### **Indiana State Profile—Influential Circumstances**

There are several economic and other conditions that merit special attention as the sexual violence primary prevention planning process proceeds. The previous pages of this appendix outline a wealth of demographic and economic information, both for Indiana as a whole and for its eleven economic growth regions (designated by the Indiana Department of Workforce Development). This information is extremely valuable in understanding state dynamics, but there are additional factors that should be emphasized and drawn out.

- As with the rest of the country, Indiana's unemployment rate has been deeply affected by the current recession. In January 2008, Indiana's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5%; in January 2009 the unemployment rate almost doubled to reach 9%<sup>1</sup>. It is known that when families and communities face adversity of any kind, including economic insecurity due to unemployment, there is an increased risk for interpersonal and sexual violence.
- Historically, Indiana's economy has been based primarily on manufacturing, followed by agriculture. Even still, the manufacturing sector employed 15.5% of Indiana's workforce in 2006 and earnings from manufacturing jobs represented 26.3% of total earnings in Indiana<sup>2</sup>. However, as with the rest of the United States, Indiana now generates most of its revenue through service industries. For those who do not have a specific marketable skill or a college degree, this means that job opportunities are often limited to low-paying service sector jobs that do not offer benefits nor many opportunities for advancement. This can lead to poverty, a risk factor for sexual violence.
- Indiana ranks 9<sup>th</sup> in the nation for foreclosure rates (1 in 529 homes foreclosed upon as of February 2009)<sup>3</sup>. Many Indiana homeowners were recipients of sub-prime loans and with the growing economic crisis can no longer afford to stay in their homes. This has a number of implications, including but not limited to financial devastation, housing insecurity, and even homelessness.

- Like many other states, Indiana is facing a budget shortfall for state FY 2009, which will deepen the impact of the economic crisis in the months to come.
- The location of Indiana has made it an active hub for drug transportation and distribution both in and out of the State. The northern part of Indiana lies on Lake Michigan, which provides a major sea way access. In addition, numerous major interstates cross into Indiana and make it very easy transport/smuggle drugs. The major route of drug transportation is via the interstates using automobiles, cars or vans. Thus, crack, cocaine, and methamphetamine trafficking and addiction are particularly severe problems in Indiana.
- Indiana's population tends to be unhealthy, with high rates of smoking and obesity, and other indicators of poor health, and healthcare costs are high. Additionally, Indiana does not receive or invest many resources into prevention efforts for chronic disease and injury prevention. In 2008, Indiana received the least money per capita out of all the states from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention—the national average was \$17.60 per capita and Indiana received \$12.74 per capita. Indiana received low levels of HRSA dollars as well—\$10.32 per capita as opposed to the national average of \$21.43 per capita. Perhaps one reason for this is that the Indiana's FY '07-'08 public health budget per capita was \$15.40 as opposed to the median national per capita public health budget of \$33.71.4
