**Emergency Nurse
Pediatric Course**

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The Emergency Nurse Pediatric Course (ENPC) is a two-day program designed to upgrade the knowledge and skills necessary to care for pediatric patients in emergency situations. This is a nationally recognized program which has been highly recommended for nurses who care for children.

ENPC provides participants the opportunity to strengthen and develop their pediatric emergency nursing skills while expanding their personal growth by collaborating with nurses from a variety of practice settings. ENPC brings together participants from various emergency department settings as well as nurses working in other specialties of nursing.

Highlights of the ENPC include

- Completing an observational or across the room assessment
- Cultural considerations in pediatric care
- Helpful hints and tricks for pediatric care
- Identifying subtle changes that indicate a worsening condition
- Pain management in children
- Performing a systematic triage assessment
- Techniques for interacting with the child and family

ENPC Verification

Verification will be issued from Emergency Nurses Association (ENA) with successful completion of the course.

Verification remains current for four years.

ENPC Course Content

- Cardiovascular emergencies
- Child maltreatment
- Crisis intervention
- Initial assessment and triage
- Medical emergencies
- Pediatric trauma
- Respiratory distress and failure
- Stabilization and transport
- The neonate
- The pediatric patient
- Toxicologic emergencies

Skill Stations

- Pediatric considerations:
 - Immobilization techniques
 - Medication administration
 - Pain management
 - Poisoning
 - Respiratory interventions
 - Vascular access
- Pediatric multiple trauma
- Pediatric resuscitation

Evaluation Methods

Successful completion of this course includes scoring a minimum of 80% on the 50 item multiple choice exam, demonstration of all critical steps and scoring a minimum of 70% of the total points in the evaluated skills stations. Participants have the ability to repeat the written examination or a psychomotor skills station if needed.

Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECHs)

All participants are eligible to receive CECHs. The awarding of CECH is based on hours attended, regardless of evaluation outcomes.
