Dear Mr. Webb,

South Harrison Water (SHW) proposes to change a portion of our wholesale rate with Chariot Run Golf Course (CRGC) and remove the requirement for them to purchase 350,000 gallons minimum per month. The base rate for wholesale water that CRGC purchases will not change.

SHW recently completed a full rate case before the commission (Cause #43850 – Approved September 8, 2010). At that time we removed the old “minimum bill” portion of our retail rate to all customers and moved to a Base Charge determined by meter size. All retail customers now pay the base charge and an appropriate per thousand gallon charge for water purchased.

We did not realize at that time that CRGC was covered by a separate written agreement that required they pay for at least 350,000 gallons of water per month. SHW would like to relieve CRGC of this requirement and place them on the appropriate monthly Base Charge for a 6” meter. CRGC would then pay for whatever water they use under the wholesale rate as approved in Cause #43850. Chariot Run representatives agree with this proposed change.

Though we realize that this will slightly reduce the revenues collected annually by SHW, this change has been unanimously approved by the SHW Board of Directors. The Board and Management realize that it is simply not fair to have only one single customer out of 3,100 paying a minimum monthly bill. Relieving them of the minimum bill will correct this situation.

This packet is being submitted in triplicate to your attention for a 30 day filing. Also a copy of this packet has been forwarded to the Office of the Utility Consumer Counselor for their perusal. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

Proposed Engineering Minutes Report

South Harrison Water Corporation

The Utility is an Indiana not-for-profit, membership owned, water utility providing drinking water service to its customers located in southwest Harrison County and a small portion of Floyd County, Indiana. The Utility proposes to make the following changes to its rate tariff:

- Schedule of Rates and Charges – section **(B) Chariot Run 6” Metered Wholesale Rate**. Sentence #1 & #2 to remain as written. Sentence #3 to be changed to read “Chariot Run shall pay the 6” meter Base Charge as shown in section (A).” Sentence #4 & #5 to be deleted. The changes as summarized as follows:

(B) Chariot Run 6” Metered Wholesale Rate

Service shall be provided through a dedicated 6” service meter. The flat rate for water will be \$4.56 per one thousand gallons. Chariot Run shall pay the 6” meter Base Charge as shown in section (A).

No other changes are requested. Cost justifications and other data pertinent to this request are accompanied with the submittal.

Supporting Documentation for Change to Chariot Run Golf Course Wholesale Rate Tariff

The proposal does not change the price per thousand gallons charged to Chariot Run for water usage.

The proposal only removes the requirement for Chariot Run to pay a minimum monthly bill for 350,000 gallons of water, whether it is used or not. If approved, Chariot Run would pay the Base Charge for a 6" meter, but be relieved of the requirement to pay the minimum bill for 350,000 gallons.

Chariot Run is presently the **ONLY** South Harrison Water customer that pays a minimum monthly bill.

This change will reduce the annual revenue collected by South Harrison Water from Chariot Run, as shown in the table below. The table shows actual gallons of water purchased by Chariot Run in calendar year 2010.

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Notice of Modification to Wholesale Rate

On or about June 7, 2011, South Harrison Water Corp. (SHWC) filed a request with the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) to modify the “Chariot Run 6” Metered Wholesale Rate” portion of its Schedule of Rates and Charges. This proposed modification is limited to the monthly minimum bill that SHWC charges to Chariot Run Golf Course only, and does not affect retail water rates, nor any other portion of the schedule of rates and charges. The proposal also does not change the rate Chariot Run pays for water usage.

SHWC made its request to implement the modification under the IURC’s rules appearing at 170 IAC 1-6. Objections to SHWC’s request must be submitted to the Secretary, Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission, 101 W Washington ST, Suite 1500E, Indianapolis, IN 46204, with a copy sent to the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor, 101 W Washington ST, Suite 1500S, Indianapolis, IN, 46204. Under 170 IAC 1-6-7, the objection must be:

- (1) In writing in:
 - (A) paper; or
 - (B) electronic format

- (2) Based on a statement that at least one (1) of the following applies to SHWC’s filing:
 - (A) It is a violation of:
 - (i) applicable law;
 - (ii) a prior IURC order; or
 - (iii) an IURC rule.
 - (B) Information in the filing is inaccurate.
 - (C) The filing is:
 - (i) incomplete; or
 - (ii) prohibited under 170 IAC 1-6-4.

The IURC will notify SHWC of any objections it receives in connection with the filing.
