#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Brief Description of Project: The proposed project is an intersection improvement at State Road (SR) 66 and Epworth Road, 0.16 mile east of I-69 in Warrick County, Indiana. The project will eliminate left turning movements from the mainline. Designs under consideration include using displaced left turns or bow tie intersections to the north and south SR 66. The project will include some redesign of signaling. The potential area of impact extends 2,000 feet east and west of the intersection along SR 66; 1,150 feet south of the intersection along Epworth Road; and 750 feet north of the intersection along Epworth Road. Proposed R/W would likely consist of intersection corner cuts. Temporary R/W for grading and drive construction would also likely be required along SR 66 and Epworth Road. #### Explanation:

Religious Facilities: Three (3) religious facilities are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. One religious facility, Saint Luke Lutheran Church, is adjacent to the project area. Traffic will be maintained throughout construction using lane restrictions, allowing for continued access. No impact is expected; however, coordination with Saint Luke Lutheran Church will occur.

Hospitals\*: Seventeen (17) hospitals or clinics are located within the 0.5 mile search radius, as identified on Google Earth and Google Maps. The access to fourteen (14) of the hospitals/clinics (Deaconess Gateway Hospital, Heart Hospital at Deaconess Gateway, Deaconess Women's Hospital, Riley Children's Specialty Center, Midwest Radiological Imaging, Deaconess Regional Laboratory, Evansville Surgery Center, Oral Surgery Group, Deaconess Clinic Gateway Heath Center, Deaconess Clinic Urgent Care, Orthopedic Associates East Newburgh, Cindy Basinski, MD, St. Vincent's Urgent Care, and The Lung Center) is within the project area. No impact is expected by the proposed project as traffic will be maintained with lane restrictions throughout construction; however, coordination with the hospitals and clinics will occur to identify any potential issues arising with emergency services.

Pipelines: Nine (9) pipeline segments are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. One (1) pipeline segment crosses the project area and one (1) pipeline segment is adjacent to the project area. Both are associated with Southern Indiana Gas & Electric Co. natural gas pipelines. Coordination with INDOT Utilities and Railroads should occur.

Trails: Four (4) trail segments are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. The nearest segment, associated with Warrick Wellness Trail, is located approximately 0.08 mile north of the project area. No impact is expected.

#### Explanation:

NWI-Lines: Six (6) NWI lines are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. The nearest NWI line is 0.12 mile west of the project area. No impacted is expected.

Rivers and Streams: Four (4) stream segments are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. One (1) stream, an unnamed tributary (UNT), is located within the project area. A Waters of the US Report will be prepared and coordination with INDOT ES Ecology and Waterway Permitting will occur.

NWI-Wetlands: Seventeen (17) wetlands are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. One (1) wetland is adjacent to the project area. A Waters of the US Report will be prepared and coordination with INDOT ES Ecology and Waterway Permitting will occur.

Lakes\*: Twenty-four (24) lakes, ten (10) unmapped as identified on the aerial photography and fourteen (14) mapped, are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. Two (2) unmapped lakes are located adjacent to the project area. A Waters of the US Report will be prepared and coordination with INDOT ES Ecology and Waterway Permitting will occur.

Floodplains: Thirteen (13) floodplain polygons are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. The nearest floodplain polygon is located approximately 0.11 mile northeast of the project area. No impact is expected.

#### **Explanation:**

Underground Storage Tank (UST) Sites: One (1) UST is located within the 0.5 mile search radius. It is associated with Deaconess Hospital and is located adjacent to the project area.

Deaconess Hospital, 4211 Gateway Blvd, Newburgh, IN, Al# 60842: IDEM conducted an Underground Storage
Tank Inspection on June 16, 2017, and the facility was found to be in compliance with equipment, operating, and
maintenance requirements set forth in Indiana's UST Rule 329 IAC 9. No impact is expected.

NPDES Facilities: Fifteen (15) NPDES facilities are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. Two (2) NPDES facilities, Deaconess Parking Garage Expansion and St. Mary's Borrow/Disposal Site #2, are located adjacent to the project area. No impact is expected at either location.

#### **ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION SUMMARY**

The Warrick County listing of the Indiana Natural Heritage Data Center information on endangered, threatened, or rare (ETR) species and high quality natural communities is attached with ETR species highlighted. A preliminary review of the Indiana Natural Heritage Database by INDOT Environmental Services did not indicate the presence of endangered species. Coordination with USFWS and IDNR will occur.

Due to the nature of project activities, this project will fall under the guidelines set forth under USFWS Interim Policy for the Review of Highway Transportation Projects in Indiana dated May 29, 2013. No further coordination with USFWS is necessary.

A review of the USFWS database did not indicate the presence of endangered bat species in or within 0.5 mile of the project area. The range-wide programmatic consultation for the Indiana Bat and Northern Long-eared Bat will be completed according to "Using the USFWS's IPaC System for Listed Bat Consultation for INDOT Projects".

An inquiry using the USFWS Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) website did not indicate the presence of the federally endangered species, the Rusty Patched Bumble Bee, in or within 0.5 mile of the project area. No impact is expected.

- One (1) stream, an UNT, is located within the project area.
- One (1) wetland is located adjacent to the project area.
- Two (2) unmapped lakes are located adjacent to the project area.











A review of the original RFI signed on July 20, 2018, for the above DES # indicated substantive changes have occurred within the 0.5 mile radius and/or project area limits that will have an impact to the project. The proposed project is an intersection improvement on SR 66 at Epworth Road, 0.16 mile east of I-69 in Warrick County, Indiana. The project area has been expanded to include an additional 900 feet west, 600 feet east, and 250 feet north of the SR 66/Epworth Road intersection. This project will require approximately 0.20 acre of permanent right-of-way (ROW) and 0.05 acre of temporary ROW. Culvert #066-87-08751 is located within the expanded project area, but no work is occurring to the culvert. Several small structures are now planned to be replaced or extended throughout the project area including two culverts under the NB to EB I-69 exit ramp, one under the WB to NB I-69 entrance ramp, and a 36-inch pipe beneath SR 66 on the eastern side of the SR 66/Epworth Road intersection. None of the small structures have structure numbers due to their size.

The following features and/or items were not detailed in the original RFI signed on July 20, 2018, but have since been identified as having an impact on the project area and requiring additional coordination.

#### 1. Infrastructure -

Hospitals: As indicated above, the project extents have expanded to take in additional areas to the north, east, and west of the SR 66/Epworth Road intersection. As such, access to the unmapped Deaconess Orthopedic Neuroscience Hospital is now within the project area. Coordination with Deaconess Orthopedic Neuroscience Hospital will occur.

#### 2. Water Resources -

NWI Lines: Two (2) NWI lines are now located within the project area. A Waters of the US Report will be prepared and coordination with INDOT ESD Ecology and Waterway Permitting will occur.

Floodplains: Three (3) floodplain polygons are now located within the project area. Coordination with INDOT ESD Ecology and Water Permitting will occur.

3. Ecological Information: This statement was inadvertently left in the previously approved RFI and does not apply to this project: Due to the nature of project activities, this project will fall under the quidelines set forth under USFWS Interim Policy for the Review of Highway Transportation Projects in Indiana dated May 29, 2013. No further coordination with USFWS is necessary.

A review of the USFWS database did not indicate the presence of endangered bat species in or within 0.5 mile of the expanded project area. The range-wide programmatic consultation for the Indiana Bat and Northern Long-eared Bat will be completed according to the most recent "Using the USFWS's IPaC System for Listed Bat Consultation for INDOT Projects".






