# ADVANCED TRAUMA LIFE SUPPORT<sup>®</sup>

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Deaconess Advanced Trauma Life Support<sup>®</sup> course prepares physicians to deal with trauma, the leading cause of death in the U.S. for those 40 and younger. The course covers initial assessment and management of severe injuries. Specific knowledge of treatment principles for various injury types can significantly reduce the morbidity and mortality of trauma. This course is provided in conjunction with Advanced Trauma Care for Nurses (ATCN). Nurses attend the ATLS lectures and have separate skill and testing stations.

The course is composed of lectures and audiovisual presentations followed by hands-on practical station rotations. Testing includes written examinations and observed performance at these practical skill stations. The materials and presentations in these courses conform to national standards established by the American College of Surgeons.

## COURSE OBJECTIVES

The ATLS<sup>®</sup> course prepares participants to:

- Demonstrate concepts and principles of patient assessment
- Establish management priorities in a trauma
- Initiate primary and secondary management necessary for life-threatening emergencies within the first hour of trauma
- Demonstrate the skills necessary in initial management of trauma victims

## CERTIFICATION
