On April 14, 2024, the Policy Board amended the FY 2024-2028 TIP by Resolutions T-24-03 and T-24-04. The first amendment programs the new Wabash River Enhancement Corporation RAISE project. The second amendment adds additional funds to the right-of-way phase of the S. 9th Street project, des #1900482, and to the preliminary engineering phase of the Soldiers Home Road project, des #1401291.

Additional FY 2024 Federal Funds Area Plan Commission Staff

Staff Report March 6, 2024

BACKGROUND AND REQUEST:

On January 4th, INDOT notified all MPOs of a change in how federal transportation funds are distributed. The change is due to using 2020 Census urban area population rather than 2010 numbers. Because our area grew between the two censuses, we received an additional \$650,079. It is broken down by the following funding categories:

INDOT also notified the MPOs that these federal funds must be obligated by September of 2024. Because of the short obligation time frame, this limits which projects can use them.

A call for projects was sent out on January 9, and two funding requests were received.

Comparing both projects to the TIP environmental justice requirements, ADA, and funding category reviews, MPO staff found them eligible to use STBG, TA, Carbon Reduction and PROTECT funds. They have not been approved for the use of HSIP and Section 164 Penalty funds. MPO staff recommended funding both requests. APC recommended the funding balance be flexed to CityBus for use of either bus replacement (full size or paratransit), bus stop improvements, or new sidewalk connections to bus stops.

At the February 21st Technical Transportation Committee, the requests were presented, and the Committee approved allocating the funds as described including the additional funds to CityBus.

Due to the limited obligation time, Area Plan Commission staff requested the TIP be amended to reflect the funding allocation as presented. The Committee voted and recommended the funding allocation to the Policy Board.

INDOT's STIP team has requested additional details be provided when processing TIP amendments and modifications. The following describes the project changes.

South 9th Street Project

This amendment adds and additional \$200,000 in STBG Federal funds, bringing the new total amount of federal funds for the right-of-way phase to \$520,000. The local match and total cost increases by \$50,000 and \$250,000 respectfully. The following table reflects the new amounts that will be shown in the TIP.

Soldiers Home Road Project

This amendment adds and additional \$235,936 in STBG Federal funds to the preliminary phase. It also adds \$58,319 in TA, and \$9,625 in Carbon Reduction funds. The total amount of federal funds increases by \$303,880. These are FY 2024 federal funds. This project phase has been funded with FY 2022 and 2023 federal funds.

The local match and total cost shown is \$75,970 and \$379,850 respectfully. The following table reflects the new amounts that will be shown in the TIP.

CityBus Paratransit Bus Replacement Project

This amendment adds the remaining funds, \$146199, to a paratransit replacement project which involves purchasing six CNG vehicles. The federal amount increases to \$864,354.

Due to the quick turnaround in allocating and programming these additional funds, the CityBus's Board of Directors has not had to opportunity to act upon the amendment. This portion of the amendment will be heard at the April Policy Board meeting.

The Technical Transportation Committee reviewed, approved the allocation proposal, and recommended it be amended into the TIP at its February 21, 2024, meeting.

FY 2024-2028 TIP Amendment Wabash River Enhancement Corporation

Staff Report March 6, 2024

BACKGROUND AND REQUEST:

The Wabash River Enhancement Corporation (WREC) received a \$25 million RAISE grant to fund the completion of Phase Two of the Wabash River Greenway project. This amendment programs the new project in the TIP. The grant was awarded June 2023.

The project includes multiple components including approximately 2.1 miles of new sidepaths (along River Road), 0.5 miles of boardwalk, 1-mile of new trail facilities, a dedicated bicycle-pedestrian bridge over the Wabash River, a new trail bridge, 1.2 mile of upgrades to existing sidepath sections, approximately 20 new park n' ride spaces for commuters, and five bus stop connections.

The federal funds will be used for engineering, environmental, design, and construction activities. The following table shows estimated dates and funding for each phase.
