On behalf of Richmond Light & Power ("RP&L") and pursuant to 170 IAC 1-6-1 et seq., we are submitting for Commission approval under the 30-day filing procedure: (1) a new street lighting rate to be added to RP&L's Rate Schedule N, Street Lighting Service, as well as two new municipal street lighting rates to be added to Rate Schedule M, Municipal Street Lighting Service; and (2) an amendment to RP&L's Rate Schedule R governing residential electric service (the "Residential Tariff"). Additional information regarding the proposed amendments to RP&L's tariffs is set forth below:

Street Lighting Service

RP&L proposes to add to its Street Lighting Service tariff (*i.e.*, Rate Schedule N) a new rate for "Twin 70 Watt Sodium Vapor" street lights. RP&L also proposes to add to its Municipal Street Lighting Service tariff (*i.e.*, Rate Schedule M) new rates for "400 Watt Sodium Vapor" and "1000 Metal Halide" street lights. The proposed modifications are necessary because RP&L has purchased the foregoing new types of street lights and has placed them into service. Rate Schedules M and N do not contain rates that appropriately reflect the cost of providing electric service through use of these new types of street lights. The proposed street lighting rates are "[n]ew rates" as defined in 170 IAC 1-6-2(6) and, therefore, may be submitted as a 30-day filing pursuant to 170 IAC 1-6-3(1).

- Exhibit 1: amended redline versions of RP&L's Rate Schedule M and Rate Schedule N;

• Exhibit 3: a spreadsheet setting forth the methodology and detailed pricing elements used to develop the proposed three new street lighting rates.

Residential Tariff

The proposed amendment to RP&L's Residential Tariff incorporates language intended to clarify the manner in which RP&L will determine whether a customer will be provided service under residential or commercial electric rates. The proposed clarifying language is "revenue neutral within a specific rate schedule" and, accordingly, may be submitted as a 30-day filing pursuant to 170 IAC 1-6-3(5)(A).

The proposed clarifying language is designed to avoid future issues like those addressed by the Commission's Consumer Affairs Division in Case 88661, which involved a dispute as to whether RP&L's commercial or residential rates should apply to a property occupied by a tenant where service was being provided in the landlord's name. The Consumer Affairs Division found there was insufficient information in RP&L's tariffs to clearly indicate whether the commercial or residential rate applies to rental property under such circumstances. The Consumer Affairs Division concluded "[n]ot enough information is listed on the tariff or the rules of prediction to properly determine that this customer should be charged the commercial rate." (See, Exhibit 6.) The proposed changes to RP&L's Residential Tariff are intended to provide sufficient clarification to allow customers living in rental properties and landlords to easily determine which rates apply to the premises.

As no policy covers every potential use, neither do our electric policies. When a question arises concerning our rate selection, we must rely on the intent of the language applicable. In the instance of an out of town property owner allowing someone use of the property, the documentation most applicable is found in General Terms and Conditions for Electric Service on sheet 1-A and 1-B under Predication of Rates. Subsection 2 states "When service is supplied to a residential dwelling unit where the use is primarily for the accommodations of roomers or boarders, the service will be provided under the commercial rate schedule, unless separate circuits are furnished by customer to permit the Utility to separately meter and bill the residential and commercial uses." Most of the Predication of Rates section explains further how to determine the difference between commercial and residential. It then seems prudent that an owner not living at the property in question would suggest a commercial use even if owner receives payment untraceable to the utility (bartering, intellectual exchange, etc.).
