Dear Mr. Brooks:

We have completed our review of INDOT's Amendment #22-07 to the FY 2022-2026 Indiana Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) dated December 20, 2022. INDOT has re-demonstrated fiscal constraint, air quality conformity, where applicable, and provided opportunity for public comment and involvement on Amendment #22-07. FHWA considers this amendment to be in substantial compliance with the applicable requirements as sufficient to support a consistency finding for the STIP.

FHWA and FTA take formal action, through the development of the Federal Planning Finding (FPF), to evaluate and ensure that the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and MPO Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) are developed according to statewide and metropolitan planning processes consistent with 23 U.S.C. 134 and 135, and 49 U.S.C. 5303 and 5304, as well as 23 CFR part 450, 500, and 49 CFR part 613. FHWA and FTA are required under 23 CFR 450.220 (b) to document and issue an FPF in conjunction with the approval of the STIP, or amended STIP. Based on the recently conducted FPF (dated June 17, 2022), FHWA and FTA find that the amended Indiana FY2022-2026 STIP substantially meets the transportation planning requirements and is approving the amended STIP (as recorded in Amendment 22-07) subject to the corrective actions outlined in the FPF. FHWA and FTA will continue to partner with INDOT to ensure the previously developed action plan is implemented to address the corrective actions. If progress is not made in addressing the corrective actions, future amendments to the FY2022-2026 STIP, or adoption of the FY2024-2028 STIP, may not be approved by USDOT.

FHWA only recognizes years 2022-2025 in the STIP. Any projects and/or phases of projects added in years outside of 2022-2025 are considered illustrative, and thus ineligible for federal funding at this time.

The Indiana Department of Transportation requests the projects listed in STIP Amendment 22-07 to be incorporated into the 2022-2026 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Any projects and/or phases of projects added in years outside of 2022-2025 are considered illustrative, and thus ineligible for federal funding at this time.

The required Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) documents have been included in this request and duly noted in the Amendment. We have determined that the proposed amendments are: 1) consistent with the transportation plan; 2) the TIP remains fiscally constrained in that federal funding resources are sufficient to support the new or modified projects; and 3) conform to state and national air quality standards.

The total dollar amount of this amendment is \$47,235,485 (for fiscal years 2022-2025), has been verified with FHWA.

RE: Emergency Amendment #22-07.5 (revised)

The Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission (NIRPC) is submitting Amendment #22-07.5 to the 2022-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) via emergency amendment for inclusion in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

There are two projects on this Amendment and the summary is as follows:

- They are bundled together under the same construction contract number.
- They are new projects for railroad signal improvement and will include a new
 pedestrian crossing at the intersection of US 12 and Hillcrest Ave. Work on the signal
 system needs to be completed in conjunction with both railroads (NICTD and Norfolk
 Southern) and INDOT (US 12).
- These projects were previously sent to the ICG for their concurrence, which was received by received on December 5, 2022.

It is necessary to submit this amendment in an expedited manner in order to allow proper amount of time to process INDOT allocation of federal funds for railroad safety improvements. According to NIRPC's Public Participation Plan, Engage NWI, the Executive Director can authorize a TIP amendment without public process or Commission approval in two rare exceptions: life and safety, or the lapse of federal funds allocated to Northwestern Indiana. In this case, there is a pertinent life and safety risk that requires the deployment of adequate signalization for roadway users and including safe passage for pedestrians and bicyclists. The attached project list contains the addition to be included to NIRPC's TIP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Indianapolis Transportation Policy Committee hereby approves the amendments to the 2022-2025 Indianapolis Regional Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached Exhibit A.
