


Registration

He completed a residency at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center and at Scott and White Memorial Hospital/Texas A&M College of Medicine. He is board-certified in emergency medicine. Dr. Bledsoe holds medical licenses in Texas and Nevada.

Dr. Bledsoe has served as the Medical Director for two hospital emergency departments as well as for numerous EMS agencies in north Texas. He is the author of numerous EMS textbooks. He is a frequent contributor to EMS magazines and presenter at national and international EMS conferences.

Dr. Bledsoe is Professor of Emergency Medicine and Director of the EMS Fellowship, Department of Emergency Medicine, at the University of Nevada School of Medicine and the Department of Emergency Medicine at University Medical Center in Las Vegas.
