

Minutes for Indiana Statewide Sexual Assault Response Team

Call to order

Approval of minutes

New Business

- 1. ICESA update: ICESA will cease human trafficking efforts effective 12/31/2024. It is believed that IPATH will continue to address a majority of human trafficking work throughout the state.
- 2. Time frames for evidence collection/medical forensic examination: Discussion about issues with patients being denied a medical forensic examination; healthcare providers are citing timeframes and reimbursement as the reason(s) patients are not seen. Discussed other states are expanding their timeframes due to changes in testing sensitivity and literature that supports the presence of DNA longer than initially thought. The SART discussed the potential for providing guidance to stress the importance medical forensic examinations for patients that are seeking care, regardless of timeframe, including documenting the patient's history, sign and symptoms, all of which may have evidentiary value and the priority of the exam remaining focused on medical care and treatment and not evidence collection. The SART agreed to continue discussions to provide guidance and support to this ongoing issue. For patients that want care but cannot find a facility to see them due to time frames, please reach out to Ashli Smiley or Angie Morris for assistance.
- 3. Child Advocacy Centers: Several CACs throughout the state are working to expand access to medical forensic examinations on site soon.

Old Business

1. Anonymous Kit Guidance: Amy to finalize guidance document to get this distributed throughout the state and posted on SART website, as there are continued concerns and issues related to the Anonymous Kits; including recent issues with a facility putting anonymous patient names on the chain of custody forms.
