Works Council Communication Flyer – Dana Carter:

Glenn Weil gave a brief update on the PVPC grant. 18 teachers from four high school attended the kickoff. Sue Habig and Matt Weinzapfel presented on the Works Council and Glenn explained the grant initiative.

WEHT / Marketing Campaign Grant:

Jim Heck gave an update on the progress of the marketing campaign with WEHT. The first vignette has been completed with Barton Automotive in Posey County. The group was shown the video. Other vignettes are in the process with Jasper Engines and Vectren. The videos will be shown each month on WEHT and WTVW newscasts and throughout the day. The videos will be posted on www.tristatehomepage.com/WorkOne with other workforce data. WEHT plans to produce two to three vignettes per quarter. All the videos will be available for use at schools, businesses, and other organizations.

The council discussed the first vignette and gave suggestions for future vignettes, such as; parents and students need to know where the pathways begin at the secondary level and adding employability skills.

Community Education Coalition (CEC) – John Burnett / Jack Hess:

The Community Education Coalition out of Columbus IN is currently working with other communities to help grow and cultivate collaboration. John informed the Council on the background of CEC and the Columbus Learning Center. Jack explained the practice of community collaboration, solving connections collaboratively, and how to create a process to cultivate relationships and outcomes. The Council discussed the process and how it would help manage the regional projects.
