## INDOT Environmental Services Project Development Community Impact Assessment (CIA) Report

Designation (Des) Number: **1234567**

Project Description:

“Progress in McCordsville” is an Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) project along one mile of U.S. 36 and State Road 67 between 65<sup>th</sup> Street and CR 700 W (also known as Carroll Road). It is an access control project expected to focus left turns in high-traffic areas, improving safety and traffic flow. The project also includes intersection improvements at Carroll Rd. Local cross streets are expected to be realigned to make it easier for drivers to turn and see oncoming traffic. The project would also connect gaps in sidewalks in the area.

Estimated impacts for the project include right-of-way (ROW) take (0.27 acre permanent and 0.32 acre temporary), terrestrial impacts (2.5 acres with 0.15 ac tree clearing [8 trees]), water resource impacts (1 stormwater detention pond near 700 W intersection), and utility relocation (2 fire hydrant relocations). Construction is expected to begin no earlier than 2027 and last up to two years.

**Step 1:** Screening based on project features and type.

**Meets Criteria 5 (permanent traffic alteration) & 10 (introduction of a new median along a previously undivided highway)**

**Step 2:** Describe the community or communities in the project area.

1. Describe the character of the project area. **The project area and overall land use is a mix of suburban residential and commercial development.**
2. What community resources are present?

**All identified resources are within 0.5 mile of the project area.**

- **10 retail properties (Great Clips, Crew Carwash, Valvoline Instant Oil Change, Indiana Farm Bureau Insurance, Verizon, Noble Roman’s Craft Pizza & Pub, AutoZone Auto Parts, Western Union, Starbucks, Oaklandon Family Vet, True Grit Jiu Jitsu)**
- **1 grocery/gas station (Meijer)**
- **1 United States Postal Service [USPS] (Oaklandon Location)**
- **1 Dentist (Dr. Ryan Jay)**
- **2 Houses of Worship (Living Streams Community Church and 12 Stones Fellowship),**
- **Oaklandon Youth Organization and FC Pride ball fields are just south of the project area.**

3. Briefly characterize the existing level of community cohesion including changes in connectivity, access, and travel patterns in the study area. **US 36/SR 67 serves as the main corridor through the area and is the primary route of travel from McCordsville to the eastern suburbs of Indianapolis. US 36/SR 67 carries over 16,000 cars per day with this volume increasing towards the southern terminus of the project with a daily volume of 19,000 cars near the 65<sup>th</sup> Street intersection. CR 700 W carries over 4,000 cars per day and 65<sup>th</sup> Street carries over 1,300 cars per day.**
4. Consider the daily travel patterns within any affected neighborhoods. Is there a shared reliance on the community facilities and businesses within the study area? **US 36/SR 67 serves as the main corridor and provides direct access for community resources, identified in Step 2, and residential areas.**
5. What major employment centers and employers are present in the project area? **Notable employers in the area including Meijer, USPS, and Bearsdale KinderCare.**
6. Does the area host recurring special events, like fairs, festivals, or other gatherings? **The Oaklandon Youth Organization baseball and softball fields are located south of the project area and features spring and fall ball. Year-round youth soccer is offered at FC Pride. McCordsville hosts a Fitness 5K race in August.**
  - a. **Access to the ball fields will not be restricted by the project.**
  - b. **The project is not expected to impact the Fitness 5K race but coordination with the City of McCordsville will be conducted.**
7. What public transportation stops or pedestrian facilities are present in the project area? **Hancock County Senior Services features a Ride service (RIDE Hancock) for those aged 60+ for a fee. This is a first come reservation service that serves all of Hancock County. Along the US 36/SR 67 is a multi-use path and a second multi-use path runs south from the intersection of Carroll Rd and US 36/SR 67.**

8. Describe the project area's U.S. Census demographics compared to the state average (using the American Community Survey [ACS] 5-year estimates), using one or more tables to organize the data. **Please see below for additional discussion regarding the highlighted items.**

**The project will have a positive impact on all populations by maintaining access to all businesses, such as grocery stores, while reducing the high crash rate within the project area. Minor access restriction will occur at one house of worship where northbound traffic on US 36/SR 67 will no longer be allowed to turn left; however, a designated U-turn area will be included to assist motorists. Designated U-turn areas will assist all commuters and lead to increased community safety.**

9. Describe any outreach considerations from the project specific PIP including outreach to Limited English Proficiency (LEP) populations. **Language toggles will be included on the project website and social media to assist LEP populations.**
10. Describe considerations from the INDOT Planning PIP. **As noted in the PIP, future public meetings will be held at places close to the project area and accessible to persons with disabilities. Language toggles will be featured on the project website to assist LEP persons.**

**Step 3:** Describe the project's positive and negative effects on the community characteristics identified above in Step 2.

1. Explain how the project will affect the community. **Safety of the motoring public, including this community that is proportionately young commuters, will be improved with the addition of the median. Overall pedestrian safety will be improved by extending and improving the existing facility.**
2. Describe whether construction of the proposed project would change the existing level(s) of separation experienced near the project area. **Construction of the median will create a divided highway but will**

**not change existing levels of separation in the project areas. Access will be retained but may be minimized for any business or residence with direct access to the road.**

3. Describe whether the changes associated with the proposed project, including impacts to access and travel patterns, would directly or indirectly result in separation or isolation of any geographic areas or populations within the study area. **Some businesses may see a reduction, but no access will be eliminated. Overall ability to move through the project area will be easier due to defined turning areas.**
4. Describe whether the proposed project would affect use of local services and community facilities identified in Step 2. **Travel patterns may be temporarily impacted as part of construction but access to all major employers and businesses will not be impeded. Access to 12 Stones Fellowship and Olvey Street will be reduced from northbound US 36/SR 67, but designated U-turns will be placed to assist motorists. The project will not result in a separation or isolation of any community populations or community resources nor affect any community population’s ability to use local services and community facilities.**
5. Identify design elements proposed to avoid, minimize, or mitigate adverse impacts to community cohesion.
  - a. **This project will comply with both Marion and Hancock County’s ADA Transition Plans because all curb ramps and sidewalks installed as a part of this project will comply with ADA Accessibility standards. While the southern multi-use path at the Carroll Rd intersection will be temporarily impacted, it will be fully restored upon project completion, and a pedestrian detour will be used during construction.**
  - b. **The Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) plan will utilize phased construction to minimize the duration of partial and full closures of the intersection to the greatest extent possible. The closures/lane restrictions will pose a temporary inconvenience to traveling motorists (including school buses and emergency services); however, no significant delays are anticipated, and all inconveniences and delays will cease upon project completion.**

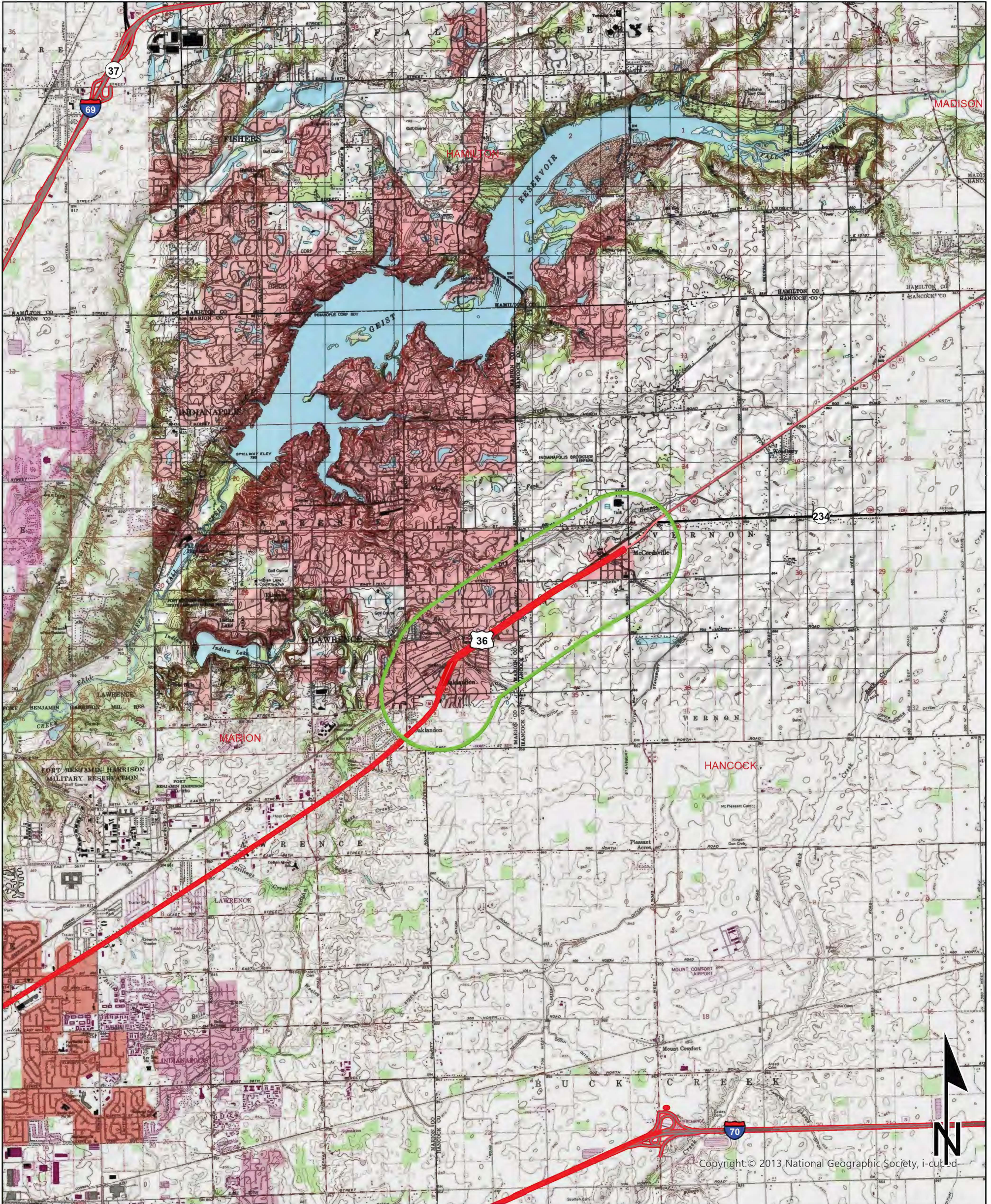

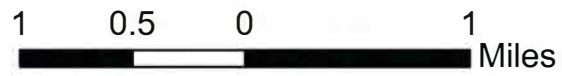

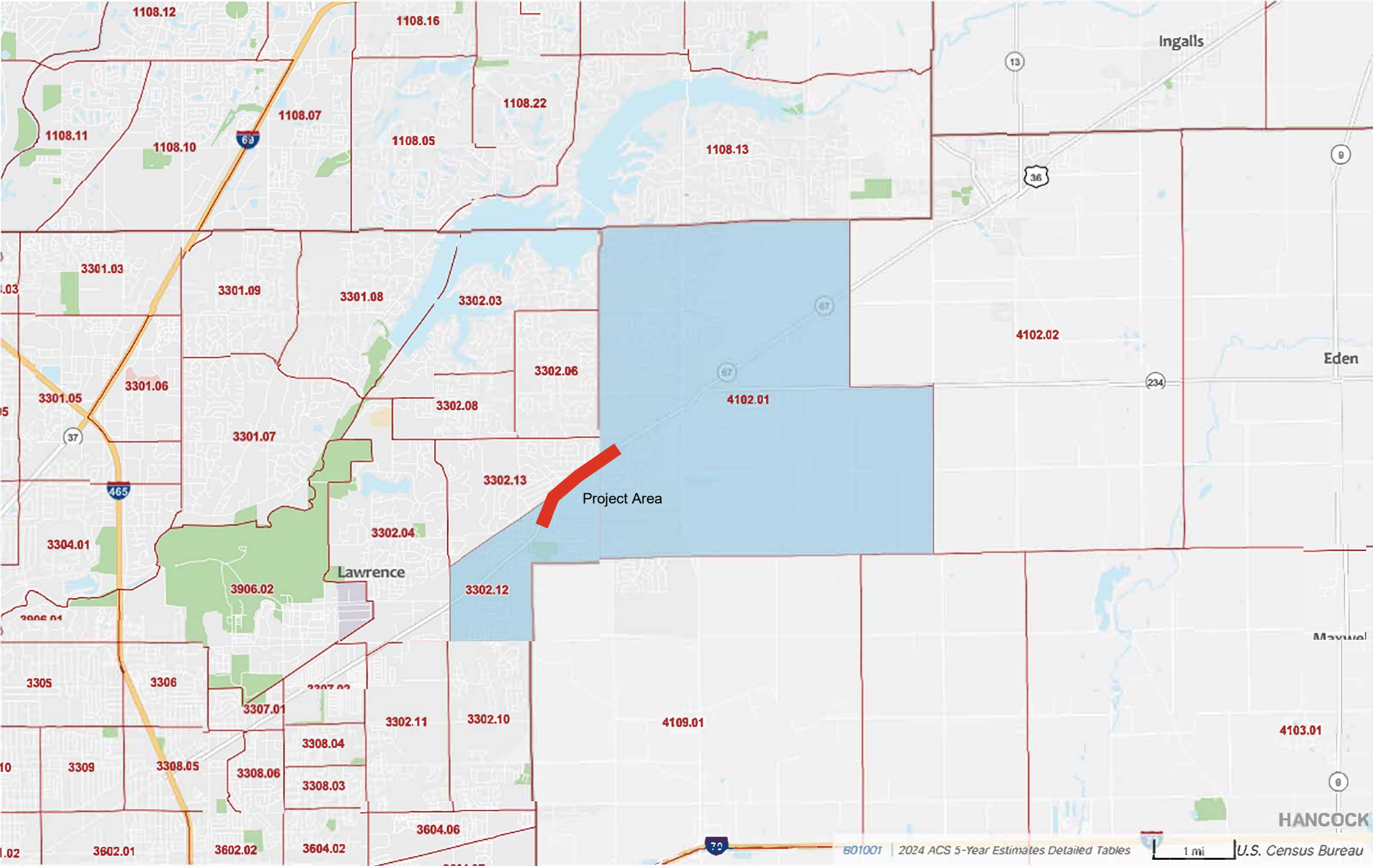
