


Department of Corrections

The Indiana Department of Corrections (DOC) started conducting mandatory HIV tests as part of the general intake process for every inmate at the beginning of their corrections term on July 1, 2002. Currently, no such test is administered when an inmate is released.

There are currently 235 inmates in Indiana Department of Correction facilities. The vast majority are male (217 or 92.3%). Of the infected inmates 129 (54.9%) are diagnosed with HIV and 106 (45.1%) that have developed AIDS in 2005. The majority of HIV-positive inmates are White (63.8%), followed by African American (33.6%), and Hispanics (2.6%). The numbers remained virtually the same from the previous year.


Figure 40: Number of Inmates with HIV/AIDS by Race, 2005

Figure 41: Number of Inmates with HIV/AIDS by Mode of Transmission, 2005


