumstances at the site must accompany the application form.

- X. Resort Area - A facility with those recreational amenities normally present at a facility that is the main focal point of a vacation. The facility must offer on-site lodging and dining opportunities and should be situated to take advantage of natural, historic or recreational attractions.
- Y. Snow Ski Area - A facility with those recreational amenities are normally present at a snow ski facility (mechanical lifts, downhill skiing, tubing, snowboarding, etc). This is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement does not apply to this category.
- Z. Trademark Destination Brand - A district encompassing buildings, structures, sites, or other facilities that are listed on the National Register of Historic Places or the Indiana Register of Historic Sites and Structures, as being of historical significance, and open to the public. The distance requirement does not apply to this category. This category applicant is required to be open either on a Saturday or Sunday as part of its five day per week requirement. This attraction is required to have at least 20,000 visitors per year. Applicant must show that majority of visitors (51%) are not short-term event traffic and meets tourist traffic definition. In addition, the applicant must:
 - i. Be a local Convention & Visitors Bureau or other economic development agency with a community marketing plan in place.
 - ii. Be actively utilizing the destination brand in its marketing. Copy of marketing plan must be provided.
 - iii. Register the trademark brand with the Indiana Secretary of State's office and provide copy of the certificate with the application.
- AA. Transportation Tourist Attraction – A riverboat, canal boat, trolley or train that offers regular tours of a railway/streetcar line or a navigable waterway and attracts at least 1,000 visitors annually. The dock or station where visitors board the attraction must contain information about the attraction for when the riverboat, canal boat, trolley or train is away from the dock or station. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum hours and months of operation requirements in Sections 3H and 3J do not apply to this category.
- BB. U-Pick Farm - An established area or facility where consumers can purchase pre-picked or pick-it-yourself fresh produce directly from Indiana producers. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement in Section 3J does not apply to this category.
- CC. Visitor Center - A facility where a tourist may interact with local persons knowledgeable of the area for the purpose of obtaining information about local tourist activities and attractions. This attraction is required to be open either a Saturday or Sunday as part of its five day per week requirement.
- DD. Water Park - A free standing park enterprise with multiple permanently erected water features, rides and devices providing aquatic family entertainment and offering refreshments for visitor consumption. This category is considered a seasonal attraction. The minimum months of operation requirement does not apply to this category. This category is not for lodging facilities with indoor water park facilities.
- EE. Zoological/Botanical Facility - A collection of unique living animals or plants that is displayed through exhibits to educate the public about zoology or botany.

5. Sign Guidelines for TODS

- A. Distance to Services and Facilities -The distance to a qualified business shall be measured by vehicle distance from the center of the intersection to the nearest point of the driveway of the business.
- B. Header Plaque – the header plaque with the “Visit Indiana” trademark shown in Attachment 1 is an optional supplemental message that can be used at the top of a TODS.
- C. Maximum Number of Signs - At any given sign location, a maximum of 3 attractions will be allowed on 1 sign, with a maximum of 2 signs per each direction at an intersection. An attraction facility will also not be permitted to have more than 6 TODS on the state highway system directing motorists to the facility.
- D. Logos or symbols– An international symbol shown in the Indiana MUTCD, a business logo, or a pictograph may be displayed on a TODS panel or a TODS trailblazer. The maximum dimensions for the

logo or symbol are shown in Attachment 1. All unusual designs must be approved by INDOT, and designs that resemble an official traffic control device or are determined to be in poor taste by INDOT shall be prohibited.

- E. Seasonality – TODS will state the months of operation (e.g., March-October) for facilities that are not open year-round.
- F. Sign Assemblies – TODS will normally be installed on sign assemblies as follows:
 - i. If the number of attractions to be shown at an intersection approach is three or less, the sign panels will be installed on one sign assembly with attractions with arrows pointing to the left above those with arrows pointing to the right. If any straight-ahead arrows are authorized, as in the case where the road turns and the attraction's access is straight ahead, the sign for that attraction will be installed above any signs for attractions to the left or right.
 - ii. If the number of attractions to be shown at an intersection approach is more than three, the signs will be installed on two separate sign assemblies. Normally, the first assembly will consist of signs with arrows pointing to the left, and the second assembly will consist of signs with arrows pointing to the right.
 - iii. If more than one attraction exists in a given direction, the signs for the closer attractions will normally be above the more distant attractions.
- E. Sign Design – TODS will have white retro-reflectorized legend and borders on a blue retro-reflectorized background. Symbols and pictographs/logos shall not exceed the dimensions shown in Attachment 1. The standard TODS dimensions are shown in Attachment 1.
- F. Sign Location - TODS provide direction for motorists from the nearest major state highway(s) to the attraction. TODS will be placed on the most direct route(s) to the attraction to best serve the motoring public. A maximum of two turns will be permitted from one state highway to another for an attraction (e.g. US highway to a two-digit state highway, two-digit state highway to a three-digit state highway). TODS will not be authorized for a facility if a motorist cannot readily return to the highway in the reverse of the path used to travel to the facility. TODS will also not be permitted to direct traffic onto a freeway or expressway.
- G. Sign Materials – all TODS shall be fabricated on substrate as per INDOT's Standard Specifications for construction. The reflective sheeting used for all TODS shall be from INDOT's Approved Materials List. All sign supports and mounting hardware shall comply with INDOT's Standard Specifications for construction. TODS shall be erected on separate supports and shall not be combined with other signs.
- H. Sign Placement – Subject to the spacing priority stated in Section 3F, TODS panels and trailblazers will normally be placed 200 ft. in advance of the stop or yield sign at the intersection. The sign placement must be confirmed with the INDOT District Traffic Engineer prior to installation to minimize right-of-way and driveway sight distance issues. Advance TODS sign assemblies as described in the Indiana MUTCD, will only be permitted based on unique circumstances such as intersection sight distance, downgrades exceeding 3%, or other special roadway characteristics are present.
- I. Sign Priority – If there are more businesses eligible for signing within the mileage limit than the number of business signs permitted on a TODS, the following priority system shall apply.
 - i. Any primary applicant business located nearer to the intersection than any other applicant business will be given priority for signing over such other applicant business. Once a primary applicant's business sign has been displayed, such primary applicant's business sign will not be supplanted by any other applicant's business sign, provided that such primary applicant continues to operate its business under the terms of the lease agreement and in compliance with the minimum criteria for primary applicant business sign eligibility.
 - ii. Any secondary applicant may display its business sign on a TODS only if space remains available on such TODS after all eligible primary applicants have been contacted. Any secondary applicant business located nearer to the intersection than any other secondary applicant business will be given priority for signing over such other secondary applicant business. Once a secondary applicant's business sign has been displayed, such secondary applicant's business sign will not be supplanted by any other secondary applicant's business sign, provided that such secondary applicant continues to

operate its business under the terms of the lease agreement and in compliance with the minimum criteria for secondary applicant business sign eligibility. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any primary applicant's business sign may supplant any secondary applicant's business sign at any time, provided that such supplantation is effective only upon the expiration or termination of the then current term of such secondary applicant's lease agreement.

- iii. The distance to a qualified business shall be measured:
 - a. for interchanges, by vehicle distance from the center point of the terminus of the nearest exit ramp to the nearest point of the driveway of the business.
 - b. for intersections, by vehicle distance from the center of the intersection to the nearest point of the driveway of the business.
- J. Trailblazing Signs – If a facility is not located on the roadway that motorists are turned to, trailblazing signs are required on the local roadway system that direct motorists to the facility. Trailblazer signs must be in place and in satisfactory condition prior to installation of TODS on the state highway system. The procurement and installation of trailblazer signs on local roadways will be the responsibility of the facility. Trailblazer signs must be adequately maintained or the TODS on the state highway system will be removed.
- K. Other Considerations - New TODS Program participating businesses, as of the effective date of this policy, should:
 - i. Have the 24" x 72" TODS panel placed on an existing TODS panel sign structure, if one exists or,
 - ii. Have the 24" x 72" placed on a new TODS panel sign structure if sufficient right-of-way exists, or,
 - iii. A reduced size TODS panel may be used to match in size the largest TODS panel on an existing structure or that is practical due to right-of-way limitations.Whenever a TODS panel sign structure replacement is required, 24" x 72" TODS panels will be used, if practical.

6. Application Procedure

The application form for TODS is shown in Attachment 3. Completed applications shall be submitted to INDOT's Contractor at the following address:

INDOT's Contractor shall review all applications and maintain records of all applications. If an applicant is determined to be eligible for signage, the Contractor shall notify INDOT of the tentative sign placement location. INDOT may perform a compliance check and will verify that any existing illegal advertising billboards have been removed and that the necessary trailblazers on the local roadway system are in place or that permission has been granted for their installation. INDOT will also review the TODS Panel design if it includes a logo as discussed in Section 5 above.

7. Compliance Checks

IOTD and INDOT, or its contractor, will perform periodic compliance checks on attractions having TODS. If an attraction facility is found not in compliance with the current criteria for signs, INDOT or its contractor, will notify the attraction of the item(s) not in compliance. The attraction will have 90 days to correct the deficiency. If the deficiency is not corrected within 90 days, INDOT or its contractor, may remove the TODS.

8. Program Fees

The fees assessed to eligible attractions for participating in the TODS program shall be as set forth in writing by INDOT's Contractor and shall be uniform to all attractions. INDOT's Contractor shall not revise the fees charged to eligible and participating attractions without prior approval from INDOT and IOTD.

No reimbursement shall be required to any attraction participating in the TODS program based on road work, road closures or detours established for any reason. If unusual circumstances are present, a credit may be provided to a participating attraction that is affected by road work, depending on the duration of the closure or detour.

9. Signatures

On this date, the Indiana Department of Transportation and the Indiana Office of Tourism Development hereby adopt this policy, which supersedes and revokes all previous policies pertaining to Tourist Oriented Directional Signs.

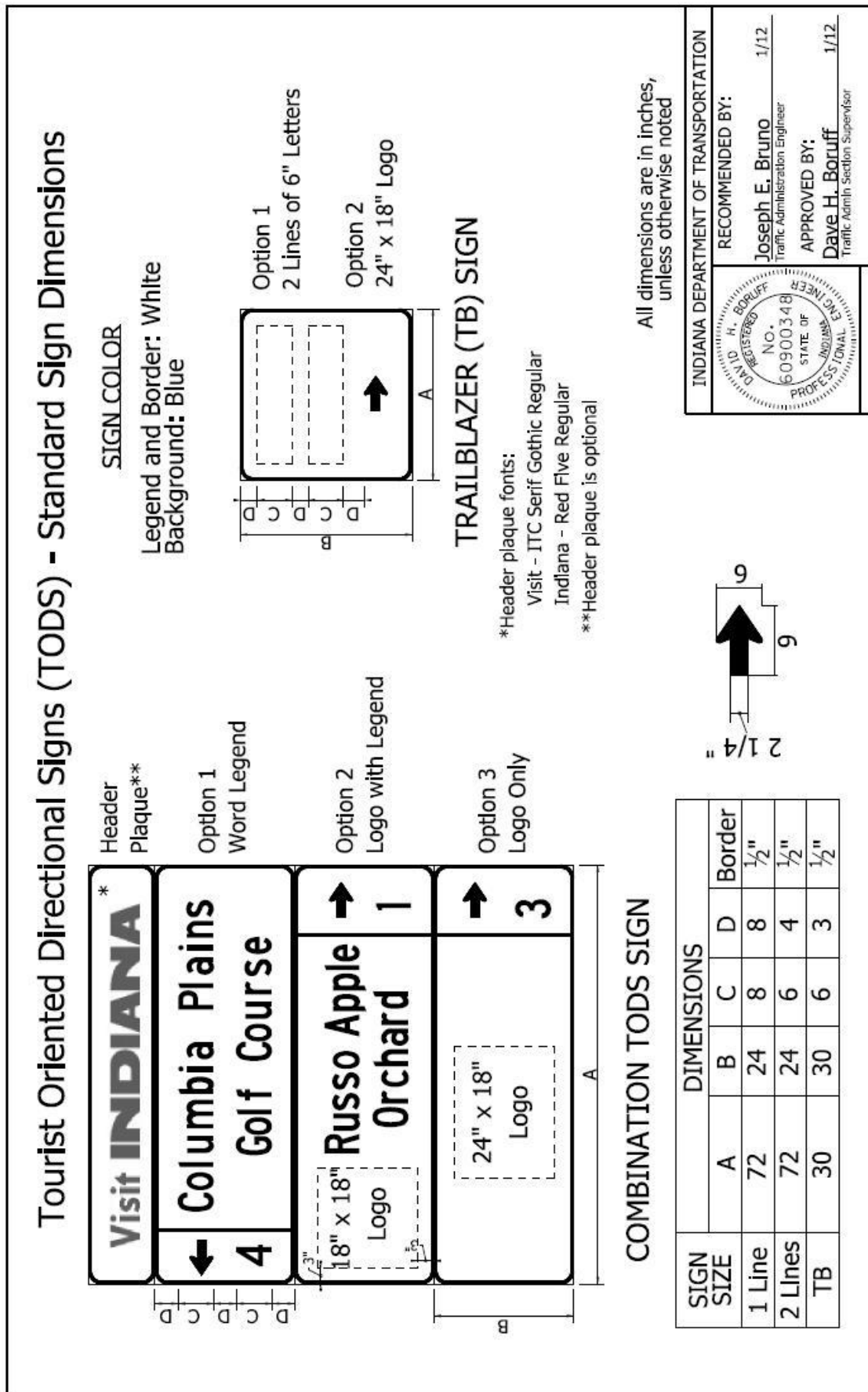

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This Contract ("Contract"), entered into by and between %%AGENCY_NAME%% (the "State") and %%VENDOR_NAME%% (the "Contractor"), is executed pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth herein. In consideration of those mutual undertakings and covenants, the parties agree as follows:

1. Duties of Contractor.

A. The Contractor shall provide the services relative to this Contract set forth in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (collectively, the "Services").

B. Time is of the essence in connection with the performance of the Services.

2. Consideration. The Contractor will be paid at the rate of _____ for performing the duties set forth above. Total remuneration under this Contract shall not exceed \$%%CONTRACT_MAX_AMT%%.

3. Term. This Contract shall be effective for a period of _____. It shall commence on %%CONTRACT_START_DATE%% (the "Effective Date") and shall remain in effect through %%CONTRACT_END_DATE%% (collectively, the "Term").

4. Access to Records. The Contractor and its subcontractors, if any, shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to all costs incurred under this Contract. They shall make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during this Contract, and for three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Contract, for inspection by the State or its authorized designees. Copies shall be furnished at no cost to the State if requested.

5. Assignment; Successors.

A. The Contractor binds its successors and assignees to all the terms and conditions of this Contract. The Contractor may assign its right to receive payments to such third parties as the Contractor may desire without the prior written consent of the State, provided that the Contractor gives written notice (including evidence of such assignment) to the State thirty (30) days in advance of any payment so assigned. The assignment shall cover all unpaid amounts under this Contract and shall not be made to more than one party.

B. The Contractor shall not assign or subcontract the whole or any part of this Contract without the State's prior written consent. Additionally, the Contractor shall provide prompt written notice to the State of any change in the Contractor's legal name or legal status so that the changes may be documented and payments to the successor entity may be made.

6. Assignment of Antitrust Claims. As part of the consideration for the award of this Contract, the Contractor assigns to the State all right, title and interest in and to any claims the Contractor now has, or may acquire, under state or federal antitrust laws relating to the products or services which are the subject of this Contract.

7. Audits. The Contractor acknowledges that it may be required to submit to an audit of funds paid through this Contract. Any such audit shall be conducted in accordance with IC § 5-11-1, *et seq.*, and audit guidelines specified by the State.

The State considers the Contractor to be a "Contractor" under 2 C.F.R. 200.331 for purposes of this Contract. However, if it is determined that the Contractor is a "subrecipient" and if required by

applicable provisions of 2 C.F.R. 200 (Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements), Contractor shall arrange for a financial and compliance audit, which complies with 2 C.F.R. 200.500 *et seq.*

8. Authority to Bind Contractor. The signatory for the Contractor represents that he/she has been duly authorized to execute this Contract on behalf of the Contractor and has obtained all necessary or applicable approvals to make this Contract fully binding upon the Contractor when his/her signature is affixed, and accepted by the State.

9. Changes in Work. The Contractor shall not commence any additional work or change the scope of the work until authorized in writing by the State. The Contractor shall make no claim for additional compensation in the absence of a prior written approval and amendment executed by all signatories hereto. This Contract may only be amended, supplemented or modified by a written document executed in the same manner as this Contract.

10. Compliance with Laws.

A. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances, and all provisions required thereby to be included herein are hereby incorporated by reference. The enactment or modification of any applicable state or federal statute or the promulgation of rules or regulations thereunder after execution of this Contract shall be reviewed by the State and the Contractor to determine whether the provisions of this Contract require formal modification.

B. The Contractor and its agents shall abide by all ethical requirements that apply to persons who have a business relationship with the State as set forth in IC § 4-2-6, *et seq.*, IC § 4-2-7, *et seq.* and the regulations promulgated thereunder. **If the Contractor has knowledge, or would have acquired knowledge with reasonable inquiry, that a state officer, employee, or special state appointee, as those terms are defined in IC § 4-2-6-1, has a financial interest in the Contract, the Contractor shall ensure compliance with the disclosure requirements in IC § 4-2-6-10.5 prior to the execution of this Contract.** If the Contractor is not familiar with these ethical requirements, the Contractor should refer any questions to the Indiana State Ethics Commission, or visit the Inspector General's website at <http://www.in.gov/ig/>. If the Contractor or its agents violate any applicable ethical standards, the State may, in its sole discretion, terminate this Contract immediately upon notice to the Contractor. In addition, the Contractor may be subject to penalties under IC §§ 4-2-6, 4-2-7, 35-44.1-1-4, and under any other applicable laws.

C. The Contractor certifies by entering into this Contract that neither it nor its principal(s) is presently in arrears in payment of taxes, permit fees or other statutory, regulatory or judicially required payments to the State of Indiana. The Contractor agrees that any payments currently due to the State of Indiana may be withheld from payments due to the Contractor. Additionally, further work or payments may be withheld, delayed, or denied and/or this Contract suspended until the Contractor is current in its payments and has submitted proof of such payment to the State.

D. The Contractor warrants that it has no current, pending or outstanding criminal, civil, or enforcement actions initiated by the State, and agrees that it will immediately notify the State of any such actions. During the term of such actions, the Contractor agrees that the State may delay, withhold, or deny work under any supplement, amendment, change order or other contractual device issued pursuant to this Contract.

E. Pursuant to IC § 5-22-3-1, the State and the Contractor shall act in good faith in connection with the performance or administration of or any negotiations undertaken in accordance with or with respect to this Contract.

F. The Contractor warrants that the Contractor and its subcontractors, if any, shall obtain and maintain all required permits, licenses, registrations, and approvals, and shall comply with all

health, safety, and environmental statutes, rules, or regulations in the performance of work activities for the State. Failure to do so may be deemed a material breach of this Contract and grounds for immediate termination and denial of further work with the State.

G. The Contractor affirms that, if it is an entity described in IC Title 23, it is properly registered and owes no outstanding reports to the Indiana Secretary of State.

H. As required by IC § 5-22-3-7:

- (1) The Contractor and any principals of the Contractor certify that:
 - (A) the Contractor, except for de minimis and nonsystematic violations, has not violated the terms of:
 - (i) IC §24-4.7 [Telephone Solicitation Of Consumers];
 - (ii) IC §24-5-12 [Telephone Solicitations]; or
 - (iii) IC §24-5-14 [Regulation of Automatic Dialing Machines];in the previous three hundred sixty-five (365) days, even if IC § 24-4.7 is preempted by federal law; and
 - (B) the Contractor will not violate the terms of IC § 24-4.7 for the duration of the Contract, even if IC §24-4.7 is preempted by federal law.
- (2) The Contractor and any principals of the Contractor certify that an affiliate or principal of the Contractor and any agent acting on behalf of the Contractor or on behalf of an affiliate or principal of the Contractor, except for de minimis and nonsystematic violations,
 - (A) has not violated the terms of IC § 24-4.7 in the previous three hundred sixty-five (365) days, even if IC §24-4.7 is preempted by federal law; and
 - (B) will not violate the terms of IC § 24-4.7 for the duration of the Contract, even if IC §24-4.7 is preempted by federal law.

I. i. The Company warrants that the Company, and (if applicable) any of its holding companies, affiliates, or subsidiaries, is not:

- (1) listed in Section 889 of the 2019 National Defense Authorization Act;
- (2) listed in Section 1260H of the 2021 National Defense Authorization Act;
- (3) owned by the government of a country, or controlled by any governing or regulatory body located in a country, on the United States Department of Commerce's foreign adversaries list under 15 C.F.R. 791.4; or
- (4) included on or controlled by an entity on the Specially Designated Nationals list maintained by the United States Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Asset Control.

ii. In accordance with Executive Order 25-64, if the State determines that the Contractor has been added to any list or designation set forth in clauses (1) through (4) in subparagraph I.i above, after entering this Contract, the State shall investigate the reasons the Contractor was added to any such list or designation. Depending upon the outcome of such investigation, the State may be required to terminate this Contract and/or dispose of any of the goods or cease the use of any of the goods or services procured under this Contract. In addition, the State shall not be required to pay for any goods or services tendered or provided under this Contract to the Contractor on or after the date the Contractor is added to any such list or designation.

11. Condition of Payment. All services provided by the Contractor under this Contract must be performed to the State's reasonable satisfaction, as determined at the discretion of the undersigned State representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations. The State shall not be required to pay for work found to be

unsatisfactory, inconsistent with this Contract or performed in violation of any federal, state or local statute, ordinance, rule or regulation.

12. Confidentiality of State Information. The Contractor understands and agrees that data, materials, and information disclosed to the Contractor may contain confidential and protected information. The Contractor covenants that data, material, and information gathered, based upon or disclosed to the Contractor for the purpose of this Contract will not be disclosed to or discussed with third parties without the prior written consent of the State.

The parties acknowledge that the services to be performed by Contractor for the State under this Contract may require or allow access to data, materials, and information containing Social Security numbers maintained by the State in its computer system or other records. In addition to the covenant made above in this section and pursuant to 10 IAC 5-3-1(4), the Contractor and the State agree to comply with the provisions of IC § 4-1-10 and IC § 4-1-11. If any Social Security number(s) is/are disclosed by Contractor, Contractor agrees to pay the cost of the notice of disclosure of a breach of the security of the system in addition to any other claims and expenses for which it is liable under the terms of this contract.

13. Continuity of Services.

A. The Contractor recognizes that the service(s) to be performed under this Contract are vital to the State and must be continued without interruption and that, upon Contract expiration, a successor, either the State or another contractor, may continue them. The Contractor agrees to:

1. Furnish phase-in training; and
2. Exercise its best efforts and cooperation to effect an orderly and efficient transition to a successor.

B. The Contractor shall, upon the State's written notice:

1. Furnish phase-in, phase-out services for up to sixty (60) days after this Contract expires; and
2. Negotiate in good faith a plan with a successor to determine the nature and extent of phase-in, phase-out services required. The plan shall specify a training program and a date for transferring responsibilities for each division of work described in the plan, and shall be subject to the State's approval. The Contractor shall provide sufficient experienced personnel during the phase-in, phase-out period to ensure that the services called for by this Contract are maintained at the required level of proficiency.

C. The Contractor shall allow as many personnel as practicable to remain on the job to help the successor maintain the continuity and consistency of the services required by this Contract. The Contractor also shall disclose necessary personnel records and allow the successor to conduct on-site interviews with these employees. If selected employees are agreeable to the change, the Contractor shall release them at a mutually agreeable date and negotiate transfer of their earned fringe benefits to the successor.

D. The Contractor shall be reimbursed for all reasonable phase-in, phase-out costs (i.e., costs incurred within the agreed period after contract expiration that result from phase-in, phase-out operations).

14. Debarment and Suspension.

A. The Contractor certifies by entering into this Contract that neither it nor its principals nor any of its subcontractors are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from entering into this Contract by any federal agency or by any department, agency or political subdivision of the State of Indiana. The term "principal" for purposes of this Contract means an officer, director, owner, partner, key employee or other person with primary management or supervisory responsibilities, or a person who has a critical influence on or substantive control over the operations of the Contractor.

B. The Contractor certifies that it has verified the state and federal suspension and debarment status for all subcontractors receiving funds under this Contract and shall be solely responsible for any recoupment, penalties or costs that might arise from use of a suspended or debarred subcontractor. The Contractor shall immediately notify the State if any subcontractor becomes debarred or suspended, and shall, at the State's request, take all steps required by the State to terminate its contractual relationship with the subcontractor for work to be performed under this Contract.

15. Default by State. If the State, sixty (60) days after receipt of written notice, fails to correct or cure any material breach of this Contract, the Contractor may cancel and terminate this Contract and institute measures to collect monies due up to and including the date of termination.

16. Disputes.

A. In the event that any dispute arises with respect to this Contract, the Contractor and the State agree to act immediately to resolve such disputes. Time is of the essence in the resolution of disputes.

B. If a valid dispute exists as to the Contractor's liability or guilt in any action initiated by the State or its agencies, and the State decides to delay, withhold, or deny work to the Contractor, the Contractor may request that it be allowed to continue, or receive work, without delay. In any event, the Contractor agrees that, notwithstanding the existence of a dispute, it will continue without delay to carry out all of its responsibilities under this Contract that are not affected by the dispute. Should the Contractor fail to continue to perform its responsibilities regarding all non-disputed work, without delay, any additional costs incurred by the State or the Contractor as a result of such failure to proceed shall be borne by the Contractor, and the Contractor shall make no claim against the State for such costs. Any payments that the State may delay, withhold, deny, or apply under this subparagraph shall not be subject to penalty or interest, except as permitted by IC § 5-17-5.

C. If the parties are unable to resolve a contract dispute between them after good faith attempts to do so, a dissatisfied party shall submit the dispute to the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Administration (the "IDOA") for resolution, except as otherwise provided in the Funding Cancellation and Termination for Convenience paragraphs. The dissatisfied party shall give written notice to the Commissioner of the IDOA (the "Commissioner") and the other party. The notice shall include: (1) a description of the disputed issues, (2) the efforts made to resolve the dispute, and (3) a proposed resolution. The Commissioner shall promptly issue a notice setting out documents and materials to be submitted to the Commissioner in order to resolve the dispute. The notice may also afford the parties the opportunity to make presentations and enter into further negotiations. Within thirty (30) business days of the conclusion of the final presentations, the Commissioner shall issue a written decision and furnish it to both parties. The Commissioner's decision shall be the final and conclusive administrative decision, unless either party serves on the Commissioner and the other party, within ten (10) business days after receipt of the Commissioner's decision, a written request for reconsideration and modification of the written decision. If the Commissioner does not modify the written decision within thirty (30) business days, either party may take such other action helpful to resolving the dispute, including submitting the dispute to an Indiana court of competent jurisdiction. If the parties accept the Commissioner's decision, it may be memorialized as a written amendment to this Contract, if appropriate.

D. The State may withhold payments on disputed items pending resolution of the dispute. The unintentional nonpayment by the State to the Contractor of one or more invoices not in dispute in accordance with the terms of this Contract will not be cause for the Contractor to terminate this Contract, and the Contractor may bring suit to collect these amounts without following the disputes procedure contained herein.

E. With the written approval of the Commissioner, the parties may agree to forego the process described in subparagraph C, relating to submission of the dispute to the Commissioner.

F. This paragraph shall not be construed to abrogate provisions of IC § 4-6-2-11 in situations where dispute resolution efforts lead to a compromise of claims in favor of the State, as described in that statute. In particular releases or settlement agreements involving releases of legal claims or potential legal claims of the State should be processed consistent with IC § 4-6-2-11, which requires approval of the Governor and Attorney General.

17. Drug-Free Workplace Certification. As required by Executive Order No. 90-5 dated April 12, 1990, issued by the Governor of Indiana, the Contractor hereby covenants and agrees to make a good faith effort to provide and maintain a drug-free workplace. The Contractor will give written notice to the State within ten (10) days after receiving actual notice that the Contractor, or an employee of the Contractor in the State of Indiana, has been convicted of a criminal drug violation occurring in the workplace. False certification or violation of this certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to, suspension of contract payments, termination of this Contract and/or debarment of contracting opportunities with the State for up to three (3) years.

In addition to the provisions of the above paragraph, if the total amount set forth in this Contract is in excess of \$25,000.00, the Contractor certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:

- A. Publishing and providing to all of its employees a statement notifying them that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the Contractor's workplace, and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition;
- B. Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform its employees of: (1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace; (2) the Contractor's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace; (3) any available drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs; and (4) the penalties that may be imposed upon an employee for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace;
- C. Notifying all employees in the statement required by subparagraph (A) above that as a condition of continued employment, the employee will: (1) abide by the terms of the statement; and (2) notify the Contractor of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five (5) days after such conviction;
- D. Notifying the State in writing within ten (10) days after receiving notice from an employee under subdivision (C)(2) above, or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction;
- E. Within thirty (30) days after receiving notice under subdivision (C)(2) above of a conviction, imposing the following sanctions or remedial measures on any employee who is convicted of drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace: (1) taking appropriate personnel action against the employee, up to and including termination; or (2) requiring such employee to satisfactorily participate in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency; and
- F. Making a good faith effort to maintain a drug-free workplace through the implementation of subparagraphs (A) through (E) above.

18. Employment Eligibility Verification. As a condition precedent to entering this contract, and as required by IC § 22-5-1.7 and Executive Order 25-29, the Contractor swears or affirms under the penalties of perjury that the Contractor has not knowingly employed, and will not knowingly employ, an unauthorized alien. The Contractor further affirms that:

A. The Contractor has enrolled in, and verified the work eligibility status of all his/her/its employees through, the E-Verify program as defined in IC § 22-5-1.7-3. The Contractor is not required to participate should the E-Verify program cease to exist. Additionally, the Contractor is not required to participate if the Contractor is self-employed and does not employ any employees.

B. The Contractor has not knowingly employed or contracted with, and shall not knowingly employ or contract with, an unauthorized alien. The Contractor has not retained, and shall not retain, an employee, and has not contracted and shall not contract with a person, that the Contractor subsequently learned or learns is an unauthorized alien.

C. The Contractor has required and shall require his/her/its subcontractors, who perform work under this Contract, to certify to the Contractor that the subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien and that the subcontractor has enrolled and is participating in the E-Verify program. The Contractor agrees to maintain this certification throughout the duration of the term of a contract with a subcontractor and to provide any and all such certifications to the State promptly upon request.

The State may terminate this agreement for default if the Contractor fails to cure a breach of this provision no later than thirty (30) days after being notified by the State.

19. Employment Option. If the State determines that it would be in the State's best interest to hire an employee of the Contractor, the Contractor will release the selected employee from any non-competition agreements that may be in effect. This release will be at no cost to the State or the employee.

20. Force Majeure. In the event that either party is unable to perform any of its obligations under this Contract or to enjoy any of its benefits because of natural disaster or decrees of governmental bodies not the fault of the affected party (hereinafter referred to as a "Force Majeure Event"), the party who has been so affected shall immediately or as soon as is reasonably possible under the circumstances give notice to the other party and shall do everything possible to resume performance. Upon receipt of such notice, all obligations under this Contract shall be immediately suspended. If the period of nonperformance exceeds thirty (30) days from the receipt of notice of the Force Majeure Event, the party whose ability to perform has not been so affected may, by giving written notice, terminate this Contract.

21. Funding Cancellation.

A. As required by Financial Management Circular 3.3 and IC § 5-22-17-5, when the Director of the State Budget Agency makes a written determination that funds are not appropriated or otherwise available to support continuation of performance of this Contract, this Contract shall be canceled. A determination by the Director of the State Budget Agency that funds are not appropriated or otherwise available to support continuation of performance shall be final and conclusive. The date of such written determination shall be the effective date of cancellation.

[]. If the funds specified in this Contract for paying the Contractor come solely from sources other than State funds and the State Budget Agency or **[insert title of chief officer of the state agency entering into this Contract]** makes a written determination that there are no longer any available funds from such sources to support continuation of performance of this Contract, this Contract shall be canceled. A determination by the State Budget Agency or such officer of the State that such funds are not otherwise available to support continuation of performance shall be final and conclusive. The date of such written determination shall be the effective date of cancellation.

[]. The Contractor shall be compensated for completed supplies properly delivered, if any, and Services properly rendered prior to the effective date of cancellation. The State will not be liable for supplies delivered or Services performed after the effective date of cancellation. The Contractor and the State shall agree on the amount of payment for such supplies delivered and accepted. The State may withhold from these amounts any sum the State determines to be necessary to protect the State against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders. Failure to agree on any item in this subparagraph constitutes a dispute under the Disputes paragraph. With the exception of any item in this subparagraph on which the Contractor and the State fail to agree, no other item in this paragraph shall constitute a dispute under the Disputes paragraph.

22. Governing Law. This Contract shall be governed, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana, without regard to its conflict of laws rules. Suit, if any, must be brought in the State of Indiana.

23. HIPAA Compliance. If this Contract involves services, activities or products subject to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), the Contractor covenants that it will appropriately safeguard Protected Health Information (defined in 45 CFR 160.103), and agrees that it is subject to, and shall comply with, the provisions of 45 CFR 164 Subpart E regarding use and disclosure of Protected Health Information.

24. Indemnification. The Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State, its agents, officials, and employees from all third party claims and suits including court costs, attorney's fees, and other expenses caused by any act or omission of the Contractor and/or its subcontractors, if any, in the performance of this Contract. The State will not provide indemnification to the Contractor.

25. Independent Contractor; Workers' Compensation Insurance. The Contractor is performing as an independent entity under this Contract. No part of this Contract shall be construed to represent the creation of an employment, agency, partnership or joint venture agreement between the parties. Neither party will assume liability for any injury (including death) to any persons, or damage to any property, arising out of the acts or omissions of the agents, employees or subcontractors of the other party. The Contractor shall provide all necessary unemployment and workers' compensation insurance for the Contractor's employees, and Contractor shall provide the State with a Certificate of Insurance evidencing such coverage prior to starting work under this Contract.

26. Indiana Veteran Owned Small Business Enterprise Compliance. Award of this Contract was based, in part, on the Indiana Veteran Owned Small Business Enterprise ("IVOSB") participation plan, as detailed in the IVOSB Subcontractor Commitment Form, commonly referred to as "Attachment A-1" in the procurement documentation and incorporated by reference herein. Therefore, any changes to this information during the Contract term must be approved by IDOA's Division of Supplier Diversity and may require an amendment. It is the State's expectation that the Contractor will meet the subcontractor commitments during the Contract term. The following certified IVOSB subcontractor(s) will be participating in this Contract:

Failure to provide a copy of any subcontractor agreement may be deemed a violation of the rules governing IVOSB procurement and may result in sanctions allowable under 25 IAC 9-5-2. Requests for changes must be submitted to IndianaVeteransPreference@idoa.IN.gov for review and approval before changing the participation plan submitted in connection with this Contract.

The Contractor shall report payments made to certified IVOSB subcontractors under this Contract on a monthly basis using Pay Audit. The Contractor shall notify subcontractors that they must confirm payments received from the Contractor in Pay Audit. The Pay Audit system can be accessed on the IDOA webpage at: www.in.gov/idoa/mwbe/payaudit.htm. The Contractor may also be required to report IVOSB certified subcontractor payments directly to the Division of Supplier Diversity, as reasonably requested and in the format required by the Division of Supplier Diversity.

The Contractor's failure to comply with the provisions in this clause may be considered a material breach of the Contract.

27. Information Technology Enterprise Architecture Requirements. If this Contract involves information technology-related products or services, the Contractor agrees that all such products or services are compatible with any of the technology standards found at <https://www.in.gov/iot/policies-procedures-and-standards/> that are applicable, including the assistive technology standard. The State may terminate this Contract for default if the terms of this paragraph are breached.

28. Insurance.

A. The Contractor and its subcontractors (if any) shall secure and keep in force during the term of this Contract the following insurance coverages (if applicable) covering the Contractor for any and all claims of any nature which may in any manner arise out of or result from Contractor's performance under this Contract:

1. Commercial general liability, including contractual coverage, and products or completed operations coverage (if applicable), with minimum liability limits not less than \$700,000 per person and \$5,000,000 per occurrence unless additional coverage is required by the State. The State is to be named as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis for any liability arising directly or indirectly under or in connection with this Contract.
2. Automobile liability for owned, non-owned and hired autos with minimum liability limits not less than \$700,000 per person and \$5,000,000 per occurrence. The State is to be named as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis.
3. Errors and Omissions liability with minimum liability limits of \$1,000,000 per claim and in the aggregate. Coverage for the benefit of the State shall continue for a period of two (2) years after the date of service provided under this Contract.
4. Fiduciary liability if the Contractor is responsible for the management and oversight of various employee benefit plans and programs such as pensions, profit-sharing and savings, among others with limits no less than \$700,000 per cause of action and \$5,000,000 in the aggregate.
5. Valuable Papers coverage, if applicable, with an Inland Marine Policy Insurance with limits sufficient to pay for the re-creation and reconstruction of such records.
6. Surety or Fidelity Bond(s) if required by statute or by the agency.

7. Cyber Liability addressing risks associated with electronic transmissions, the internet, networks and informational assets, and having limits of no less than \$700,000 per occurrence and \$5,000,000 in the aggregate.

The Contractor shall provide proof of such insurance coverage by tendering to the undersigned State representative a certificate of insurance prior to the commencement of this Contract and proof of workers' compensation coverage meeting all statutory requirements of IC § 22-3-2. In addition, proof of an "all states endorsement" covering claims occurring outside the State is required if any of the services provided under this Contract involve work outside of Indiana.

B. The Contractor's insurance coverage must meet the following additional requirements:

1. The insurer must have a certificate of authority or other appropriate authorization to operate in the state in which the policy was issued.
2. Any deductible or self-insured retention amount or other similar obligation under the insurance policies shall be the sole obligation of the Contractor.
3. The State will be defended, indemnified and held harmless to the full extent of any coverage actually secured by the Contractor in excess of the minimum requirements set forth above. The duty to indemnify the State under this Contract shall not be limited by the insurance required in this Contract.
4. The insurance required in this Contract, through a policy or endorsement(s), shall include a provision that the policy and endorsements may not be canceled or modified without thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the undersigned State agency.
5. The Contractor waives and agrees to require their insurer to waive their rights of subrogation against the State of Indiana.

C. Failure to provide insurance as required in this Contract may be deemed a material breach of contract entitling the State to immediately terminate this Contract. The Contractor shall furnish a certificate of insurance and all endorsements to the State before the commencement of this Contract.

29. Key Person(s).

A. If both parties have designated that certain individual(s) are essential to the services offered, the parties agree that should such individual(s) leave their employment during the term of this Contract for whatever reason, the State shall have the right to terminate this Contract upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice.

B. In the event that the Contractor is an individual, that individual shall be considered a key person and, as such, essential to this Contract. Substitution of another for the Contractor shall not be permitted without express written consent of the State.

Nothing in sections A and B, above shall be construed to prevent the Contractor from using the services of others to perform tasks ancillary to those tasks which directly require the expertise of the key person. Examples of such ancillary tasks include secretarial, clerical, and common labor duties. The Contractor shall, at all times, remain responsible for the performance of all necessary tasks, whether performed by a key person or others.

30. Licensing Standards. The Contractor, its employees and subcontractors shall comply with all applicable licensing standards, certification standards, accrediting standards and any other

laws, rules, or regulations governing services to be provided by the Contractor pursuant to this Contract. The State will not pay the Contractor for any services performed when the Contractor, its employees or subcontractors are not in compliance with such applicable standards, laws, rules, or regulations. If any license, certification or accreditation expires or is revoked, or any disciplinary action is taken against an applicable license, certification, or accreditation, the Contractor shall notify the State immediately and the State, at its option, may immediately terminate this Contract.

31. Merger & Modification. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified within this Contract will be valid provisions of this Contract. This Contract may not be modified, supplemented, or amended, except by written agreement signed by all necessary parties.

32. Minority and Women's Business Enterprises Compliance.

Award of this Contract was based, in part, on the Minority and/or Women's Business Enterprise ("MBE" and/or "WBE") participation plan as detailed in the Minority and Women's Business Enterprises Subcontractor Commitment Form, commonly referred to as "Attachment A" in the procurement documentation and incorporated by reference herein. Therefore, any changes to this information during the Contract term must be approved by Division of Supplier Diversity and may require an amendment. It is the State's expectation that the Contractor will meet the subcontractor commitments during the Contract term.

33. Nondiscrimination. Pursuant to the Indiana Civil Rights Law, specifically IC § 22-9-1-10, and in keeping with the purposes of the federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, and the Americans with Disabilities Act:

A. The Contractor covenants that it shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment relating to this Contract with respect to the hire, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of the employee's or applicant's race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, disability, ancestry, status as a veteran, or any other characteristic protected by federal, state, or local law ("Protected Characteristics"). The Contractor certifies compliance with applicable federal laws, regulations, and executive orders prohibiting discrimination based on the Protected Characteristics in the provision of services. Breach of this subparagraph may be regarded as a material breach of this Contract, including for purposes of Indiana Code § 5-11-5.5-2, but nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to imply or establish an employment relationship between the State and any applicant or employee of the Contractor or any subcontractor.

B. Contractor covenants that it does not and shall not operate any programs or engage in any practices promoting Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI), or other similar goals, that violate Indiana or Federal Civil Rights Laws by treating a person differently on the basis of race or sex, such as by considering race or sex when making recruitment, hiring, disciplinary, promotion, or employment decisions; requiring employees to participate in training or educational programs that employ racial or sex stereotypes; or attempting to achieve racial or sex balancing in the Contractor's workforce. The Parties agree that a breach of this subparagraph is a material breach of this Contract, including for purposes of Indiana Code § 5-11-5.5-2, but nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to imply or establish an employment relationship between the State and any applicant or employee of the Contractor or any subcontractor.

34. Notice to Parties.

A. i. Whenever any notice, statement, request, consent or other communication is required under this Contract (each, a "Notice"), it shall be effective only if it is in writing and: (a) personally delivered; or (b) sent by: (I) email; (II) first class U.S. mail service; or (III) a nationally recognized overnight delivery service, with delivery confirmed and costs of delivery being prepaid; to the following addresses, or to such other address or addresses as shall be furnished in writing by any party to the other party.

iv. Unless the sending party has actual knowledge that a Notice was not received by the intended recipient, a Notice shall be deemed to have been given as of the date (a) when personally delivered; (b) when sent in the case of an email properly addressed; (c) three (3) days after the date deposited with the United States mail properly addressed; or (d) the next day when delivered during business hours to an overnight delivery service, properly addressed and prior to such delivery service's cut off time for next day delivery. The parties acknowledge that Notices delivered by facsimile shall not be effective.

B. As required by IC § 4-13-2-14.8, payments to the Contractor shall be made via electronic funds transfer in accordance with instructions filed by the Contractor with the Indiana State Comptroller.

35. Order of Precedence; Incorporation by Reference. Any inconsistency or ambiguity in this Contract shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order: (1) this Contract, (2) attachments prepared by the State, (3) RFP # _____, (4) Contractor's response to RFP # _____, and (5) attachments prepared by the Contractor. All attachments, and all documents referred to in this paragraph, are hereby incorporated fully by reference.

36. Ownership of Documents and Materials.

A. All documents, records, programs, applications, data, algorithms, film, tape, articles, memoranda, and other materials (the "Materials") not developed or licensed by the Contractor prior to execution of this Contract, but specifically developed under this Contract shall be considered "work for hire" and the Contractor hereby transfers and assigns any ownership claims to the State so that all Materials will be the property of the State. If ownership interest in the Materials cannot be assigned to the State, the Contractor grants the State a non-exclusive, non-cancelable, perpetual, worldwide royalty-free license to use the Materials and to use, modify, copy and create derivative works of the Materials.

B. Use of the Materials, other than related to contract performance by the Contractor, without the prior written consent of the State, is prohibited. During the performance of this Contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for any loss of or damage to the Materials developed for or supplied by the State and used to develop or assist in the services provided while the Materials are in the possession of the Contractor. Any loss or damage thereto shall be restored at the Contractor's expense. The Contractor shall provide the State full, immediate, and unrestricted access to the Materials and to Contractor's work product during the term of this Contract.

37. Payments.

A. All payments shall be made thirty five (35) days in arrears in conformance with State fiscal policies and procedures and, as required by IC §4-13-2-14.8, the direct deposit by electronic funds transfer to the financial institution designated by the Contractor in writing unless a specific waiver has been obtained from the Indiana State Comptroller. No payments will be made in advance of receipt of the goods or services that are the subject of this Contract except as permitted by IC § 4-13-2-20.

B. If the Contractor is being paid in advance for the maintenance of equipment, software or a service as a subscription, then pursuant to IC § 4-13-2-20(b)(14), the Contractor agrees that if it fails to fully provide or perform under this Contract, upon receipt of written notice from the State, it shall promptly refund the consideration paid, pro-rated through the date of non-performance.

38. Penalties/Interest/Attorney's Fees. The State does not agree to pay any penalties, liquidated damages, interest or attorney's fees, except as permitted by Indiana law, in part, IC § 5-17-5, IC § 34-54-8, IC § 34-13-1 and IC § 34-52-2. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in IC § 5-17-5, any liability resulting from the State's failure to make prompt payment shall be based solely on the amount of funding originating from the State and shall not be based on funding from federal or other sources.

39. Progress Reports. The Contractor shall submit progress reports to the State upon request. The report shall be oral, unless the State, upon receipt of the oral report, should deem it necessary to have it in written form. The progress reports shall serve the purpose of assuring the State that work is progressing in line with the schedule, and that completion can be reasonably assured on the scheduled date.

40. Public Record. The Contractor acknowledges that the State will not treat this Contract as containing confidential information, and the State will post this Contract on the transparency

portal as required by Executive Order 05-07 and IC § 5-14-3.5-2. Use by the public of the information contained in this Contract shall not be considered an act of the State.

41. Renewal Option. This Contract may be renewed under the same terms and conditions, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of the Department of Administration and the State Budget Director in compliance with IC § 5-22-17-4. The term of the renewed contract may not be longer than the term of the original Contract.

42. Severability. The invalidity of any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, clauses or provisions of this Contract.

43. Substantial Performance. This Contract shall be deemed to be substantially performed only when fully performed according to its terms and conditions and any written amendments or supplements.

44. Taxes. The State is exempt from most state and local taxes and many federal taxes. The State will not be responsible for any taxes levied on the Contractor as a result of this Contract.

45. Termination for Convenience.

A. This Contract may be terminated, in whole or in part, by the State, which shall include and is not limited to the IDOA and the State Budget Agency whenever, for any reason, the State determines that such termination is in its best interest. Termination of the delivery of supplies, if any, or the rendering of Services shall be effected by delivery to the Contractor of a termination notice at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination, specifying the extent to which the delivery of such supplies and the performance of such Services under such termination becomes effective. In connection with the delivery of such termination notice, the State shall send a copy thereof to the Commissioner.

B. The Contractor shall be compensated for supplies properly delivered, if any, and Services properly rendered prior to the effective date of termination. The State will not be liable for supplies delivered or Services performed after the effective date of termination. The Contractor and the State shall agree on the amount of payment for such supplies delivered and accepted and for the protection and preservation of the property. The State may withhold from these amounts any sum the State determines to be necessary to protect the State against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders. The Contractor shall be compensated for supplies properly delivered and Services provided in accordance with this Contract, but in no case shall the total payment made to the Contractor exceed the original contract price or shall any price increase be allowed on individual line items, if any such supplies or Services were canceled only in part prior to the original termination date. Failure to agree on any item in this subparagraph constitutes a dispute under the Disputes paragraph.

C. For the purposes of this paragraph, the parties stipulate and agree that the IDOA shall also be deemed to be a party to this Contract with authority to terminate the same for convenience, when such termination is determined by the Commissioner to be in the best interests of the State. With the exception of any item in subparagraph B, no other item in this paragraph shall constitute a dispute under the Disputes paragraph.

D. The rights and remedies of the State in this paragraph are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or equity or under this Contract.

46. Termination for Default.

A. With the provision of thirty (30) days' notice to the Contractor, the State may terminate this Contract in whole or in part, if the Contractor fails to:

1. correct or cure any breach of this Contract; the time to correct or cure the breach may be extended beyond thirty (30) days, if the State determines progress is being made and the extension is agreed to by the parties;
2. deliver the supplies, if any, or perform the Services within the time specified in this Contract or any extension thereof;
3. make progress so as to endanger performance of this Contract; or
4. perform any of the other provisions of this Contract.

In connection with the delivery of such notice, the State shall send a copy thereof to the Commissioner.

B. If the State terminates this Contract, in whole or in part, it may acquire, under the terms and in the manner the State considers appropriate, supplies, if any, or services similar to those terminated, and the Contractor will be liable to the State for any excess costs for those supplies or services. However, the Contractor shall continue the work not terminated.

C. The State shall pay the contract price for supplies properly delivered, if any, and Services accepted. The Contractor and the State shall agree on the amount of payment for supplies delivered and accepted and for the protection and preservation of the property. The State may withhold from these amounts any sum the State determines to be necessary to protect the State against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders. The Contractor shall be compensated for supplies properly delivered and Services herein provided, but in no case shall the total payment made to the Contractor exceed the original contract price or shall any price increase be allowed on individual line items, if any such supplies or Services were canceled only in part prior to the original termination date.

D. The rights and remedies of the State in this paragraph are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or equity or under this Contract.

47. Travel. No expenses for travel will be reimbursed unless specifically authorized by this Contract. Permitted expenses will be reimbursed at the rate paid by the State and in accordance with the *Indiana Department of Administration Travel Policy and Procedures* in effect at the time the expenditure is made. Out-of-state travel requests must be reviewed by the State for availability of funds and for conformance with *Travel Policy* guidelines.

48. Waiver of Rights. No right conferred on either party under this Contract shall be deemed waived, and no breach of this Contract excused, unless such waiver is in writing and signed by the party claimed to have waived such right. Neither the State's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for, the services required under this Contract shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Contract or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Contract, and the Contractor shall be and remain liable to the State in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the State caused by the Contractor's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this Contract.

49. Warranty. The Contractor warrants and guarantees that the Services provided pursuant to this Contract shall conform in all material respects with the specifications set forth in paragraph 1.A of this Contract, and will be: (A) free of any claim of infringement, misappropriation, unfair competition, or violation of any third party intellectual property right; (B) created and delivered in accordance with applicable laws and industry standards and practices; and (C) fully tested in accordance with the State's quality assurance testing process, if applicable. This warranty will extend for a period of one year from the date of the completion of Services. All work not conforming to this Contract and related specifications may be considered defective. The

warranties and guarantees provided in this paragraph and elsewhere in this Contract, if any, shall be in addition to and not in limitation of any other warranty or guarantee or remedy provided in this Contract or otherwise prescribed by law. In addition to the State's quality assurance testing process, if applicable, the Contractor, with representatives of the State, shall, at the discretion of the State, review the work completed nine (9) months after the date of the completion of Services to determine any work not in compliance with the Contract. The Contractor shall correct such non-complying work prior to the expiration of the one-year warranty.

50. Work Standards. The Contractor shall execute its responsibilities by following and applying at all times the highest professional and technical guidelines and standards. If the State becomes dissatisfied with the work product of or the working relationship with those individuals assigned to work on this Contract, the State may request in writing the replacement of any or all such individuals, and the Contractor shall grant such request.

51. State Boilerplate Affirmation Clause. I swear or affirm under the penalties of perjury that I have not altered, modified, changed or deleted the State's standard contract clauses (as contained in the most current *State of Indiana SCM Template*) in any way except as follows:

[Commencing on July 1, 2026, a form of the following paragraphs is to be added to every contract that is entered into, renewed or amended after June 30, 2026, but only if the contract or the initial contract related thereto has a maximum amount of \$500,000 or more.]

52. Compliance with Independent Verification and Validation Oversight. In the event the State determines that any independent verification and validation ("IV&V") oversight is required by the State during the term of this Contract, the Contractor shall comply with any such oversight during the term of this Contract, pursuant to which an independent third-party review may be conducted by a reviewer selected by the State, for the purpose of verifying that the Contractor has performed its obligations in compliance with the terms of this Contract. In the absence of any such IV&V oversight, the Contractor shall comply with any other appropriate methods or means for verification and validation required by the State during the term of this Contract for the purpose of verifying and validating that the Contractor has performed its obligations in compliance with the terms of this Contract. The Contractor shall provide all information and documentation requested during the State's IV&V oversight or verification and validation efforts related to this Contract and in connection with any IV&V oversight or verification and validation efforts related to an initiative of which this Contract is a part.

53. Liquidated Damages.

[Use subparagraphs A through D below if there is only a single completion deadline, which is the end of the Term of the Contract, upon which Liquidated Damages commence accruing.]

A. The Contractor understands and agrees that if the Contractor fails to complete the Services (the "Completion of Services") by the end of the Term (the "Completion Deadline"), the State will suffer damages, which cannot be quantified as of the Effective Date. Therefore, the Contractor and the State have agreed to stipulate the amounts payable by the Contractor in the event of its failure to achieve the Completion of Services by the Completion Deadline. In the event that this Contract is amended as a result of the extension of the Term pursuant to the terms of this Contract, the Completion Deadline shall automatically be extended, as well, unless, in such amendment of this Contract, it is specifically provided that the date of the Completion Deadline shall not be extended or shall be on a date thereafter, but before the date of the end of the new Term therein. Such liability shall apply even though: (i) a cure period remains available to the Contractor; or (ii) a cure occurs.

B. The amounts of such liquidated damages are \$_____ for each day after the Completion Deadline until the earlier of the date the Completion of Services is achieved or the date of termination of this Contract (collectively, the "Liquidated Damages").

C. The Contractor acknowledges that the Liquidated Damages are reasonable to compensate the State for the losses it will incur by reason of a delay in the Completion of Services by the Completion Deadline. Such losses include loss of use, enjoyment and benefit of the Services, injury to the credibility and reputation of the State with the general public and/or additional costs in administering this Contract (including legal, accounting and other administrative costs) (collectively, the "Losses"). The Contractor further acknowledges that the Losses are incapable of accurate measurement because of, among other things, the unavailability of a substitute for the Services after the Completion Deadline.

D. As of the Effective Date, the amounts of Liquidated Damages represent good faith estimates and evaluations by the parties as to the actual potential Losses that the State would suffer as a result of a delay in the Completion of Services by the Completion Deadline, and do not constitute a penalty. The parties have agreed to the Liquidated Damages in order to fix and limit the Contractor's costs and to avoid later disputes over what the amounts of Losses are properly chargeable to the Contractor. Such sums are reasonable in light of the anticipated or actual harm caused by a delay in the Completion of Services by the Completion Deadline, the difficulties of the proof of loss and the inconvenience or infeasibility of otherwise obtaining an adequate remedy.

[Use subparagraphs A through D below if there are two or more completion deadlines, including the end of the Term of the Contract, upon which separate Liquidated Damages commence accruing.]

A. The Contractor understands and agrees that if the Contractor fails to complete the Services by a deadline specified in **Exhibit A**, which is prior to the end of the Term and which **Exhibit A** specifies that this paragraph shall apply, or by the end of the Term (each, a "Completion Deadline"), the State will suffer damages, which cannot be quantified as of the Effective Date. Therefore, the Contractor and the State have agreed to stipulate the amounts payable by the Contractor in the event of its failure to achieve the completion of such Services by the corresponding Completion Deadline. Such liability shall apply even though: (i) a cure period remains available to the Contractor; or (ii) a cure occurs.

B. The amounts of such liquidated damages are \$_____ for each day after any Completion Deadline prior to the end of the Term and \$_____ for each day after the Completion Deadline at the end of the Term until the earlier of the date the completion of the corresponding Services is achieved or the date of termination of this Contract (collectively, the "Liquidated Damages").

C. The Contractor acknowledges that the Liquidated Damages are reasonable to compensate the State for the losses it will incur by reason of a delay in the completion of Services by a corresponding Completion Deadline. Such losses include loss of use, enjoyment and benefit of the Services, injury to the credibility and reputation of the State with the general public and/or additional costs in administering this Contract (including legal, accounting and other administrative costs) (collectively, the "Losses"). The Contractor further acknowledges that the Losses are incapable of accurate measurement because of, among other things, the unavailability of a substitute for the corresponding Services after a Completion Deadline.

D. As of the Effective Date, the amounts of Liquidated Damages represent good faith estimates and evaluations by the parties as to the actual potential Losses that the State would suffer as a result of a delay in the completion of Services by a corresponding Completion Deadline, and do not constitute a penalty. The parties have agreed to the Liquidated Damages in order to fix and limit the Contractor's costs and to avoid later disputes over what the amounts of Losses are

properly chargeable to the Contractor. Such sums are reasonable in light of the anticipated or actual harm caused by a delay in the completion of Services by the corresponding Completion Deadline, the difficulties of the proof of loss and the inconvenience or infeasibility of otherwise obtaining an adequate remedy.

[Regardless of which option above is chosen, subparagraphs E through G below shall be included in the remainder of the paragraph.]

E. Liquidated Damages are not intended to, and do not, liquidate the Contractor's liability under the Indemnification paragraph, even though third-party claims against the State may arise out of the same event, breach or failure that gives rise to the Liquidated Damages.

F. The Contractor shall pay any Liquidated Damages owing under this paragraph within 10 days after the Contractor's receipt of the State's invoice or demand therefor, subject to the right to dispute under the Disputes paragraph. The State shall have the right to deduct and offset any unpaid Liquidated Damages from any amounts owed by the State to the Contractor. The State shall have the right to draw on any surety or fidelity bond provided by the Contractor pursuant to this Contract to satisfy any Liquidated Damages not paid when due. Permitting or requiring the Contractor to continue and finish the Services or any part thereof after the Completion Deadline shall not act as a waiver of the right to receive Liquidated Damages hereunder or any rights or remedies otherwise available to the State.

G. The State's right to, and imposition of Liquidated Damages are in addition, and without prejudice, to any other rights and remedies available to the State under this Contract, at law or in equity respecting the breach, failure to perform or other default of the Contractor, except for the recovery of Losses that the Liquidated Damages are intended to compensate. The Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that Liquidated Damages may be owing even though no default has occurred under this Contract.

54. Remedies for Overages. The Contractor acknowledges that an important factor in inducing the State to enter into this Contract is the amount to be paid to the Contractor pursuant to the Consideration paragraph (the "Contracted Amount"). If, on or before the termination of this Contract, the Contractor requests the State to pay more than the Contracted Amount, as such amount may be hereafter amended (each, an "Overage"), the State may exercise any one or more of the following remedies:

- (A) amend this Contract for the purpose of increasing the Contracted Amount by an amount equal to or less than the Overage; or
- (B) reject the request and refuse to amend this Contract, thereby keeping the Contracted Amount the same.

Non-Collusion and Acceptance

The undersigned attests, subject to the penalties for perjury, that the undersigned is the Contractor, or that the undersigned is the properly authorized representative, agent, member or officer of the Contractor. Further, to the undersigned's knowledge, neither the undersigned nor any other member, employee, representative, agent or officer of the Contractor, directly or indirectly, has entered into or been offered any sum of money or other consideration for the execution of this Contract other than that which appears upon the face hereof. **Furthermore, if the undersigned has knowledge that a state officer, employee, or special state appointee, as those terms are defined in IC § 4-2-6-1, has a financial interest in the Contract, the Contractor attests to compliance with the disclosure requirements in IC § 4-2-6-10.5.**

Agreement to Use Electronic Signatures

I agree, and it is my intent, to sign this Contract by accessing State of Indiana Supplier Portal using the secure password assigned to me and by electronically submitting this Contract to the State of Indiana. I understand that my signing and submitting this Contract in this fashion is the legal equivalent of having placed my handwritten signature on the submitted Contract and this affirmation. I understand and agree that by electronically signing and submitting this Contract in this fashion I am affirming to the truth of the information contained therein. I understand that this Contract will not become binding on the State until it has been approved by the Department of Administration, the State Budget Agency, and the Office of the Attorney General, which approvals will be posted on the Active Contracts Database: <https://secure.in.gov/apps/idoa/contractsearch/>

PROCEDURE FOR ASSEMBLY OF BASE CONNECTION:

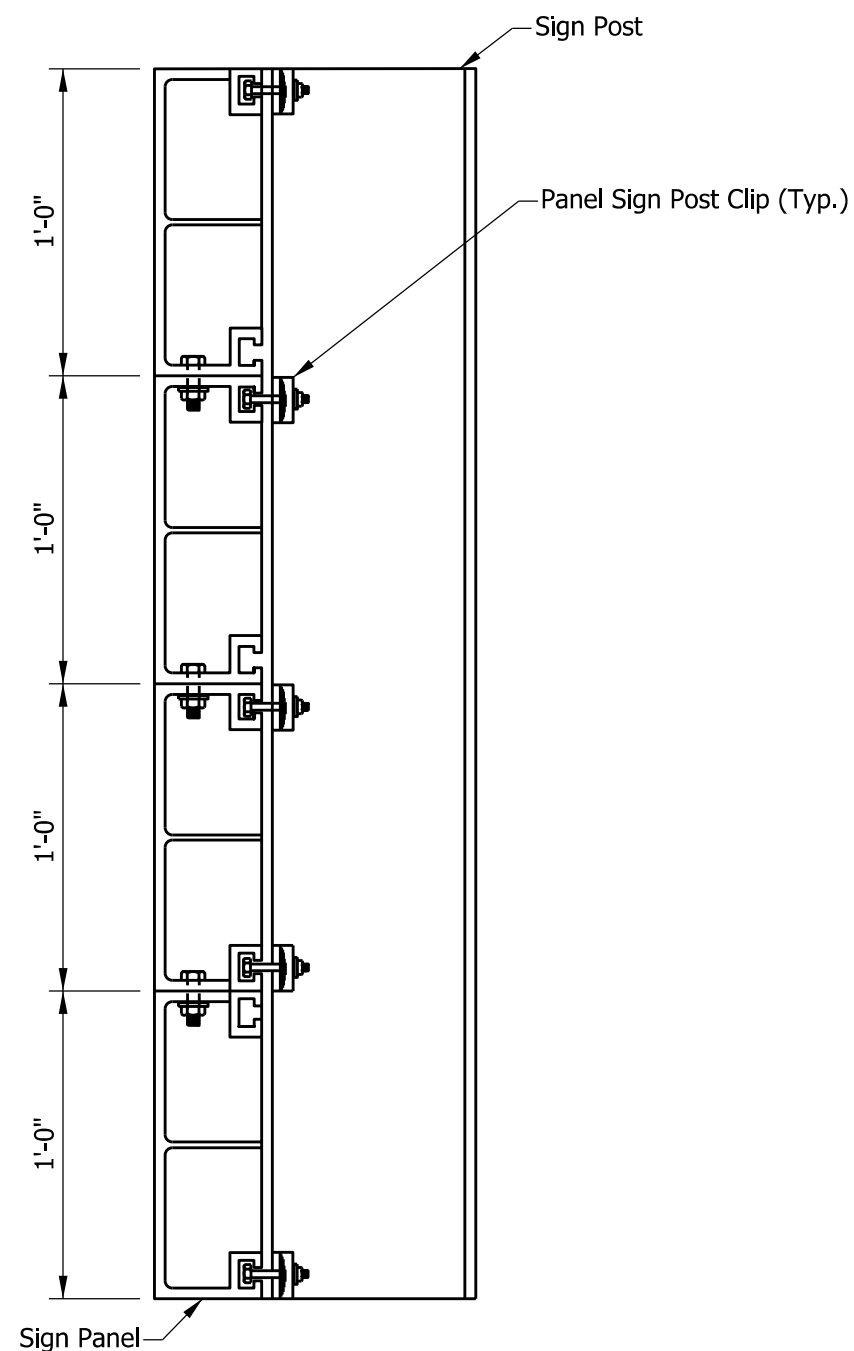
Assemble post to stub with bolts. One flat washer on each bolt shall be placed between the top of the keeper plate and bottom of the top base plate. Shim as required to plumb post.

Tighten all bolts the maximum possible with 12" to 25" wrench to bed washers and shims and to clean bolt threads, then loosen each bolt in turn and retighten bolts in a systematic order to the prescribed torque. See table on Standard Drawing E 802-SNGP-05 for dimensions.

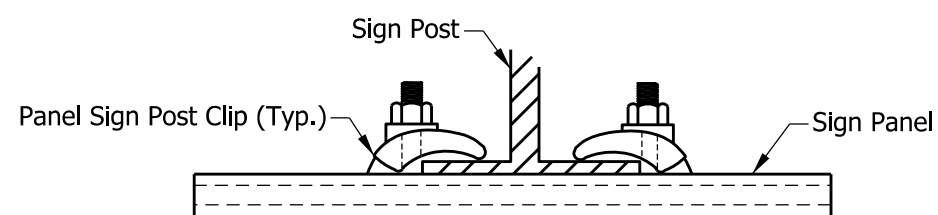

STIFFENER PLATE DETAIL

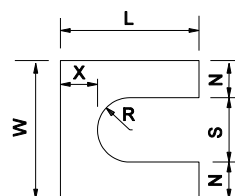

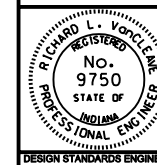
