

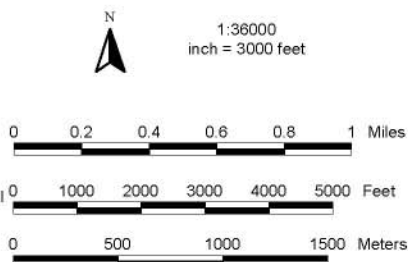
**I-69 EVANSVILLE TO INDIANAPOLIS STUDY

COVERAGE: Eagan Ditch (E of CR 250 E) to CR 1000 N (N of Epsom).  
CITIES/TOWNS: Cornettsville, Epsom (Daviss County)  
STREAM CROSSINGS: Eagan Ditch, Antioch Creek, South Fork of Prairie Creek, North Fork of Prairie Creek  
INTEREST: Farmland with widely scattered homes, wetlands and floodplains along forks of Prairie Creek, Thousand Acre Woods (Nature Conservancy), pipeline, powerline, Daviess County Airport (South), possible classified forests, Near Epsom: churches, recreation area, closed surface coal mines, coal AML and refuse area (N), home and farm potentially eligible for National Register, older home, Scott's Cave (W of CR 475 E)  
POTENTIAL GRADE SEPARATION: CR 350 E, CR 450 E, CR 550 N, CR 750 N, CR 800 N, CR 1000 N  
OTHER: South Fork Prairie Creek and North Fork Prairie Creek are impaired for pathogens; State endangered Loggerhead Shrike may be present. The corridor is widened beyond 2000 feet to provide additional flexibility for impact avoidance/minimization in Tier 2.  
PHYSIOGRAPHIC REGION: Wabash Lowland
