

DEPUTY DIRECTOR - CRIMINAL LAW

The IPAC seeks an experienced trial prosecutor/deputy prosecutor to serve as its Deputy Director, Criminal Law (DDCL).

The DDCL serves as the agency's lead expert on criminal law with particular focus on case law developments. The DDCL monitors all reported criminal decisions of the Indiana Supreme Court and the Indiana Court of Appeals as well as reported cases of interest from the U.S. Supreme Court and other jurisdictions. The DDCL is the IPAC's lead author/editor for *The Indiana Prosecutor Handbook*, *The Indiana Prosecutor's Trial Handbook*, and *The Indiana Elements of Crimes and Lesser Included Offenses Manual*. Successful candidates will possess demonstrated written communication skills.

The DDCL serves as an instructor at the IPAC's state-wide annual conferences. The DDCL takes lead responsibility for updating prosecuting attorneys on significant published decisions. Successful candidates will possess proven oral communication skills and the ability to provide insightful commentary and critical analysis.

The DDCL supervises the Drug Resource Prosecutor and the Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutor. Although all personnel in the criminal law branch are responsible for assisting Indiana's prosecutors, the DDCL has lead responsibility for all criminal matters other than areas of responsibility under the Deputy Director for Juvenile, Elder, Domestic, and Sex Crimes. The DDCL assists the Executive Director and other attorneys with monitoring legislative developments and rule changes. The DDCL is the staff attorney for the Capital Litigation Committee and reports to and assists other committees when needed.
