Pursuant to IC 4-22-2-28, the Indiana Office of Small Business and Entrepreneurship ("OSBE") has reviewed the economic impact analysis for small business associated with rule changes contained in LSA Document 15-39 proposed by the Indiana State Department of Health (ISDH). The proposed rule adds 410 IAC 1-2.5 to add definitions, reporting requirements, dangerous communicable diseases, disease intervention measures, general and specific control measures, and documents incorporated by reference. It adds and modifies control measures for schools, daycare facilities, preschools, health care facilities, and food handlers. It adds reporting requirements for physicians, hospital administrators, and laboratories. It repeals 410 IAC 1-2.3. Effective 30 days after filing with the Publisher.

The economic impact statement prepared by ISDH will not impose requirements or costs on small businesses under IC 4-22-2.1-5. OSBE does not object to the economic impact to small business associated with the proposed rule.
