

SR 56 and SR 156 Pavement Rehabilitation

Public Meeting | October 18, 2023

Need

- Deteriorating pavement
- Lack of effective curbs
- Non-compliant ADA curb ramps
- Lack of storm sewer system

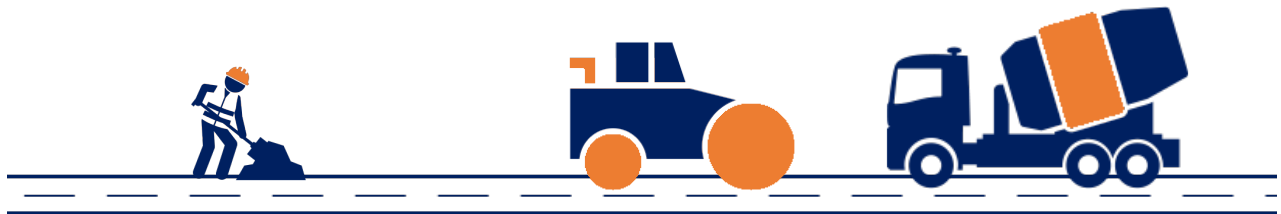


Purpose

- Improve pavement conditions to provide service life of at least another 15 years
- Improve pavement rideability
- Provide ADA compliant curb ramps
- Promote effective roadway drainage

Preferred Alternative

The most fitting pavement option will be applied to each specific roadway segment, as noted below.



Pavement Maintenance

- Remove and replace top layer of asphalt
- Provide ADA compliant curb ramps
- No drainage improvements

Pavement Replacement

- Remove and replace upper two layers of asphalt
- Provide ADA compliant curb ramps
- Clean and restore existing drainage features

Pavement Rehabilitation

- Fully remove and replace existing pavement
- Provide ADA compliant curb ramps
- New drainage system

Swiss Inn Trees

Two sycamore trees to be removed due to damage to the sidewalk and curb

Curb Ramps

To be made ADA-compliant and remove current trip hazards

Brick Pavers

To be removed and replaced with stamped concrete, which is easier to maintain and long-lasting

Historic Features

To be protected during construction

Sidewalk Furniture

Movable items to be removed during construction and may be replaced after the project

Building Entrances

New sidewalks to match current locations and elevations

Vaults & Coal Chutes

To remain capped by the sidewalk with cast iron openings placed back

Downtown Street Trees

Existing pear trees in the downtown area to be removed and not replaced

Historical Property & Environmental Impacts

This project will avoid or minimize...

- Removal of additional sycamore trees (beyond the two at the Swiss Inn)
- New permanent right-of-way within Historic District
- Wrought iron railing around the Switzerland County Courthouse
- Identified archaeological sites

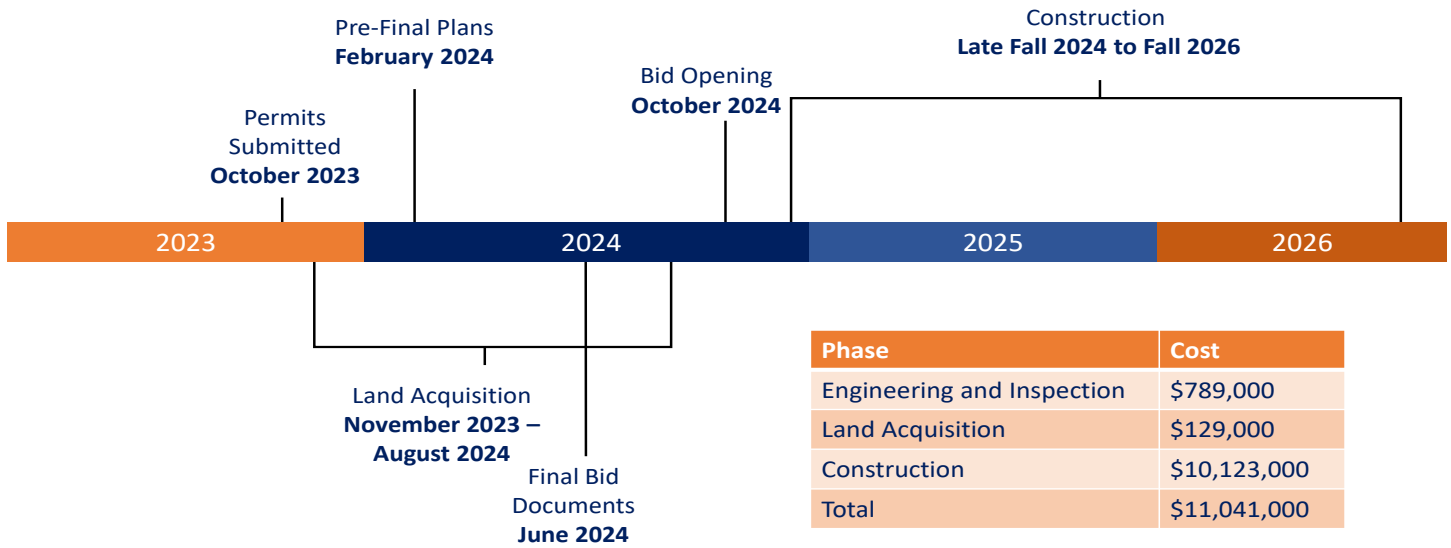
Mitigation measures

- Reset a portion of the existing limestone curb
- Install interpretative signage to describe the loss of the two sycamore trees in front of the Swiss Inn and the removal of the limestone curb
- Plant replacement trees within Vevay Historic District

Environmental Impacts

- No impacts to wetlands
- 26 trees to be removed
- 100 feet of streams to be impacted
- Limited construction will occur within the Ohio River floodway
- Paul W. Ogle Riverfront Park
- Environmental permits to be acquired

Construction Schedule & Project Cost



No cost to residents/tax increase to complete the project.
