#### Dear Commissioners and Staff -

The Indiana General Assembly enacted Senate Enrolled Act 412 in May 2015, which amended Indiana Code § 8-1-8.5-3 concerning a statewide analysis of long-range needs for expansion of facilities for the generation of electricity.

The law requires the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (Commission) to prepare a statewide analysis that includes (1) the probable future growth of the use of electricity; (2) the probable needed generating reserves; (3) in the judgment of the Commission, the optimal extent, size, mix, and general location of generating plants; (4) in the judgment of the Commission, the optimal arrangements for statewide or regional pooling of power and arrangements with other utilities and energy suppliers to achieve maximum efficiencies for the benefit of the people of Indiana; and (5) the comparative costs of meeting future growth by other means of providing reliable, efficient, and economic electric service, including purchase of power, joint ownership of facilities, refurbishment of existing facilities, conservation (including energy efficiency), load management, distributed generation, and cogeneration.

As an individual who was personally involved in the original enactment of Indiana Code § 8-1-8.5-1 et al in the mid-1980s and who has participated in the Commission's Integrated Resource Planning process since it was initiated pursuant to that statute, I have a special personal interest in the Commission's Statewide Analysis. I also have a special personal interest because, hard as it is for me to believe, I am now not only a parent, but a grandparent and great-grandparent greatly concerned with the future of my children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. So, I submit these comments as an individual not as a member or representative of any organization or group.

As a preface to my other comments, I want to express my appreciation to the Commission for preparing this first Statewide Analysis, which I consider to be a significant step in the right direction regarding the evolution of the Commission's statutory role as the administrative agency with both the authority and the duty to conduct and report to the General Assembly and the Governor the results of its impartial, independent, and expert studies and analyses of the electric utility industry. I am especially but not exclusively appreciative of the collaborative involvement in and contributions to the Statewide Analysis of the Commission's Division of Research, Policy and Planning and the State Utility Forecasting Group (SUFG). I am also thankful that the Statewide Analysis relies on sources of information in addition to the integrated resource plans of the individual electric utilities which are required by law to prepare and submit them to the Commission, including especially but not exclusively the update modeling capability of the SUFG and key analyses and reports of such organizations as MISO, PJM, NERC and EIA. Finally, I very much appreciate the opportunity which the Commission has provided for interested organizations, groups and individuals to submit

comments on the draft Statewide Analysis prior to finalizing it and transmitting it to the General Assembly and the Governor, including especially the extension of time for both the public hearing and the filing of written comments.

That said, I would offer the following general comments regarding the principal ways in which I believe that the Statewide Analysis could -- and should -- be improved to better serve the Commission's statutory role and the public interest of the State of Indiana.

First and foremost, I would urge the Commission to expand the breadth and depth of the Statewide Analysis. In my opinion, the current draft represents a document the scope and detail of which would be more consistent with an executive summary than the full-scale analysis and report which I believe is intended by Indiana Code § 8-1-8.5-3. I also believe that the customers who pay the Public Utility Fee which funds the Commission would consider the expenditure of the additional resources (including but not limited to the hiring of additional staff) required for a broader and deeper full-scale analysis and report to be well worth the cost.

Second, I believe that the information-gathering and analysis process underlying the Statewide Analysis could and should also be expanded in its breadth and depth, perhaps through a collaborative process involving an advisory executive committee and topical subcommittees of utility, customer, energy supplier and other representatives of the interested public. This is a process which the Commission has used to good effect in the past and I think would be especially useful at this "watershed time" in the continuing evolution of the electric utility industry. In this context, I also think that the Commission should consider a three-year cycle for updating its Statewide Analysis to coincide with the time frame which it recently decided makes the most sense for its Integrated Resource Planning cycle.

Third, it is my opinion that Indiana Code § 8-1-8.5-3 expressly intends that the Commission reach and transmit its conclusions, judgments and recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor on the substantive matters within the scope of the Statewide Analysis. Certainly, the Commission must always be cognizant that it is an impartial, independent administrative agency led by appointed not elected public officials with only those authorities and duties conferred by statute. But, the Commission is also Indiana state government's principal repository of expertise and experience relating to the electric utility industry. And, when the controlling statute expressly requests an analysis and report which reflects "the judgment of the Commission," there should be no doubt that the state's elected officials are directing as well as inviting the Commission to offer them the benefit of its independent, impartial, expert conclusions, judgments and recommendations on the substantive matters within the scope of the Statewide Analysis.

Fourth, with respect to the substantive matters within the scope of the Statewide Analysis, I believe that the Commission has both the authority and the duty to address the implications of the dramatic technological and market transformations now taking place in the electric utility industry globally and nationally for the evolution of Indiana's existing business model and regulatory paradigm for the industry. In particular, I believe that the Statewide Analysis should include an independent, impartial review of the so-called "Utility of the the Future" research, analyses and discussions which are taking place in the larger world outside Indiana, including underlying statutory reviews, commission generic investigations, and other forums such as university and "think tank" conferences, colloquia and collaboratives.

Fifth and finally, my view is that the Statewide Analysis could and should address the implications of global climate change for the near-term future of the Indiana electric utility industry with respect to the topical matters spelled out in Indiana Code § 8-1-8.5-3. In my opinion, to do otherwise would be

"dereliction of duty" on the part of the Commission. Certainly, this part of the analysis must be independent and impartial and reflect "the judgment of the Commission" rather than any interest group or political party, but it cannot be a void or a vaccuum. In particular, my view is that the Commission should review and report on the implications for the Indiana electric utility industry of the so-called "Two Degrees Centigrade Scenario" incorporated in the Paris Climate Accords and being intensively and extensively developed, researched and analyzed around the world, including at Indiana and Purdue Universities here in Indiana. Whether any particular entity, group or individual agrees or disagrees with the science of global climate change is simply not relevant to the indisputable fact that it is a contingency of sufficient significance and probability to warrant the assessment of its most important consequences for the Indiana electric utility industry in a Commission Statewide Analysis being prepared in 2018.

While there are many other more specific comments I could offer, I believe that these general comments are the most important ones for me to make at this time. Accordingly, I will offer only these comments in this forum at this time and reserve others for other forums and later times. Thank you for your consideration of them.
