SYMPOSIUM OBJECTIVES

1. Discuss the evidence-based medication administration and rationale in the brain dead trauma patient and how that might differ from the treatment of the non-brain dead patient.
2. Discuss Donor Management Guidelines (DMG) such as Catastrophic Brain Injury Guidelines (CBIGs) for the trauma patient.
3. Recognize the indications and implement strategies for administration of TXA.
4. Recognize and implement strategies for treating complications associated with the use of a TXA.
5. Identify prosthetic options for trauma patients who suffer limb amputation.
6. Recognize signs and symptoms associated with abdominal compartment syndrome.
7. Identify the unique physiological characteristics of elderly trauma patients and how they affect their morbidity & mortality.
8. Discuss the use of extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO) in the trauma population.
9. Discuss the current status of the Indiana state trauma system.
10. Recognize the importance of working together as a system, both regionally and statewide, to get the right patient to the right place at the right time through coordinated care.
11. Review of two trauma cases that went on to become organ donors.
12. Discuss the role of interventional radiology in caring for injured patients.
13. Identify patients who may benefit from damage control resuscitation.
14. Perform trauma assessment and management on a simulated trauma patient.
15. Identify methods of external hemorrhage control in the bleeding trauma patient.
16. Recognize the emotional impact of being the parent of a severely injured child.
17. Apply hands-on technical skill associated with the EV1000[®] hemodynamic monitor.
18. Implement strategies for managing patients with intracranial pressure monitors.
19. Implement strategies for managing patients with external ventricular drains.
20. Appreciate the importance of maintaining a normal body temperature in injured patients.
21. Identify methods of preserving and increasing body temperature in trauma patients.
22. Recognize the indications for application of tourniquets.
23. Apply hands-on technical skill associated with the application of tourniquets.
24. Recognize the indication for wound packing to control external hemorrhage.
25. Apply hands-on techniques for packing wounds with gauze and other dressing supplies.
26. Apply knowledge and strategies of the latest trauma care to treat trauma patients.
27. Identify the indications for the use of intraosseous access in injured patients.
28. Apply hands-on technical skill associated with the use of the EZ-IO[®].
