Project Facts


The Lafayette Center Road/C.R. 900 N reconstruction project in Allen and Huntington counties will improve capacity and mobility, reduce delays, provide a safer corridor and foster economic vitality/growth.

It will also provide more reliability in the transportation of goods and people through and within Indiana, which will strengthen the state's business economic competitiveness and quality of life. This roadway is an integral link in moving freight not only in this location, but also across the United States.

The project, between U.S. 24 to Fogwell Parkway, includes the widening of the road from two to four lanes, a center turn lane, paved shoulders, roadside ditching, a new grade-separated railroad crossing, the widening of two existing bridges, upgraded traffic signals and intersection improvements at U.S. 24 and C.R. 900 N.

By the numbers:

- Project length: 3.7 miles (2 miles in Huntington County, and 1.7 miles in Allen County)
- Construction cost: \$19.1 million
- Completion date: Fall 2018
