The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission ("Commission") approved a gas energy efficiency program for Northern Indiana Public Service Company ("NIPSCO") in its May 9, 2007 Order in Cause No. 43051 (the "Order"). NIPSCO's approved energy efficiency program is funded by a Gas Efficiency Rider recovered from NIPSCO's residential rates served under Rate 311 and certain associated riders and appendices to Rate 311. The Order approved the initial Gas Efficiency Rider, to be recovered on a per therm basis, at a level designed to recover \$4 million each year.

The Order contemplated future changes to the Gas Efficiency Rider. First, because the Gas Efficiency Rider is recovered on a per therm basis, it may be necessary to annually adjust the Rider to achieve the targeted \$4 million recovery. Second, NIPSCO agreed and the Order approved using a portion of any revenues generated as a result of the Order's approved revisions to NIPSCO's residential gas tariffs to reduce the Gas Efficiency Rider. Both the first \$1 million of any such incremental revenues and fifty percent of such incremental revenues that exceed \$6 million are to be used to off-set the \$4 million targeted revenue from the Gas Efficiency Rider.

The Gas Efficiency Rider has been in place since May 10, 2007. NIPSCO has evaluated necessary reductions to the Gas Efficiency Rider and finalized data necessary to implement an adjustment to the Gas Efficiency Rider. The purpose of this filing is to effectuate a new, reduced Gas Efficiency Rider to be in compliance with the Order. Attached to this letter is a proposed tariff sheet reflecting a reduction to the Gas Efficiency Rider and workpapers documenting the amounts collected through the Rider from May 2008 through April 2009 and those supporting the calculation of the revised Gas Efficiency Rider in compliance with 170 IAC 1-6-5 (3) and (4). The filing is permitted by 170 IAC 1-6-3 and the September 19, 2008 Docket Entry in Cause No. 43051.

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In accordance with 170 IAC 1-6-6, NIPSCO provided notice to its customers of which proof is attached to this letter. NIPSCO has posted notice of this change in its local customer service offices and will place the new tariff on its website under pending tariffs (see <http://www.nipSCO.nisource.com/rates/pending.htm>). Michael J. Martin has verified this letter as to these representations in compliance with 170 IAC 1-6-5(5).

In addition to the adjustment to the Gas Efficiency Rider, NIPSCO is proposing one additional change to its proposed tariff. The Oversight Board created by the Order in Cause No. 43051 approved placing funds into a separate internal NIPSCO account as opposed to an escrow account. This change is reflected in the proposed tariff.

**APPENDIX A.4
GAS EFFICIENCY RIDER**

APPLICABILITY

The Gas Efficiency Rider shall be applicable to all Customers served under the following Rate Schedules:

Rate 311 – Residential Sales Service
Rider to Rates 311, 315, 316, and 317 – Residential Gas Space Cooling Service
Rider to Rates 311, 315, 316, 317, 321, and 325 – Price Protection Service Rider
Rider to Rates 311, 315, 316, 317, 321 and 325 – Supplier Choice Delivery Service (SCDS)
Experimental Rider to Rates 311, 315, 316, 317, 321 and 325 – Fixed Gas Bill Rider

DESCRIPTION

This Gas Efficiency Rider shall provide the funding for natural gas energy efficiency efforts throughout Company's Service Area. These efforts may include, among others, energy efficiency programs, customer education programs and weatherization programs designed to benefit customers under the applicable Rate Schedules and as approved by the Commission in Cause No. 43051 ("Energy Efficiency Program"). For the four years in which the Energy Efficiency Program is in effect, beginning with the effective date of the Energy Efficiency Program Term as approved by the Commission in Cause No. 43051, the charge under the Gas Efficiency Rider shall be the rate stated below. NIPSCO shall commence assessing the Gas Efficiency Rider as soon as permitted by law and deposit the revenues generated by the Gas Efficiency Rider into a separate internal NIPSCO account. The use of the Gas Efficiency Rider revenue from the account is subject to the review of the Oversight Board, and the Oversight Board shall develop procedures governing the withdrawal of the Gas Efficiency Rider revenue from the account including a report to be filed annually with the Commission that reconciles program revenues and expenses all in accordance with the Final Order of the Commission in Cause No. 43051. Any variance that occurs in the fourth year of this Energy Efficiency Program will be credited or recovered through continuation of the Gas Efficiency Rider for an additional year to only recover or refund such variance.
